1/4 yard (0.23 m)	Moon, Stars and Clouds - Blue (D)	910-11
5/8 yard (0.58 m)	Side by Side Animals - Blue (E)	907-11
5/8 yard (0.58 m)	Folio Basics - Off White (F)	7755-04
3/4 yard (0.69 m)	Foxes Allover - Blue (G)	908-11
7/8 yard (0.80 m)	Twinkle Basics - Aqua (H)	135-11*
3 1/2 yards (3.21 m)	Tossed Arks - Beige (Backing)	906-44

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the Block Print - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 12 1/2" x 18 1/2" rectangle, centered on the large block.
- (4) 9 1/2" squares, each centered on a small block.

From the Bias Plaid - Multi (B), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3 1/2" x 18 1/2" strips.
- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3" squares.
- (16) Template 1 triangles.
- (16) Template 3 triangles.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Camel (C), cut:

- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2" x 18 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2" x 21 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 1/2" x 9 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 1/2" x 11 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x 30 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x 32 1/2" WOF strips.

From the Moon, Stars and Clouds - Blue (D), cut:

- (1) 5 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5 1/2" squares.

From the Side by Side Animals - Blue (E), cut:

- (16) Template 2 triangles length of fabric (LOF)

From the Folio Basics - Off White (F), cut:

- (8) 2" x 32 1/2" WOF strips.

From the Foxes Allover - Blue (G), cut:

- (4) 5 1/2" x 32 1/2" WOF strips.

From the Twinkle Basics - Aqua (H), cut:

- (8) 1 1/2" x 32 1/2" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Tossed Arks - Beige (Back), cut:

- (2) 60" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 60" x 60" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 18 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the 12 1/2" x 18 1/2" Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1).

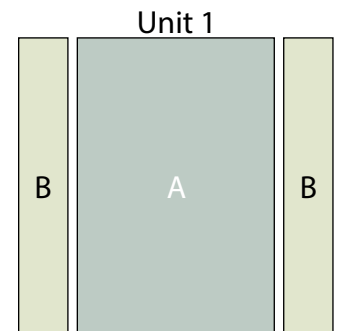

2. Sew (1) 2" x 18 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 2" x 21 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make the Center Block (Fig. 2). **Trim the block to measure 20 1/2" x 20 1/2"**.

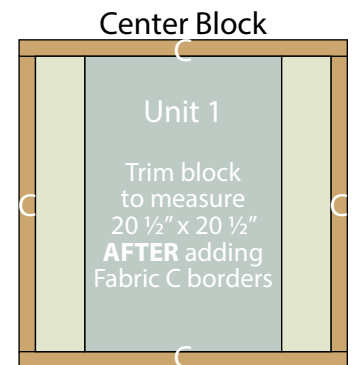

3. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 9 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 9 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 11 1/2" Fabric C to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 3). **Trim the block to measure 10 1/2" x 10 1/2"**. Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

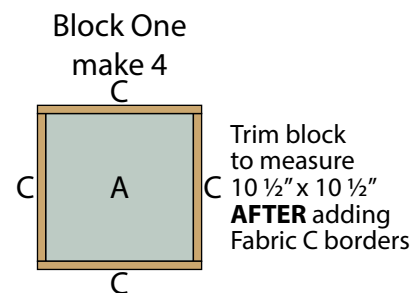

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4. Place (1) 3" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) 5 1/2" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 5).

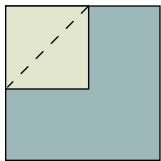

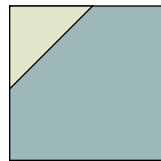

5. Follow Figure 6 for the seam direction to add a 3" Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the 5 1/2" Fabric D square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 7).

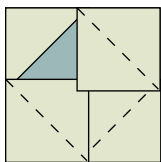

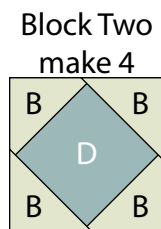

7. Place (1) Fabric B Template 1 triangle on top of (1) Fabric E Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the left sides (Fig. 8). Sew the (2) triangles together along the left side. Press the smaller triangle open.

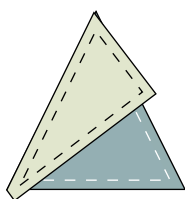

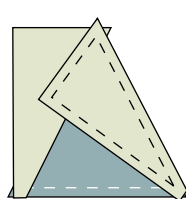

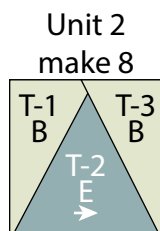

9. Repeat Steps 7-8 to make (8) Unit 2 squares total.

10. Repeat Steps 7-8 and refer to Figure 11 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (8) Unit 3 squares.

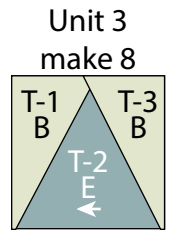

11. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to the left side of (1) Unit 3 square along their Fabric E sides to make (1) 5 1/2' x 10 1/2" Block Three rectangle (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (8) Block Three rectangles total.

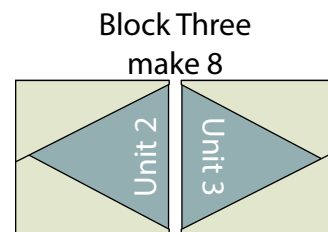

12. Sew together (2) Block Three rectangles end to end to make the Inner Left Side Border (Fig. 13).

Inner Left Side Border

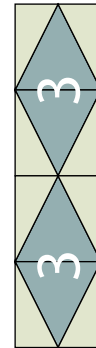

13. Sew together (2) Block Three rectangles end to end to make the Inner Right Side Border (Fig. 14).

Inner Right Side Border

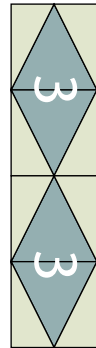

14. Sew together (2) Block Three rectangles end to end. Sew (1) Block Two square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Inner Top Border (Fig. 15).

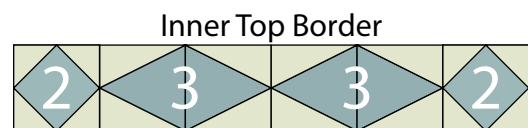

15. Sew together (2) Block Three rectangles end to end. Sew (1) Block Two square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Inner Bottom Border (Fig. 16).

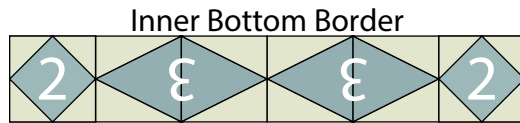

16. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 2 " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make the Outer Left Side Border (Fig. 17).

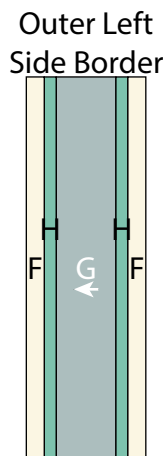

17. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 2 " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make the Outer Right Side Border (Fig. 18).

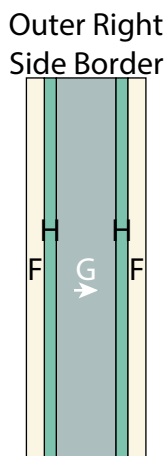

18. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 2 " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block One square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Outer Top Border (Fig. 19).

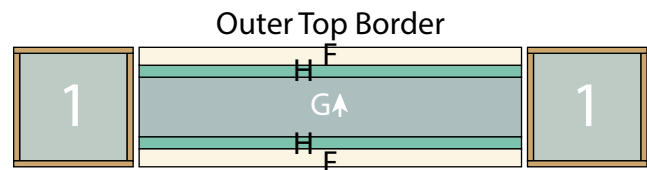

19. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 2 " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block One square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Outer Bottom Border (Fig. 20).

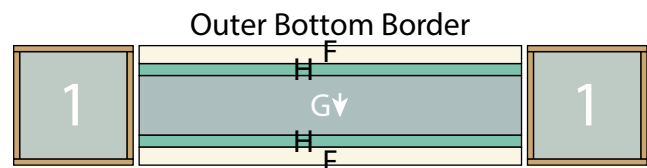

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

20. Sew the Inner Left Side Border and Inner Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

21. Sew the Inner Top Border and the Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

22. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $30\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

23. Sew the Outer Left Side Border and Outer Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

24. Sew the Outer Top Border and the Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

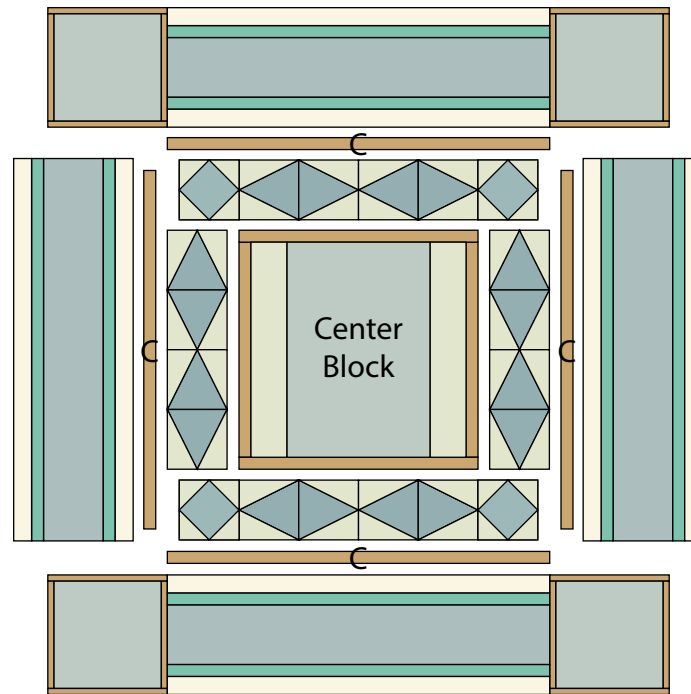
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25. Layer and quilt as desired.

26. Sew the (6) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

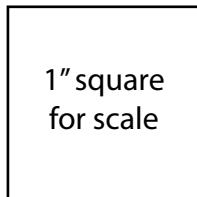
27. Bind as desired.



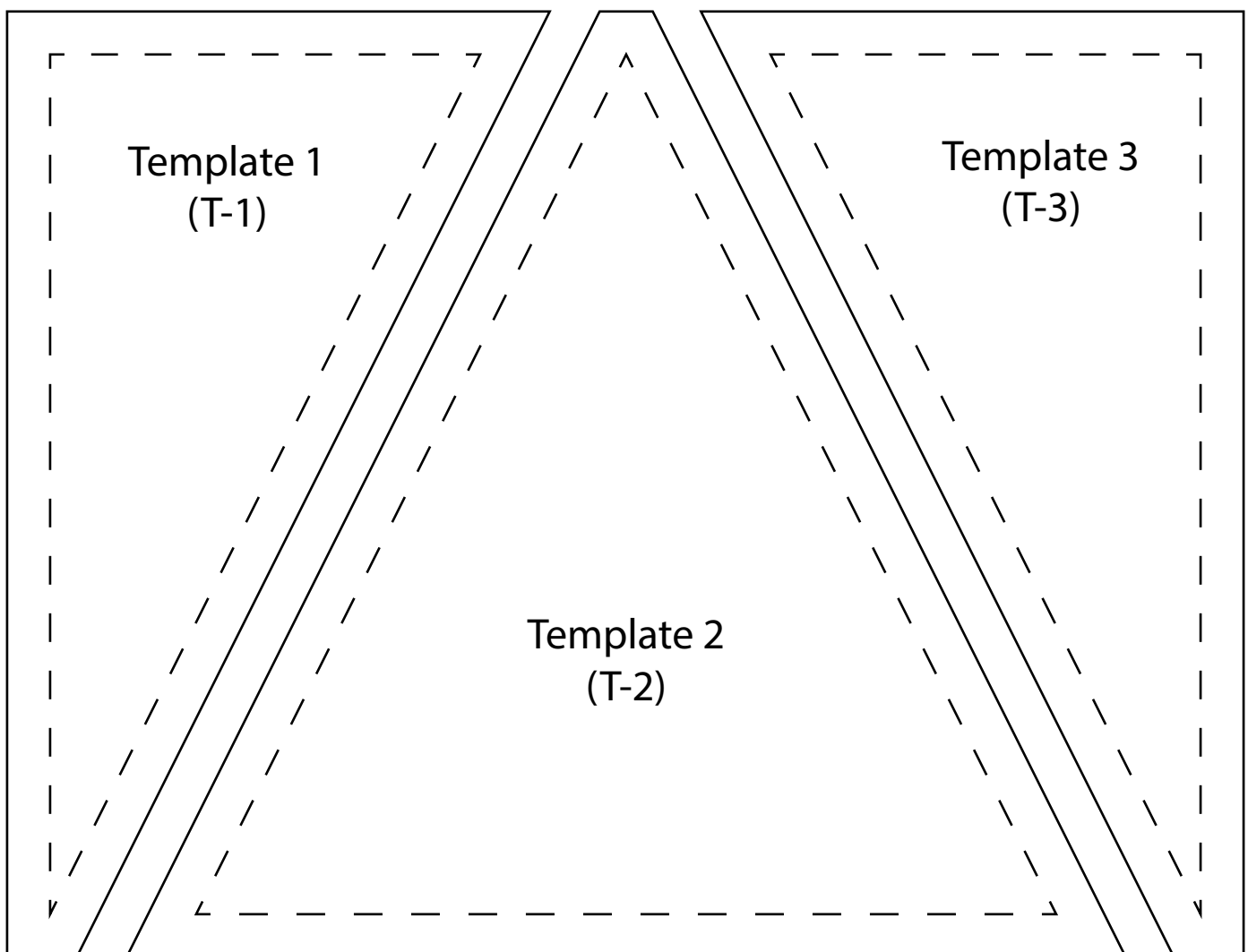
Quilt Layout
