Expanding the Cast List

The number of speaking parts can easily be increased to approximately 45:

Narrators

Increase the number of Narrators (to a maximum of fourteen) and spread the lines out accordingly.

Children

Increase the number of speaking Children (ideally to a maximum of twelve) and spread the lines out accordingly.

Furthermore, when Dodge says, "What shall we call him?" several Children can shout out they're suggestion of a name before Beanie says, "Sammy!"

Robins

Increase the number of speaking Robins (to a maximum of ten) and spread the lines out accordingly.

When Robin 2 says, "We'll sing him a song!" several Robins can repeat "We'll sing him a song!" in turn before Robin 3 says, "That'll cheer him up!"

Reducing the Cast List

The number of speaking parts can easily be reduced to approximately 17; simply combine any of the following parts and spread the lines out accordingly:

- Narrators
- Children
- Mr and Mrs Rabbit
- Robins
- Santa's Elves

Several lines in the script are not essential to the story and can simply be cut. Scene 2 is not essential to the story, and can simply be cut.
