Prior to Installation:

- Make sure you have all necessary parts by checking the diagram andparts list.

- Turn off the hot and cold water supply at the angle stops and turn on the old faucet to release any built up pressure. Remove existing faucet. Clean sink or countertop to remove any debris, plumber's putty, or silicone.
- Flush angle stops to release any debris prior to installation.
- Pre-drilled hole size requirement: 13/8"(min)
- Max countertop thickness: 13/4"



Faucet Dimension




Installer Tip:

Shut off main water supply before installing new faucet.




Shut off the water supply. Remove the old faucet. Clean the mounting surface. Remove mounting hardware (B~E) from the faucet.

Untie the rope of the gravity hammer as shown in the figure below.




Step 2. Installing the faucet to the countertop




Insert faucet body (A) through the hole in the sink or the countertop.

Step 3. Install mounting hardware




Pass the mounting hardwares (B~ E) through the water pipes in turn, install them on the faucet body and tighten.


Pass the mounting hardwares through the water pipes according to the figure below.




Step 4. Reattach the gravity hammer rope




Reattach the gravity hammer rope according to the figure below.







Step 6. Connect induction controller to the faucet




Step 7. Connect induction controller to the electric wire of faucet





Step 8. Install gravity hammer






Step 10. Fix batteries box rack






Follow the steps shown in figure 1-3, assemble the batteries box and install 4 AA batteries.


Step 12. Insert batteries box to the rack

Step 14. Turn the faucet on and check for induction



Turn on angle stops, turn the faucet on, check for induction and temprature displaying.

(DO NOT TURN FAUCET ON BEFORE THE INSTALLATION IS COMPLETE)

Trouble-Shooting

If you have followed the instructions carefully and your faucet still does not work properly, take the following corrective steps:

PROBLEM	CAUSE	ACTION
Leakage under faucet handle	Bonnet nut (11) has come loose	Remove the cover button (15). Loosen set screw (14) with hex wrench (22). Remove the handle. Unscrew cap (12). Tighten bonnet nut (11) with an adjustable wrench.
The aerator has an irregular or reduced water flow	The aerator is dirty or mis-fitted	Remove the aerator and check for debris. Ensure that the rubber washer is properly installed.
The water pressure is low.	The connector underneath the deck is clogged with debris The aerator is clogged	Turn off the water supply and disconnect the connector / aerator. Unscrew the connector / aerator and clean under running water. Screw the connector / aerator back. Test water flow. If water pressure is still low then replace the connector / aerator.
There is a low flow of water.	The screen filter in the hose connectors is dirty.	Turn off the water supply at water valve and unscrew the hose connectors from water supply lines. Clean the screen in the water lines with hot water, removing any debris or calcium build up.

Care & Maintenance

To keep the product clean & shining, follow the steps below:

- 1. Rinse with clean water & dry with a soft cloth
- 2. Do not clean with soaps, acid, polish, abrasives or harsh cleaners
- 3. Do not use cloth with a coarse surface
- 4. Unscrew the aerator and clean when necessary

Faucets - for Kitchen, Bathroom, Shower, Tub

Non-electronic Faucets:

Two-year Limited (residential) and One-year Limited (commercial) on the structure and finish.

Two-year Limited (residential) and One-year Limited (commercial) on the cartridge.

One-year Limited (residential and commercial) on the mechanical components such as but not limited to sprayhead assembly (includes engine, aerators, structure, restrictors, back flow preventers, sprayer hoses, braided supply line hoses which encompasses nylon, silicon and stainless steel, etc), LED function.

Electronic Faucets:

Two-year Limited (residential) and One-year Limited (commercial) on the structure, finish, electronic parts and cartridge.

One-year Limited (residential and commercial) on the mechanical components such as but not limited to braided supply line hoses, LED function.

Faucet Accessories:

One-year Limited (residential and commercial) for drains, sink strainers, soap dispensers, escutcheon plates.

Bathroom Accessories - TowelBars/Rings, Holders, Bathroom Shelves, Hooks or the like

Two-year Limited (residential) and One-year Limited (commercial) on the structure, finish and hardware.

Kitchen Sinks:

Two-year Limited (residential) and One-year Limited (commercial) on the sink bowl.

One-year Limited (residential and commercial) on hardware and drain assembly.

Section-2 - Warranty Agreement and Restrictions
