LETTER FROM THE **FOUNDER & BOARD CHAIR Sophie Alpert**

Dear friend of Piece by Piece,

Piece by Piece began with an idea that creating art out of recycled materials could be an avenue for individuals rebuilding their lives. Now, 16 years later, we have seen recycled art create a new cycle of life for so many individuals. I am always inspired by the passion, courage and creativity of the Piece by Piece participants. It's an honor to support our artists on their journeys of self-discovery. healing, and growth while empowering self-reliance.

As an organization, we also experienced significant growth in 2022. We moved into our new permanent home at Broadway Village II last April. I would like to thank our landlord Deep Green Housing for their support and belief in our mission. When we returned to in-person classes in May, the studio came to life with the vibrancy and creativity of the participants and staff. As excited as we were to be able to be back in person, we were also aware that not everyone could comfortably attend, so we have continued our zoom classes as well. We had over 569 seats filled in our in-person classes, with 30 new participants discovering Piece by Piece, and over 1500 views of our online classes, demonstrating the great need for art and community in the lives of our participants.

In 2022 our social enterprise generated more earned revenue than any prior year, with a growing number of participants creating and earning income. Our large scale commissions included: 200 Ocean, The City of Paramount, and The Trust for Public Land - Urban Orchard mural. These murals are truly works of art and I encourage you to visit them.

The artists also created many awards for both longtime supporters and new clients. Thanks to our partnership with LightHouse ArtSpace, Piece by Plece mosaics continue to be offered for sale at their magical immersive shows. Contemporary abstract painter, Laura Letchinger invited Piece by Piece to be a part of her gallery show in Long Beach offering a beautiful venue to showcase our work and an opportunity for participant artists to experience the excitement of an opening night.

Behind the scenes, our staff grew to support all of these classes and commissions. We welcomed Tasha Pimental as Program Assistant and Josh Provost as our Operations Manager. I appreciate the energy, support, and kindness they have added to our team. I also wish to acknowledge all of our staff and instructors for their continued commitment and passion. They are the heart of Piece by Piece, and I am truly grateful to each of them.

In addition to all of this, we were able to engage with our community through outreach events, pop-up sales, and events all over Los Angeles. We were also able to provide several cultural outings for our participants to explore LA.

All of this contributed to a transformative year for the Piece by Piece Artists. Thank you for your ongoing support. Because of you, Piece by Piece participants have been developing the skills, resources, and support needed to transform their lives.

HECTOR G.

Join us in congratulating Hector for becoming Piece by Piece's newest Certified Artist. Hector is a bright spirit who brings a layer of fun and creativity to every workshop he joins. We talked to Hector and here's what he had to say about his work at Piece by Piece!

How did you hear about Piece by Piece?

I was on my phone, and I was scrolling on social media to see if there were any free art events near me, and I saw a post on my Facebook feed about free basic mosaic classes for the residents of south LA, and I signed up!

Who inspires you?

People inspire me. Everyone around me inspires me, and I always learn something new from talking and listening to people. I grew up in South Los Angeles with many diverse people from different backgrounds, cultures, etc. and that has helped me be open-minded.

What materials do you like to use in your mosaic work?

I like recycled tesserae so I'll use any material that is recyclable or that is donated here. It's my favorite to use recycled material and give it a second home.

How have you grown as an artist and a person since joining Piece

I've never done mosaics or knew what mosaic was until I came to Piece by Piece. At first, I was very nervous about cutting the tesserae pieces, and I struggled to figure out where to place my tesserae pieces, and my pieces would fly everywhere. Coming to the basic mosaic classes on Wednesdays and learning from Dawn, Bea, and the otherinstructors have helped me improve so much as an artist, and I have gained so much knowledge and skills about mosaics that I feel comfortable and at peace.

What does Piece by Piece mean to you?

Piece by Piece means family and not a competition. I do feel sometimes like life is a competition but my colleagues show me that we're all here and we all have struggles and because of that we know that it's ok to be ourselves.

What has Piece by Piece and creating mosaics added to your life?

Piece By Piece has given me hope and a voice. It's very inspirational to be able to tell my story by putting broken recycled tesserae pieces together. Being able to create art is something beautiful.

VICKI M.

Piece by Piece supports participant artists as they heal from past trauma, focus on their mental wellbeing, and build community as they learn the art of mosaics. Each individual is unique and brings a with them a wealth of life experiences. The one commonality they all share is their steadfast commitment to rebuilding their lives through art! We are pleased to share Vicki's recent interview with you.

How did you find out about Piece by Piece?

I found out about Piece by Piece before I started coming in the summer of 2014. I found out about it through the economic development department because I was unemployed at the time. It was their old location in Marina Del Ray and it had brochures and mosaics from Piece by Piece - they were part of the decor in that office!

What do you like about Piece by Piece?

There are so many things because it's such a large part of my life. I got an MFA in film production from USC and then came to Piece by Piece while unemployed and homeless and was going to try something different. Everything was changing all the time for me —and then I made my first frame, which I still have now! After a little time I started talking about completing the certification program. Piece by Piece became an anchor for me. It helped me through that period. I had a lot of things going on, and it helped me have a more regular schedule. It helps with art therapy and I enjoy getting lost in it, and as your skills grow, you get more competent and get to practice completion. It's hard to complete things in transitions, and it's an opportunity to get back into completion mode and get things under control.

What inspires you?

So many things! Just the world itself. I think that as I complete each project. I get more inspired. Each project represents my development, my achievement, and I get excited to start the next project. You can just get inspired by the process.

What materials do you like to use?

I'll use anything! I've mostly stuck to our standard, ceramic and glass. I feel more confident using things that I have more product knowledge about. How to clean it right, how to adhere it. I like to stick to what I know a bit more.

What do you want to learn more about?

There's so much stuff! I would say working bigger for myself. I'm at the point where I can do more individual projects so I am working on that. We once did a show that was at the main museum and I wrote the intro for the show. They were so focused on studio space, especially in Skid Row, which is hard to come by. So I have the idea to work bigger.

Do you participate in other creative arts?

Oh yeah, I paint, I do pottery, anything that's out there I'll do! Music, I just do art period. Over the years I've been extremely varied.

What can/do you contribute to the Piece by Piece community?

This is a place with so many people rotating in and out, and I see myself as part of the DNA. The time I've spent here, my uniqueness, my education. I've been very devoted to art for such a long time.





Thanks to Piece by Piece, I have learned to push doubts to the back of my mind and to move forward into new areas of development with learning and security.

Social Enterprise Highlights

The Piece by Piece Social Enterprise had an amazing 2022. The team of 19 artists led by Dawn Mendelson and Luz Mack created over **985 mosaics**, including **5 large scale commissions** and 40 personal commissions/award orders. Participant artists earned over \$130,000 in **supplemental income**, more than any prior year! Much of this was possible thanks to a SAM Initiative grant that funded the addition of our social enterprise Operations Manager, Jadie Delgado.




Metro

LITTLE PIECES **YOUTH WORKSHOPS**

The week of Thanksgiving Piece by Piece hosted our first ever holiday break youth workshop! With support from The Water Buffalo Club, Piece by Piece has launched a series of workshops for children ages 7-18. The free mosaic workshops will be held during breaks and after-school aligning the Los Angles Unified School District (LAUSD) schedule. We have created these classes for students in our South LA community and surrounding areas. We were inspired to do this after finding there were not many free arts enrichment opportunities for local youth during these breaks.

In our first cohort, we welcomed students ranging in age from 7-17 and they all enjoyed the chance to learn about mosaics and create mosaics of their own. Classes were led by Piece by Piece's Artistic & Program Director Dawn Mendelson and Instructor Julie Williams.

The classes had an educational component where the students learned about the history of mosaics. but most of the time was spent creating mosaics, and having fun. One 5th grade student shared, "This is really relaxing and fun. It is helping me feel calm. It's not like school." Students were able to make their own ornaments and frames. They chose their materials, created their designs, and even grouted their pieces to create lasting keepsakes.

Piece by Piece is continuing to offer these classes throughout 2023.

Programs & Workshops

In May of 2022, we were able to welcome participant artists back to in-person classes in our new studio in South LA. It was wonderful to have both returning and new participant artists creating in the studio. We also continued to offer Zoom classes for those who are not able to attend in person. We had **569 seats filled** in our in-person classes and **1600+ views** of our online classes. The visiting artist series also returned to in-person workshops. This program brings renowned mosaic artists from all over the United States to Piece by Piece. These master-artists lead workshops that provide hands-on instruction in advanced mosaic art techniques to program participants.



Return to In-Person Classes

For the first time since COVID, in May we were able to start in-person classes again. Online classes have also continued for those that are not able to attend in person. It is wonderful to have people back in the studio and creating together!



Visiting Artists

The Directed Studies series brings visiting artists to Piece by Piece. These nationally renowned mosaic artists lead workshops that provide hands-on instruction in advanced mosaic art techniques to program participants.



Metamorphosis Art Show & Open House

On June 22, 2022 we welcomed guests for an art show and open house at our new location. Due to the pandemic, this was the first time in over two years that we could celebrate together! It was wonderful to see so many friends and supporters.

LOOKING AHEAD

Our Social Enterprise Is Growing

Building off a successful 2022, the social enterprise is looking to increase the number of paid artists by 25%, allowing us to increase capacity and take on even more commissions.

Supporting More Artists In Classes

Creating more opportunities for healing through art is a key goal for Piece by Piece. In 2023, we are expanding our roster of instructors to accommodate our goal of 30% increase in class attendance.


Adding Resources


