

Your jewelry is delicate and thus requires special care and attention. To preserve the beauty of your jewelry piece over time, we recommend the following cleaning and precaution tips.

Cleaning

Regularly use a soft, lint-free cloth to remove oils, lotions, and dirt.

To clean your diamond jewelry, use a soft-bristle toothbrush, warm water, and mild dish soap. Start by soaking the jewelry in warm, soapy water for 15-20 minutes to loosen dirt and oils. Gently scrub the diamond's surface with the toothbrush, then rinse it under warm water, using a strainer for pieces with multiple stones. Finally, pat it dry with a lint-free cloth to prevent water spots.

Storage

Keep jewelry separate to prevent scratches and tangling.

Preventing Damage

Remove jewelry before activities that expose it to chemicals, sweat, or impact, such as gardening, sports and cleaning.

Avoid contact with harsh chemicals and direct sunlight.

Regular Inspections

Check settings: Periodically inspect the settings of your jewelry to ensure gemstones are secure.

Prong Repairs: If you notice loose or damaged prongs on rings, get them repaired promptly to prevent loss of stones.

Gemstone Care

Diamonds

Diamonds are durable but can still chip or crack. Avoid wearing diamond jewelry when doing rough work.

Pearls

Wipe pearls with a soft, damp cloth. Avoid exposure to hairsprays and lotions to maintain luster.

Gemstones

Be aware of gemstone-specific care. Some stones, like opals and emeralds, are more delicate and require extra care.

Precious Metal Maintenance

White Gold

White gold may lose its luster over time and a professional polishing can restore its shine by adding a rhodium plating to maintain whiteness.

Yellow Gold

Yellow gold can dull with wear and a professional polishing wheel can renew its shine and remove light surface scratching.

Platinum

Platinum, while durable, is a soft metal and can develop blemishes. Professional polishing removes imperfections.
