Section 4: First-Aid Measures

After skin contact: Wash skin thoroughly with soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists after washing

Section 6: Accidental Release Measures

Personal precautions: Use personal protective equipment. Keep unauthorized personnel away. Use in well ventilated spaces. Ventilate closed spaces before entering them

Measures for environmental protection: Do not contaminate water sources or sewer. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Avoid discharge into drains, watercourses or onto the ground.

Measures for cleaning/collecting: Absorb spill with vermiculite or other inert material, then place in a container for chemical waste. Clean the surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination. Dike far ahead of the larger spill for later recovery and disposal.

Section 7: Handling and Storage

Handling: Use personal protective equipment as required. Do not breathe mist or vapor. Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Do not taste or swallow. Wash hands thoroughly after handling. Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood. Obtain special instructions before use.

Storage: Keep container tightly closed. Store in a well-ventilated place. Store in a dry place. Store in a locked or controlled access area.
