FULL DETAILS

Running Time (including music): Approximately 35 minutes.

Number of songs: 6

Cast: 28 speaking parts (easily adaptable to approximately **20 - 65**). The cast can also be expanded further with **non-speaking parts**; suggestions for expanding or reducing the cast are provided in your Play Pack. For further information, take a look at the cast list available on our website.

SCENE 1: WELCOME TO OUR SHOW!

□ Track 1: MEDLEY (OPTIONAL)

Time to get ready for the start of the show! The instrumental Medley welcomes the audience as the cast assemble, ready to begin the performance...

SCENE 2: THE NORTH POLE

There is snow and ice as far as the eye can see. A young reindeer - Little Jo - is wandering aimlessly, looking confused.

Narrator 1: Welcome to the North Pole -

The coldest place you've ever known.

Narrator 2: Who's that in the ice and snow...?

Say hello to Little Jo!

Little Jo waves cheerily at the audience.

Little Jo: Hello! I'm Little Jo, but I don't know what animal I am...

Everyone: (Sympathetically, encouraging the audience to join in) Aaaah!

Narrator 3: All alone and feeling sad,

Little Jo looks for mum and dad.

J Track 2: WHO AM I?

(Optional Part 2 vocals in brackets).

Verse 1 Standing on my own, Feeling all alone,

Will I ever know, Just who I am?

Sway sadly from side to side. Hold hands out to the side in confusion.

At the end of the song, the Snowflakes exit.

Little Jo: (Sadly, to the audience) I STILL don't know who I am...

Everyone: (Sympathetically, encouraging the audience to join in) Aaaah!

SCENE 3: THE SNOWY OWLS

J Track 4: ON OFF MUSIC

A family of **Snowy Owls** enter from stage left and flutter around; **Little Jo** crosses to them.

Narrator 4: Owls are playing in the snow -

Little Jo goes to say hello.

Little Jo: Hello! I'm Little Jo, but I don't know what animal I am!

Mrs Snowy Owl: We're a family of snowy owls.

Mr Snowy Owl: But I don't think YOU'RE an owl...

Baby Snowy Owl: Unless you can twit-twoo ...?

Mrs Snowy Owl: If you can twit-twoo you might be an owl.

All the Snowy Owls bob up and down whilst they twit-twoo loudly.

∏ Track 5: TWIT-TWOO!

Verse 1 Hoot all night, sleep all day,

Hoot all night, sleep all day. Hoot for me, hoot for you, Hoot for me, hoot for you.

Chorus Woo, woo, woo, twit-twoo!

All Snowy Owls: (Shaking their heads) No!

Mr Snowy Owl: (To the audience) Do YOU think Little Jo's an owl?

Everyone: No!

All Snowy Owls: (To Little Jo) Uh-oh! Better luck next time!

□ Track 6: ON OFF MUSIC

Bob up and down in time with the music.

The Snowy Owls exit stage left.

Little Jo: (Sadly, to the audience) I STILL don't know who I am...

Little Jo shuffles forlornly off stage right.

Everyone: (Sympathetically, encouraging the audience to join in) Aaaah!

SCENE 4: THE POLAR BEARS

☐ Track 7: ON OFF MUSIC

A family of Polar Bears enter from stage left and stroll around.

Narrator 5: On the ice, not far away, Polar bears come out to play.

Track 8: THE POLAR BEAR BLUES

Instrumental

Verse 1 We just stroll along,

Sing a happy song. We just stroll along, Sing a happy song. Do a cool stroll in time with the music!

Chorus So come on and do.

Little Jo: Hello! I'm Little Jo, but I don't know what animal I am!

Mrs Polar Bear: We're a family of polar bears.

Mr Polar Bear: But I don't think YOU'RE a polar bear...

Baby Polar Bear: Unless you like fish ...?

Mrs Polar Bear: All we eat is fish.

Mr Polar Bear: We have fish pie...

Mrs Polar Bear: ... fish fingers...

Mr Polar Bear: ... fish stew...

Baby Polar Bear: Or would you prefer a cake?

Little Jo: (Suddenly looking happier) Yes, please! What sort of cake?

All Polar Bears: (Excitedly) FISH CAKE!

All the **Polar Bears** produce a fish to eat. The **Baby Polar Bear** gives a fish to **Little Jo** who tentatively sniffs at it and pulls a face.

Little Jo: It smells!

Mr Polar Bear: (To the Polar Bears) Do you think Little Jo's a polar bear?

All Polar Bears: (Shaking their heads) No!

Mr Polar Bear: (To the audience) Do YOU think Little Jo's a polar bear?

Everyone: No!

All Polar Bears: (To Little Jo) Uh-oh! Better luck next time!
