### **SCENE 2: HOT CROSS BUNS**

**Bun Seller:** Who fancies a tasty hot cross bun?

Customer 1: What's a hot cross bun?

Bun Seller: They've been around for 300 years!

Customer 1: (Shocked) 300 years?!

Bun Seller: Listen-up, and we'll tell you everything you need to know

Customer 2: What do you need to make hot cross buns?

A Baker holds up the ingredients:

**Egg Hunter 1:** But they weren't made from chocolate. They were REAL eggs,

hard boiled, and painted or dyed pretty colours.

Egg Hunter 2: (Impressed) Oooo!

SIXTY THOUSAND YEARS OLD!
