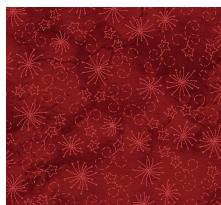

## Fabric Requirements

Fabric 1	10157-R	1/4
Fabric 2	10159-EB	3/8
Fabric 3	10156-EB	1/2
Fabric 4	10153-BE	1/2
Fabric 5	10158-ER	1/8
Fabric 6	10157-E	1-1/8
Fabric 7	10161-B	1/2
Fabric 8	10159-ER	1/2
Fabric 9	10154-B	3/4
Binding	10160-BE	1/2
Blocks	10151-B	3/4
Backing	108" wide	2 yards
	44/45" wide	4 yards

WOF - Width of Fabric  
 LOF - Length of Fabric  
 RST - Right Sides Together  
 HST - Half Square Triangle

## Cutting

Fabric 1  
 (2) 4" x WOF strips. Subcut into:  
 A: (11) 4"x 4" squares

Fabric 2  
 (2) 4" x WOF strips. Subcut into:  
 A: (11) 4"x 4" squares  
 B: (2) 2" x WOF strips.

Fabrics 3, 4  
 (2) 7" x WOF strips. Subcut into:  
 C: (8) 7"x 7" squares

Fabric 5  
 B: (2) 2" x WOF strips.

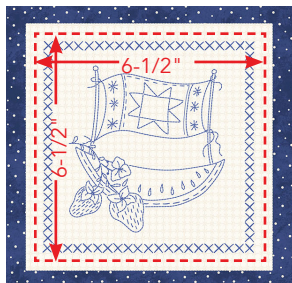
Fabric 6  
 (6) 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut into:  
 D: (71) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

Fabrics 7, 8  
 Cut (7) 2" x WOF strips. Subcut into  
 E: (142) 2" squares

Fabric 9 - Borders  
 Cut (6) 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew into  
 (2) 3-1/2" x 57-1/2" side borders  
 (2) 3-1/2" x 54-1/2" top and bottom borders.

Binding  
 Cut (6) strips 2-1/4" x WOF

Panel Blocks  
 Fussy cut (15) 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" squares



Center and fussy cut 15 blocks,  
 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" keeping an  
 equal 1/4" seam allowance  
 around the x's.



## Summertime Quilt Instructions

Please read all instructions before you begin. Seam allowance is 1/4". Fabric is abbreviated as 'F' - for example, F1 refers to Fabric 1. Press in the direction of arrows.

Use the  check boxes to mark each step as you complete it.

### Small HSTs - 2 at a time

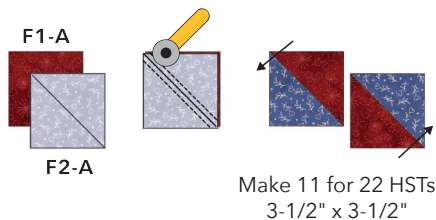
(Half Square Triangles)

Gather the F1 and F2-A squares.

1. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the F2-A squares.

2. Place a F2-A square, RST, on an F1-A square. Sew 1/4" away on either side of the marked line.

3. Cut on the marked line. Press towards F2. Make 11 for a total of 22 HSTs. Trim to 3-1/2" x 3-1/2". There will be one extra.



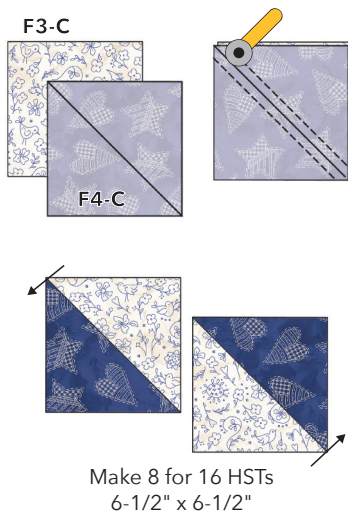
### Large HSTs - 2 at a time

Gather the F3 and F4-C squares.

1. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the F4-C squares.

2. Place a F4-C square, RST, on an F3-C square. Sew 1/4" away on either side of the marked line.

3. Cut on the marked line. Press towards F4. Make 8 for a total of 16 HSTs. Trim to 6-1/2" x 6-1/2". There will be one extra.



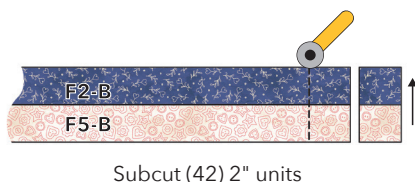
### Four Patch with Strip Sets

Gather the F2-B and F5-B strips.

1. Lay a F2-B strip over a F5-B strip, RST. Sew together. Press toward F2. Make 2.

2. Subcut (42) 2" units.

3. Sew the units together as illustrated into the four patch units. Press open. Make 21.



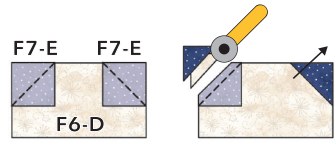

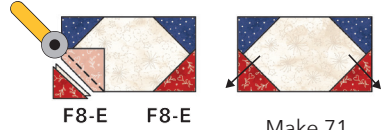
## Double Geese Rectangles

Gather the F6-D rectangles, F7 and F8-E squares.

❑ 1. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the F7 and F8-E squares.



❑ 2. Place a F7-E square, RST, on opposite corners of an F6-D rectangle. Sew on the marked line. Trim the corners 1/4" away from the sewn line. Press toward F7.



❑ 3. Place an F8-E square, RST, on opposite corners of an F6-D rectangle. Sew on the marked line. Trim the corners 1/4" away from the sewn line. Press toward F8. Make 71 double geese rectangles.

Make 71  
3-1/2" x 6-1/2"

**Assemble the Rows** - \*Position the blocks in the direction shown for each row below. Refer to the illustrations on p. 6-7 to see how they all work together.

Gather the Fussy Cut Blocks, Small HSTs, Large HSTs, Four Patch units, and Double Geese rectangles.

❑ Sew the units together into rows as illustrated. Press to nest in direction of arrows.

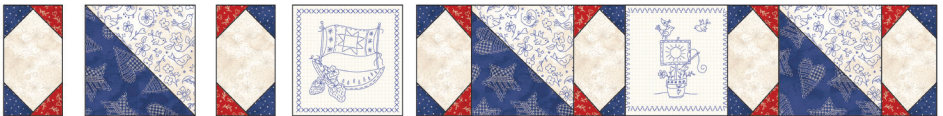
❑ Rows 1, 5, 9, 13 → For each gather: (3) small HSTs, (3) four patches, (5) double geese rectangles.



❑ Rows 3, 7, 11 → For each gather: (3) small HSTs, (3) four patches, (5) double geese rectangles.



❑ Rows 2, 6, 10 ← For each gather: (3) large HSTs, (2) fussy cut blocks, (6) double geese rectangles. \*Follow illustration on p.6 for the blocks used in rows 6 and 10.



❑ Rows 4, 8, 12 ← For each gather: (2) large HSTs, (3) fussy cut blocks, (6) double geese rectangles. \*Follow illustration on p.6 for the blocks used in rows 8 and 12.



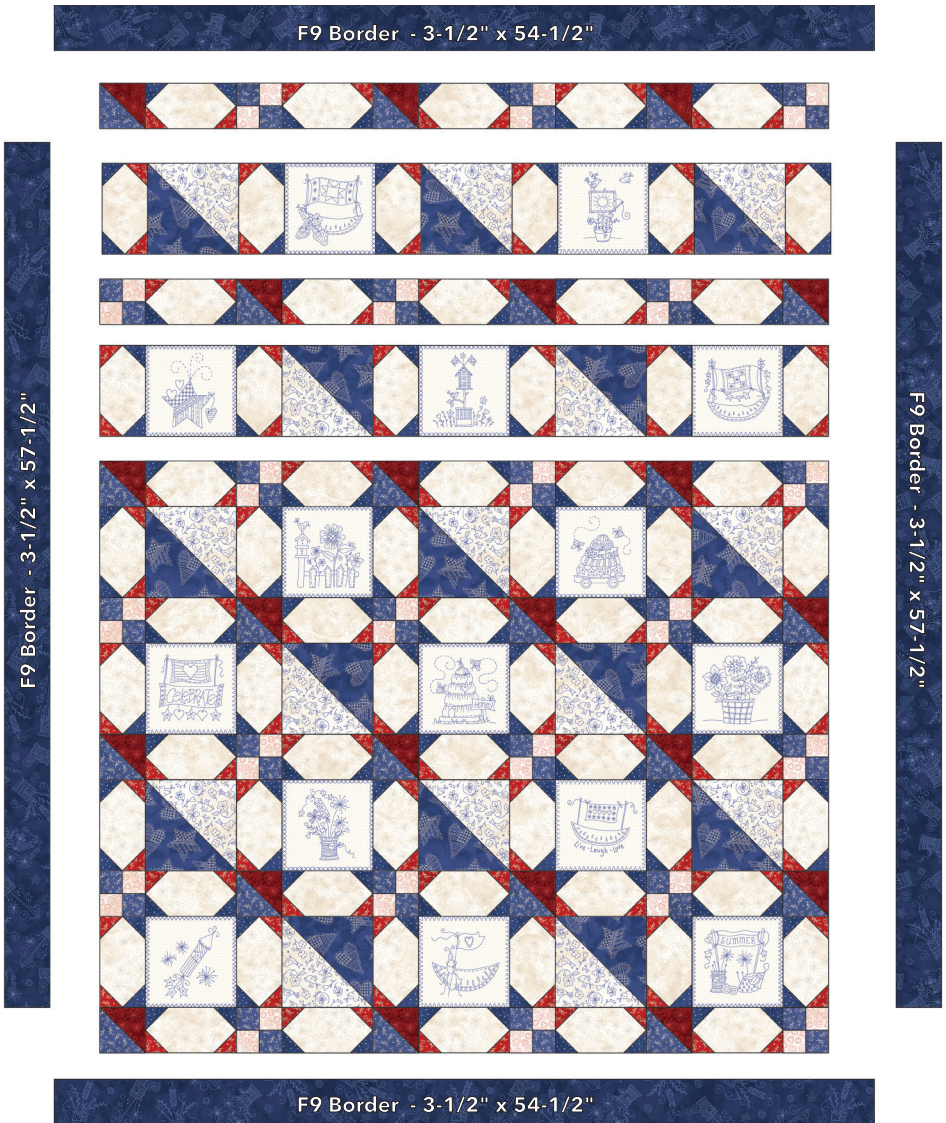
## Quilt Top, Borders, and Finishing

- ❑ 1. Sew row to row. The colors indicate like-rows. Press in one direction.
- ❑ 2. Sew the F9 side borders to the quilt top. Press toward F9.
- ❑ 3. Sew the F9 top and bottom borders to the quilt top. Press toward F9.





- ❑ 4. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and quilt top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess backing and batting.

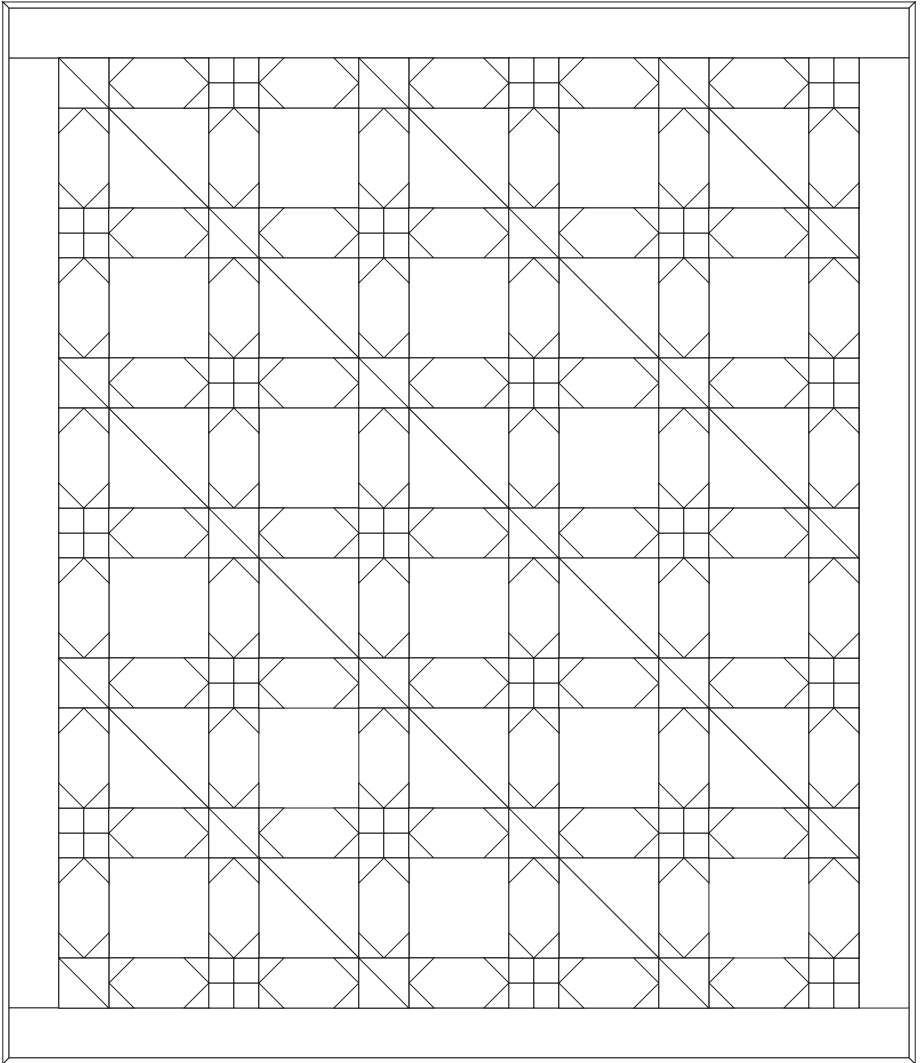


- ❑ 5. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a 1/4" seam allowance. Turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.
