Ahhhhhhhh. Summer!

Recently, I was blessed to attend the Loomis High School and Holdrege High School graduations. In addition, I was blessed to share a few words at the Baccalaureate in Holdrege. Each was an honor and my congratulations to students, families and teachers who had a hand in seeing all this come together.

As long as I've been a pastor, I've found summer to be a time to step back and catch my breath. That's why there are now several people trained to lead Class Meeting groups, and it's why I've asked Candance to lead some of the adult bible studies this summer.

One of my goals this summer is to refocus on both identifying the lay leadership in the year ahead and how training will be provided for those serving on committees. The second goal I am hoping to reach is to actually plan out preaching paths in the months ahead, particularly since I have already announced a sermon series centering on the changes in the United Methodist Church, which will have me deviate from my normal lectionary preaching methodology and bible or book studies. A third goal this summer centers around my health. I'm going to explain why.

In 2014, I was perilously close to having a heart attack, since my LAD artery was 99 percent blocked. A few months after receiving a stent, as I started to get physically healthy through diets and exercise, I had what I refer to as my Christmas Carol experience, where I had four horrific dreams over five nights. Those dreams centered around physical (exercise and diet), emotional (psychological and mental), spiritual (connecting with God, others and self), and social health (politics and economics). At the time, learning to understand each and how they function together was central to me.

Since then, I have developed a much deeper awareness of how important it is to be as healthy as I can be. Unfortunately, during the pandemic, some of the exercise equipment we had broke down, so I got a little lazy taking care of myself physically but now – since starting spin classes in January – I am starting to notice the benefits and I know there are more to be gained.

Don't take me wrong, here. I am not doing this in vain. I am doing it because one of the things I have learned in recent years is that the healthier I can be in all aspects of my life, the more that health rubs off in my personal and professional life. In the research I've read, the healthier a pastor is, the healthier his or her leadership is and the healthier the pastoral leadership can be, the healthier the church becomes.

Healthier leadership also focuses on processes and processes must play a significant role in how people are asked to serve on church committees as well as how people serve on church committees and in the ministries of the church. When committees get too focused on content it can lead to anxiety among committee members, secret keeping, and the likelihood of talking about people rather than with them. As you know, the centerpiece of any church ministry must be the relationships that come from that ministry and relationships must be personal. Process aids relationship development; content can have a tendency to shatter relationships.

So, that's some of what my summer looks like. What's your summer plans? I've heard some folks are interested in heading to the area lakes this summer, but that isn't the question I'm asking. What are your summer plans to share God's blessings with others, so they're inspired to do the same? What are your summer plans to connect with loved ones? What are your summer plans to participate in the life of the church? I'd love to hear them!






We still have the Upper Room available. The current one is May/June. July/ August will be available the end of June. Suggested donation for the Upper Room is \$1.


CROCHETERS

The Episcopal Fund (\$699,878)

The Episcopal Fund provides compensation and support to all of our denomination's bishops. This fund was one of three general apportioned funds which were part of the financial plan of the Methodist Church from the time of its unification in 1939.

Today, the bishops of The United Methodist Church are providing spiritual leadership to more than 12 million persons in a broad range of settings on four continents, including North America, Europe, Africa and Asia.

Ministerial Education Fund (\$798,233)

The Ministerial Education Fund provides needed scholarships through annual conferences, essential funds for the support of our 13 United Methodist seminaries in the United States, programs that encourage men and women to respond to the call to ordained ministry, continuing-education opportunities for pastors across the connection, and course-of-study education for local pastors.

Every clergy person who has served in the UMC over the last 50 years has been shaped in part by the ministries and institutions supported by the MEF, including 13 United Methodist U.S.-based seminaries that receive funding from MEF.
