### Pastor Pedalings...

It's good to be back to my Pastor Pedalings. The staff and I needed to shift gears a little this summer. Now that summer's almost over, I think we're mostly ready to climb into the saddle again.

Part of my summer constituted making some adjustments both professionally and personally. One of the things I've learned through the years, is that if I do not stay healthy physically (diet and exercise), spiritually, emotionally, socially, and financially, I get to a point where I don't put my best foot forward. Likewise, when I get overly tired, there are consequences that end up taking a toll. This summer was a something of a necessary self-care "reset" for me. So, back in the saddle again!

Recently, I read a fascinating article about how the world is changing and how churches must adapt to needs of its mission field. In sharing the points made in the article, I am asking for your participation and help as part of the process of navigating forward.

The five shifts include:

- 1. The "highest good" in society now is about individual freedom and happiness. That means for some the Bible does not necessarily set the standard on ethics, personal behavior, or values. Instead, ethics, behavior, and values have been replaced by experiences, desires, preferences, and feelings. In a number of cases, self is elevated over God. So, is it time for the church to push back and speak into this?
- 2. Traditions that restrict freedom, happiness and self-expression are being destroyed. That means people are creating their own "religious" beliefs, so they can just be themselves. So, if the gospel says that Jesus is your Savior and your Lord, does that mean you're willing to let the good news of Jesus Christ shape what you believe and how you live your money, your life, how you treat neighbors and how you show hospitality? How do people develop humility?
- 3. Some believe the world will get better through progress, education, and technology even though the 100 million dead in the 20th century would disagree. Basically, there is a school of thought where some think they can outsmart antiquated scripture and even God.



This indicates an inclination to deny evil, injustice and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves. How can the church help people learn that evil, injustice, and oppression exist and why resisting them are important through love rather than judgment?

- 4. Some believe their ethics are not about doing what's right for the greater good but doing what's right for themselves. That means the church must learn how to enter into the conversations surrounding the sentiment graciously but knowledgeably. How would you suggest doing that?
- 5. Some reject external authority because it is more important to celebrate personal authenticity. The sentiment is that the goal is about being the best you, often making self into a false idol or a replacement of God. What is the best way for the church to start with itself to welcome the authority of the triune God, so individuals and communities can be at their best?

These days the church is widely viewed as judgmental, anti-gay, too political, racist, and hypocritical. If that's so (and I'm not saying it is ... this is based upon research), how is ministry affected when church attendance used to be 48 out of 52 weeks a year to once every four weeks (the last 20 or so years), to once every 7 or 8 weeks (post-pandemic)? There's been a digital revolution, a porn revolution, and studies that indicate people are on their phones or devices 40 hours a week, which some consider a device addiction.

So, how is the church going to adapt to all of this? It is up to the church membership to bring the gospel message to the world. What suggestions do you have to make that happen?

I don't have all the answers and I'm pretty sure no one who will read this does either, but I would welcome your written feedback and conversations because I believe in the First UMC of Holdrege, and I believe in all of you. With God's help, let's do this together!




