Please kindly note that Plantasia has a very large pattern repeat. It therefore comes with two rolls, Roll A and Roll B. Said rolls need to be applied in the following order: - A, B, A, B, A etc.

We've put together a helpful guide to create your wonder wall...

#### **PREPARATION**

Make sure that the base is dry, clean, smooth and free from loose wallpaper particles and flaking paint. Painted surfaces must be abraded/ rubbed down with sand paper and washed with sugar soap, for example. Highly absorbent bases should be sized or undercoated. The base must be uniformly neutral or white in colour. To get the best finish, we advise painting a strip in the colour of the wallpaper at 45cm increments, in case any of the wall shows at the join.

## **PASTING**

Our wallpaper is best applied using a paste-the-wall method. Use only a non-woven adhesive. Apply the adhesive to the wall in an even layer with a roller. Pasting between one and a maximum of three roll widths at a time is recommended. The adhesive must not be allowed to dry before the length is hung. Remember that this wallcovering requires a smaller quantity of adhesive than a paper wallpaper. Make sure that the adhesive is not forced out from between the joint and onto the front surface. This can cause changes in the surface.

Tip - use a brush on cornices and skirtings to keep any surplus adhesive to a minimum.

#### HANGING

Our wallpaper is printed in panels, with the top marked, to make it simpler to hang and pattern match. If using more than 1 roll, PLANTASIA has a 'Roll A' and 'Roll B'. Hang 'Roll A' first. This wallpaper should be hung in from left to right. The first length should be hung on the left hand side of the wall. Hang the first length so that it is plumb. Press the wallpaper firmly in position using a soft, clean paperhanger's brush or a soft smoothing pad. Check carefully and ensure no air bubbles are present. Pull the second length from the roll and turn it in the opposite direction (inverted length, so in a roll, panels 2 & 4 will need to be flipped at the cut line; you will see that when the tops are aligned, the pattern will match at the join). The following length will then need to be turned in the opposite direction, and so on. Once all 4 panels of 'Roll A' have been applied, you can proceed with 'Roll B', followed by 'Roll A' and so on, depending on how many rolls you have.

Tip - Slightly overlap each panel by a millimetre or so, so that the white edge of the paper cannot be seen.

Any adhesive on the front surface of the wallpaper can be removed with a soft, wet sponge.

NOTE - Do not rub!
