IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

When using electrical appliances, basic safety precautions should always be followed including the following:

- 1. Read all instructions.
- Do not touch hot surfaces. Use handles or knobs.
- To protect against electrical hazards, do not immerse cord, plugs, or the appliance in water or other liquids.
- 4. Close supervision is necessary when any appliance is used by or near children.
- 5. Unplug from outlet when not in use and before cleaning. Allow to cool before putting on or taking off parts, and before cleaning the appliance.
- 6. Do not operate any appliance with a damaged cord or plug or after the appliance malfunctions or has been damaged in any manner. Return appliance to Narita USA for examination repair or adjustment. See Warranty.
- 7. The use of accessories or attachments not recommended by Narita USA may cause hazards.
- 8. Do not use outdoors.
- 9. Do not let cord hang over edge of table or counter, or touch hot surfaces.
- 10. Do not place on or near a hot gas or electric burner, or in a heated oven.
- 11. Extreme caution must be used when moving an appliance containing hot liquids.
- 12. Always attach plug to appliance first, then plug cord into the wall outlet. To disconnect, turn any control to "OFF", then remove plug from wall outlet.
- CAUTION: This appliance generates heat and escaping steam during use. Proper
 precautions must be taken to prevent the risk of burns, fires or other damages to persons or
 property.
- 14. This appliance generates steam. Do not operate uncovered.
- 15. Do not leave unit unattended while in use.
- This appliance is for Household Use Only. Do not use appliance for other than intended use.
- Do not place the Inner Pot on other heat sources (e.g. cooking stove). It may become deformed.
- 18. Do not block steam vent holes.
- 19. During or immediately after cooking, the area near the Steam Vent Hole is kept at high temperature. To avoid burns, do not touch this area.
- 20. To reduce the risk of electric shock, cook only in the removable container.

- 3.Do not use without the Inner Pot in operation.
- 4.Do not cover the steam vent with anything as an explosion may occur.
- 5.Do not touch the Inner Pot nor any heating parts, immediately after use.

Allow the unit to cool down completely first.

- -bed and breakfast type environments







BEFORE COOKING RICE

1



Use a dry cloth to clean inner pot.

- ·Use a soft scrubber to wash the inner pot.
- ·Do not use rough or metallic scrubbers. Otherwise, coating will pilled off.
- Do not put anything that is metallic and sharp into the inner pot while cleaning. (Fork, spoon, chopsticks, knife, and etc.)

Measure the rice

- ·Always use the measuring cup supplied with the rice cooker (for rinse-free rice as well).
- ·A leveled filling of rice in the supplied measuring cup equals about 0.18 L.

Wash the rice

- ·Use another container to wash the rice.
- ·Stir the rice around with your hand in a generous amount of water, pour out the water, and repeat until the water remains clear.



Adjust water level

- ·Place inner pot on a flat surface to adjust water level.
- ·The marked lines in the inner pot indicate water level.
- ·The added water should not exceed the max line.

Wipe off any water and rice

- <Outer surface and brim of the inner pot>
- Place the inner pot in the rice cooker.
- (1) Turn the inner pot slightly left and right so it is positioned correctly without any tilt.
- (2) Close the lid. Then press the lid until you hear "click".


Connect each end of the power cord to the specified locations. (120V/60HZ)

Press the (b) key to select the desired menu.

Rice





Press the POWER button to turn on the rice cooker.



Press the WHITE RICE or BROWN RICE button, depending upon the type of rice being cooked.

The digital display will show a "chasing" pattern.

•The digital display will show the number of hours the rice cooker has been on Keep-Warm, beginning with "0-12" hours.





Setting the Delay Timer




Press the POWER button to turn on the rice cooker.

Press the DELAY TIMER button. Each press increases in one hour increments. The time may be set to have rice ready in 1 to 15 hours for white rice and 2 to 15 hours for brown rice.



Once the needed time is selected, press the WHITE RICE or BROWN RICE button, depending on the type of rice being cooked.

The digital display will countdown from the time selected.

The rice cooker will begin cooking. The digital display will show a "chasing" pattern.

Once rice is finished, the rice cooker will beep and •Automatically switch to Keep-Warm.

•The digital display will show the number of hours the rice cooker has been on Keep-Warm, beginning with "0-12" hours.



When finished serving rice, turn the rice cooker off by pressing the POWER/KEEP-WARM button and unplug the power cord.


Slow Cooking

Press the POWER button to turn on the rice cooker.

- Select the Slow Cook function. The digital display will show a flashing 2 to represent two hours of slow cook time.
- •Press the SLOW COOK button to increase the cook time by 1 hour increments.

The rice cooker will begin to slow cook. The digital display will count down from the selected time.



Once rice is finished, the rice cooker will beep and •Automatically switch to Keep-Warm.


•The digital display will show the number of hours the rice cooker has been on Keep-Warm, beginning with "0-12" hours.


How To Clean

Removing and attaching the inner lid: Pull the inner lid towards you to remove it. To reattach, align the inner lid gasket with the shaft on the main lid.


How to Clean Dew Collector

Dew Collector

· Hold the two sides of the collector, pull it up or down according to direction of the arrow in the picture.



· Clean the Dew Collector after using.



** Cleaning:

Before cleaning, please take the plug out of the power socket and unplug the cord.

Clean everything carefully including the stainless steel inner pot. Use neutral detergents to clean if necessary. Never immerse the motor base into water. Wipe the motor base with a slightly moist and soft towel or cloth.

LIMITED WARRANTY
