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## **Expanding the Cast List**

The number of speaking parts can easily be increased to approximately 60:

#### **Narrators**

Increase the number of Narrators (to a maximum of eleven) and spread the lines out accordingly.

#### **Japanese**

Increase the number of speaking Japanese (ideally to a maximum of eight) and spread the lines out accordingly.

#### **Parisian Waiters and Waitresses**

Increase the number of Waiters and Waitresses (ideally to a maximum of three) and spread the lines out accordingly.

### **Spaniards**

Increase the number of Spaniards (ideally to a maximum of nine) and spread the lines out accordingly.

#### **Egyptian Scribes**

Increase the number of Scribes (to a maximum of four) and spread the lines out accordingly.

#### **Reducing the Cast List**

The number of speaking parts can easily be reduced to approximately 20; simply combine any of the following parts and spread the lines out accordingly:

- Narrators
- Waiters/Waitresses
- Spaniards
- Egyptians

Several lines in the script are not essential to the story and can simply be cut. Scenes 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 are not essential to the story; any of them can simply be cut.
