	Department of Education Road Safety Education Officer: Nicole Stiassny				
	Refer to attached slide presentation.				
	The Road Safety Education Officer is a position to support the state TfNSW goal to				
	zero deaths on roads. Design teaching and learning and research based activities				
	for schools and provide support to the expertise that already exists from the				
	teachers in the school. DoE has been working directly with LPS on creating				
	effective connections with external stakeholder groups such as Council, TfNSW,				
	NSW Health etc – as issues arise.				
	LPS has been proactive in making a conscious effort with the program – there has				
	been a meeting arranged with council specifically to talk about safer pathways				
	and support stronger bike culture – looking at starting up a bike program for LPS				
	similar to one run at Miranda North PS.				
	There has also been staff professional learning opportunities – 4 dedicated LPS				
	teachers are attending a TfNSW funded workshop which will be all about new				
	developments for safe active travel to and from school.				
	The strategy's focus is on three main areas 1. Pedestrian safety 2. Passenger				
	safety 3. Safety on wheels. The safety wording and messaging is going to be				
	consistent across all areas – including council, police, school, curriculum etc.				
	Important to note that key message delivery will start in early stage 1				
	kindergarten – not just for older children.				
	Key Takeaways to Note:				
	- Eventually three point turns will be illegal in school zones – process in				
	parliament is underway.				
	- A lot of issues are caused by parents calling their children across the road.

	 State government needs to progress strategies and messages around distractions – i.e. device distractions – formal support material hasn't been developed in this space yet. 			
	 Current guidelines for walking to school is up to age of 8 – holding hands with a parent, ages 8-10 close supervision by an adult, after age 10 – independent travel is possible depending on context. 			
	 Important message for parents is to communicate safe back up plans – what to do if its raining, what to do if parent is late etc. 			
	- Parents should coordinate with the school in the first instance for any school related notifications of issues/problems/concerns to council etc.

	 Still seeking a volunteer to shadow Ngaire to take on uniform shop next year. Doesn't require physical presence every week – just need a coordinator role and there are plenty of volunteers who can support with the onsite requirements. 			
	 Important to note that if a coordinator cannot be found, we are at risk of not having a uniform shop at all next year – will require parents to have to source uniforms and pick up from places like Claudine's in Caringbah. 			
	 Will confirm with Ngaire whether any volunteers have come forward – if not messaging to be sent out re risk of no uniform shop.

	breaking fundraising records – just having a good community event.
	- Cashless discussion – positives are no money counting, no need for atm,
	bank runs, security etc – however it is not simple and easy – token
	systems are difficult for small children, you have to streamline all
	products/services. Getting scouts to help on bbq has saved a spare class
	which can be money counting. Decision to go with cash.
	- Need people to start getting donations for the raffle and chocolate wheel
	 there is a standard email, so will send out and get responses. Need to
	start now, otherwise chocolate wheel wont proceed. Can use the whole
	school to collect.

-	Suzy Newell-Courtney: Great to have road safety officer here – please				
	spread the important message of road safety on class chat pages, we have				
	had near misses at the school recently which has sparked the next level of				
	intervention, esp bike riding and the paths from the park right to the roa				
	– with no crossings etc.				
-	Sarah Mross: Please if you see kids acting unsafe – please let parents				
	know if you can – don't be scared to tell people. Its all about looking out				
	for each others kids as best we can.				
-	Caroline Dean: There have been so many near misses on National Ave,				
	and the school zone should extend past the end of the school, people				
	parking in the drop off area, and made worse in the rain. If there is no				
	space in the queue, parents should just drive past and go around the				
	block and tell your kids that is what you will do.				
-	Suzy: The professional learning mentioned by Nicole is going to be run				
	here onsite at LPS and other schools will attend.				
-	Money and fees – LPS is trying to lower costs where possible, looking at				
	items like camps – we do want kids to experience but it is noted that				
	incidental costs are increasing but we are trying to minimise where				
	possible – like local excursions using public transport, rather than				
	coaches/buses. A good message to get out to the community is get your				
	child an opal card for these occasions.				
-	Preliminary Naplan results are out – just proficiency levels – the new				
	categories are: additional support required, developing, strong, and				
	exceeding, its an important message for parents that we have gone from				
	a 5 point scale to a 4 point scale – you can be classed as "developing" bu				
	only 1 point off "strong" – so keep in mind the terminology is challenging				
	and that Naplan is just one assessment, one snapshot in time – all other				
	assessments held in class guide what the students need.				
-	Anzac ceremony was held – was a really nice day with a special guest – a				
	grandfather who spoke to the kids				
-	Tenille Warrington: advised feedback she received from attendees was				
	that the kids behaviour was exceptional during the ceremony				
-	Suzy: First kindy parent 2025 information session – led by school leaders				
	who did a fabulous job and thanks to Sarah Mross for attending and				
	presenting. Tell your neighbours and any parents you know who may				
	need to enrol so the school can plan ahead.


Parents and carers are responsible for deciding the safest way for their child to get to and from school.
