FULL DETAILS

Running Time (including music): Approximately 25 minutes.

Number of songs: 6

Cast: The only **speaking parts** are narrators, who guide the actions of the children on stage through a few simple lines of dialogue.

The number of **non-speaking parts** is approximately **15 - 40**, and is fully flexible to suit your requirements. For further information, take a look at the cast list available on our website.

SCENE 1: WELCOME TO OUR SHOW!

□ Track 1: MEDLEY (OPTIONAL)

Time to get ready for the start of the show! The instrumental Medley welcomes the audience as the cast assemble, ready to begin the performance...

SCENE 2: THE NORTH POLE

There is snow and ice as far as the eye can see. A young reindeer - Little Jo - is wandering aimlessly, looking confused.

Narrator 1: Welcome to the North Pole -

The coldest place you've ever known.

Narrator 2: Who's that in the ice and snow...?

Say hello to Little Jo!

Little Jo waves cheerily at the audience.

Little Jo: Hello!

Narrator 3: But Little Jo is feeling very sad - he/she doesn't know what

animal he/she is. Poor Little Jo!

Everyone: Poor Little Jo!

Little Jo: (Sadly, to the audience) Who am I...?

Little Jo walks around the stage again, still looking lost.

Everyone: (Sympathetically, encouraging the audience to join in) Aaaah!

□ Track 2: WHO AM I?

Verse 1 Standing on my own, Feeling all alone,

Will I ever know, Just who I am?

Standing on my own, Feeling all alone, Will I ever know, Just who I am?

Hold hands out to the side in confusion.

Won't somebody help me?

I feel so sad.

Hold hands out to the front imploringly.

During the song, Snowflakes run on and dance around Little Jo.

J Track 3: ON OFF MUSIC

At the end of the song, the Snowflakes exit.

SCENE 3: THE SNOWY OWLS

☐ Track 4: ON OFF MUSIC

A family of **Snowy Owls** enter from stage left and flutter around; **Little Jo** crosses to them.

Narrator 4: Owls are playing in the snow -

Little Jo says hello.

Little Jo: (Waving) Hello!

Narrator 1: Maybe Little Jo is a snowy owl, if he/she can hoot...?

Snowy Owl: (To Little Jo) Can you hoot?

Little Jo shrugs, and all the **Snowy Owls** bob up and down whilst they twit-twoo loudly.

□ Track 5: TWIT-TWOO!

Verse 1 Hoot all night, sleep all day,

Hoot all night, sleep all day. Hoot for me, hoot for you, Hoot for me, hoot for you.

Chorus Woo, woo, twit-twoo!

Woo, woo, woo, twit-twoo!

Woo, woo, woo, twit-twoo, woo!

Woo, woo, woo, twit-twoo! Woo, woo, woo, twit-twoo!

Woo, woo, woo, twit-twoo, woo!

Verse 2 Repeat Verse 1

Chorus

On "Hoot all night,"
hold hands up to
mouth like a
megaphone. On "Sleep
all day," make a 'pillow'
out of hands, and
pretend to sleep.

Bob up and down in time with the music.

Narrator 2: Do you think Little Jo's a snowy owl?

All Snowy Owls: (Shaking their heads) No!

Narrator 2: Poor Little Jo!

Everyone: Poor Little Jo!

☐ Track 6: ON OFF MUSIC

The Snowy Owls exit stage left.

Little Jo: (Sadly, to the audience) Who am I...?

Little Jo shuffles forlornly off stage right.

Everyone: (Sympathetically, encouraging the audience to join in) Aaaah!

SCENE 4: THE POLAR BEARS

J Track 7: ON OFF MUSIC

A family of Polar Bears enter from stage left and stroll around.

Narrator 3: On the ice, not far away,

Polar bears come out to play.

Track 8: THE POLAR BEAR BLUES

Instrumental

Verse 1 We just stroll along,

Sing a happy song. We just stroll along, Sing a happy song. ← Do a cool stroll in time with the music!

Chorus So come on and do,

So come on and do, So come on and do, The polar bear blues. The polar bear blues. Beckon.

Roll arms.

Verse 2 Repeat Verse 1

The polar bear blues. The polar bear blues. The polar bear blues. **Little Jo** enters cautiously from stage right and approaches the **Polar Bears**.

Narrator 4: Maybe Little Jo is a polar bear, if he/she likes fish...?

Polar Bear: (To Little Jo) Do you like fish?

All the **Polar Bears** produce a fish to eat. They give one to **Little Jo** who tentatively sniffs at it and pulls a face.

Little Jo: It smells!

Narrator 1: Do you think Little Jo's a polar bear?

All Polar Bears: (Shaking their heads) No!

Narrator 1: Poor Little Jo!

Everyone: Poor Little Jo!

□ Track 9: ON OFF MUSIC

Will Little Jo be reunited with the missing family...?
