## **Cutting Instructions:**

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvedges) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

#### From Fabric A:

- Cut twenty-three 4 1/2" strips. Subcut thirty-six 4 1/2" squares and seventy-two 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangles.
- 2. Cut fourteen 1 1/2" strips. Cut two 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" and one 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" rectangles from each of nine strips. From remaining five strips, cut nine additional 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" rectangles.
- 3. Cut seventeen 3 1/2" strips. Sew together end to end. Cut four 3 1/2" x 84 1/2" and twelve 3 1/2" x 24 1/2" strips.

#### From Fabric B:

1. Cut nine 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" centering each motif.

#### From Fabric C:

1. Cut nine 4 1/2" strips. Subcut seventy-two 4 1/2" squares.

#### From Fabric D:

- 1. Cut nine 4 1/2" strips. Subcut seventy-two 4 1/2" squares.
- 2. Cut eighteen 1 1/2" strips. Subcut eighteen 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" and eighteen 1 1/2" x 16 1/2" rectangles.


#### From Fabric E:

1. Cut nine 2 1/4" strips for binding.

### Piecing Instructions:

- 1. Using a fabric pen, draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of each 4 1/2" C and D squares.
- Pin one 4 1/2" D square to the left-hand side of thirty-six 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" A rectangles as shown (Figure 1). Sew on the line, trim the seam allowance to 1/4", and press towards D. Set aside as the A Units.

- 3. Repeat step 2, sewing 4 1/2" D squares to the right-hand side of the remaining thirty-six 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" A rectangles (Figure 1). Set aside as the B Units.
- 4. Pin one 4 1/2" C square to the open sides of the A and B units. Sew on the line, trim the seam allowance to 1/4", and press towards C. Square A and B units to 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" (Figure 1).



Sew the A and B units together, with C sides together as shown, to make thirty-six A/B Units. Press seams open (Figure 2).




Figure 3 Make 9 blocks.

6. Sew one 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" A rectangle to opposite sides of each 12 1/2" B square. Press towards A, then sew one 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" A rectangle to the remaining sides. Press towards A (Figure 3).

7. Sew one 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" D rectangle to opposite sides of each B square. Press towards D. Sew 1 1/2" x 16 1/2" D rectangle to the remaining sides. Press towards D (Figure 4).







Figure 5 Make 9 blocks.

8. Sew the A/B units, 4 1/2" A squares and 16 1/2" framed B squares together as shown to make the blocks. Make nine blocks. Square to 24 1/2" x 24 1/2" (Figure 5).

9. Sew the blocks together in rows with one 3 1/2" x 24 1/2" A strip between each, making sure that the motif in each

- block is oriented correctly. Sew one 3 1/2" x 24 1/2" A strip to either end of each row. Press towards A.
- 10. Sew the rows together with one 3 1/2" x 84 1/2" A strip between each row to make the quilt top. Sew one 3 1/2" x 84 1/2" A strip to the top and bottom to complete the quilt top. Press towards A.

### Finishing:

- 1. If using regular width fabric, prepare backing using three widths. Press seams open. Trim pieced or 108" backing to 92" x 92".
- 2. Layer quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- 4. Trim layers even with quilt top squaring corners.
- 5. Join 2 1/4" E binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Attach binding to quilt using your favorite method.
- 6. Make a label and sew to the back of the quilt.
