Enjoy an abundant harvest through Fall and Winter with these cold-hardy vegetables!

Tips for Flowers

Direct Seeding & Starting Outside

Try to prepare a weed-free seedbed prior to sowing.

Sow seeds in rows rather than scattering seeds so it is easier to locate your plants within the weeds come springtime.

Gently rake sown seeds into the soil, or cover them very lightly with compost.

Alternatively, you can sow your seeds into pots or flats outside in the fall, and then transplant them in the spring after germination. Be sure to protect sown pots from squirrels, and don't let them get excessively dry.

Cold Stratification & Scarification

To cold-stratify your seeds indoors, place them in a bag of damp sand and store them in the refrigerator for the amount of time specified on the packet's planting directions.

Scarification methods range from soaking the seeds in hot water to scouring them a bit with sandpaper. Recommendations for this method vary per seed-type.
