3. Getting started

Remove the Back Cover

Open the battery cover carefully by prising open from the bottom right corner where you will find a small notch.

Install the SIM card and battery

For availability and information about using SIM card services, contact your SIM card vendor. This may be the service provider, network operator, or other vendor. Note: The SIM card and its contacts are easily

damaged by scratches or bending, so please be careful when handling, inserting, or removing the card.

Note: Keep all SIM cards out of the reach of small children.

- 1. Ensure the phone is switched off and the charger is disconnected before removing the battery.
- 2. With the back cover removed, install the SIM card by sliding it into the nest under the metal holding plate. Ensure the angled corner is on the lower right hand side. (To remove the SIM card, gently press on it and slide it out of its nest.) Please note you can only use a Nano SIM card and not a Micro or Standard SIM. You can also install a micro SD memory card into the slot beside the SIM slot.
- 3. Install the battery into the battery slot, ensuring that the three metallic stripes on the battery align with the three metallic prongs in the battery
- 4. Put on the battery cover. Ensure the cover is completely closed and the matching sound (click) could be heard.
- 5. Plug the phone in to charge.

To turn the phone on, press and hold the red end key until the screen

If you switch on the mobile phone before inserting the SIM card, it prompts you to insert the SIM card. The mobile phone checks whether the SIM card is valid automatically after it is inserted. When you first switch on your phone it will ask you to set the language. The following prompts appear on the screen in sequence when the mobile phone is just switching on:

- Input phone password If the password of the phone has been set.
- Input PIN If the password of the SIM card has been set. • Searching - The mobile phone is searching for available network.

Turning the Phone Off

To turn the phone off, press and hold the red key until the screen turns blank.

Charging the Battery

The battery can be charged when the phone is either on or off. Please ensure the battery is inserted into the phone before charging. The charging time is three hours.

To connect the charger:

- 1. Insert the cord into its port on the bottom panel of the phone
- 2. Plug the other end of the cable into either a computer USB socket or use any USB mains charger that runs at 240V.
- To disconnect the charger: 1. Unplug the wall charger.
- 2. Remove the cord from the phone.

Charging Using the Docking Charger

- You can also use the docking charger for easy charging. 1. Simply plug the charger into the back of the dock.
- Place the phone into the dock to start charging.
- Remove the phone when charging is complete. Please note: the dock charger is sold separately.

Low Battery Alert

The phone will sound an alert when the battery is low and display a message of low battery on the screen.
PLEASE NOTE: The TTfone TT760 does not come with a charger,

- Other options include Send, Insert template, Add contact, Add emoji and Save as draft. You can also access a stored message in inbox and reply to it. By selecting the Inbox instead of Write Message and following the same commands.

Receiving/Reply to a Message

When you receive a new text message, your phone will display an envelope icon and "New Message".

1. Press the Left soft key to read the message.

2. Press the Left Soft key again to see a list of available commands such as "Delete", Reply" etc..

Letters and Numbers Input

Text Message Letters

English letters are set on number keys from "2" to "9". You can input numbers, upper or lower case letters and punctuation symbols. Pressing the hash key while typing lets you switch between the different types of input modes. Each number key is set for three or four letters. Press the number key one time to display the first letter, two times to display the second letter, etc.

Text Message Punctuation

To enter punctuation:

- 1. Press the * star key to display the list of punctuation symbols 2. Use the navigation key to scroll through the list.
- 3. Press the Left Soft key to select.

Text Message Numbers

- To enter a number instead of a letter:
- Press the # key to switch input mode from letter to numerical and then use number keys from 1 to 0 to enter numbers.
- 2. Press # again to switch back to letter input mode.
- To enter a space, press the "0" key when in letter mode. **Security Inbox**

The default password is 1234. To change the password go to Message/Security inbox/Options/Change password

6. Contacts

Storing, Searching and Deleting Numbers in the Phone Book Phone numbers can be stored on the phone or the SIM card. The green icon indicates that the contact is saved in the phone. The yellow SIM card symbol indicates that the contact is saved on the SIM card. You can store up to 500 entries in the phone memory.

To Add a New Contact to the Phone Book

- Press the Left soft key to access the menu. Select Contacts and press the left soft key.
- Press the Left soft key to select Options.
- Select Add new contact and press the left soft key.
- Choose either to save to Phone memory or to SIM memory using the up an down navigation key. Press the Left soft key.
- Press the middle navigation key to enter the name of the contact by using the number keypad. Press a key 1 to 4 times to enter the correct letter. press "0" for a space.
- Once the name is set press the Left soft key to save the name.
- Press the Down navigation key to select number, press the middle navigation key to edit. Enter the number by using the number keypad, press the Left soft key to save the number.
- 9. Press the Left soft key to Save.

To Search for an Existing Contact

- Press the Left soft key to access the menu. Select Contacts and press the left soft key.
- Press Up or Down navigation key to search for the contact. Press the Left Soft key. Select Call and press the left soft key.

7. Call logs

This option stores recently dialled calls, received calls and missed calls. Your phone can store up to 20 records for each function. 1. Press the Left Soft key to access the menu.

- Choose Call logs and press the left soft key. Scroll through available functions (missed calls, dialled calls, received calls, rejected calls, delete all and call timers). Press the Left Soft key to select the desired function.

8. Multimedia

Camera

Navigate to Menu/Camera to open up the Camera App. Use the Middle Navigation key to take pictures and the Left Soft key to enter the options menu.

More options - to switch to Video recorder, to use flash, adjust image size, activate night mode, adjust brightness, contrast and exposure, set the white balance, the timer and the effects. Image viewer - to see the pictures you have taken. Settings - to set the quality of the photo, adjust the shutter sound

and choose storage options. Please Note: you will need to insert a MicroSD memory card in order to store the photos this is sold separately and available on

Video Recorder

- Press the Left Soft key to access the menu.

Press the Middle Navigation key to start/pause recording and press the left soft key to stop the recording (please note you may need a memory card inserted this is not included and can be purchased separately from www.ttfone.com). Press the Left Soft key to enter the option menu.

Calculator

Phone can provide basic calculator functions: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

- Press the Left soft key to access the menu.
- Select Apps and press the left soft key. Press Up or Down navigation key until "Calculator" appears. Press the Left soft key. Enter number keys to enter values. Use the * key for decimal. Use the navigation key to select the math operation: +,-,x and ÷.
- Press the right soft key to clear the last digit or to exit the operation. Press the middle navigation key to complete the operation.

To view the calendar please go to Menu/Apps/Calendar. Press the left soft key for Options to add new schedule or view schedule.

You can set up up to three alarms in Menu/Apps/Alarm. Press the middle navigation key to enter to editing mode. In edit mode, you can choose a different alarm tone, change the time and set repeat options.

Turning off the Alarm

- Press the Left Soft key to shut off the alarm
- Press the Right Soft key to snooze.

- Shortcut Settings to set the shortcut menu for the navigation keys.
- Auto Power On/Off to set desired time schedule for power On
- Power saving mode a tool that helps you extend the battery life of your device.
- Restore Factory Settings to restore the default settings settings, use password 0000.

Display

- 1. Wallpaper to set desired wallpaper background for the screen. Idle display settings - to set your display settings when keypad is
- Brightness to set the screen brightness of the display. Use the left and right navigation keys to decrease and increase the contrast.
- Backlight - to set the screen backlight time
- Keypad backlight time to set the keypad backlight time.

Security Settings

This is to prevent your mobile phone from illegal use. You can set SIM or PIN security as ON/OFF in Settings/Security Settings/Sim lock. PIN can be obtained from your network provider. You can also set Phone Lock as ON/OFF in Settings/SecuritySettings/Phone Lock

NOTE: The default phone lock password is 0000. Please change into your own private password as soon as possible. Screen Auto Lock - to set time for automatic screen timeout and keypad lock

Key vibrate switch

Key vibrate determines when a press is registered without looking at the actual display. It also improves the accuracy of keypad typing. To switch on/off the vibration of the keys please go to Settings/Key vibrate switch.

Voice dial When you press a number to dial, the phone speaks the number

you pressed. To switch on/off the voice dial function please go to Settings/Voice dial. You can also adjust the volume to your liking. **Speed Dial**

1. Press the Left soft key to access the menu. Press Up or Down navigation key until Settings appears. Press the Left soft key.

- 3. Press Up or Down navigation key until "FM radio" appears. Press the Left Soft key.
- Press the middle navigation key to play or pause the FM radio. Press left and right navigation key to change station.

Headphones act as an aerial so you will get better reception when they are plugged in.

9. SOS Menu

SOS Emergency Button

Important Notice: Wireless phones, including this device, operate using radio signals, wireless networks, landline networks, and userprogrammed functions. Because of this, connections in all conditions and/or locations cannot be guaranteed. You should never rely solely on any wireless device for medical emergency communication. You can set the emergency numbers in the phone book according to your requirements; you can set a total of up to five emergency numbers. In case of an emergency, when the SOS button is pushed down the phone will automatically send a text message to the first emergency number set up on the phone. The mobile phone will then make the emergency call. If the first call fails, the phone will proceed to dialling the second emergency number. In this manner the phone will circulate the emergency contact numbers in order to receive an answer. The phone will also sound an alarm when an emergency call

Please note: If one of the emergency numbers has a voicemail system, the phone will assume that the call has been answered and will no longer call any more of the emergency numbers.

To activate the SOS function, first add at least one SOS number then switch SOS status to "ON"

Attention! The Emergency SOS button will only make calls if:

- 1. A SIM card is in the mobile.
- There is at least one SOS number programmed.
- 3. There is a SOS text message saved.

My files

You can manage and organise any file stored on your device. Please go to Menu/Apps/My Files and choose either the Phone memory or the Memory card (Micro SD card). Press the left soft key to access the submenus to view or play multimedia files.

Bluetooth

The mobile phone supports Bluetooth function. You can use Bluetooth wireless technology to set wireless connection with other compatible devices, including mobile phones, computers, headsets, in-car accessories etc. With Bluetooth function, you can send photos, video segments, audio segments, personal business card and memos. You can also establish wireless connection with a compatible PC to transmit files.

Try to keep the two devices you are connecting comthrough Bluetooth close together while they are in use. Most Bluetooth headsets have a range of 10 meters. If possible, try to keep your phone on a chair beside you or nearby while talking on your headset to ensure the best connection. When using your computer, try putting your phone on the desk beside your monitor to ensure the best connection possible.

Pair Bluetooth Devices

Have one of the devices "search for new devices" to find the other. Typically you want a phone to search for your headset or audio speaker rather than the other way around. The Search function is located within the Bluetooth menu in your phone.

- Press the Left Soft key to access the menu. Press Up or Down navigation key until Apps appears. Press the
- left soft key. Press Up or Down navigation key until "Bluetooth" appears. Press the Left Soft key.

Once your phone finds the other device enter the "pairing code" for the device to link the two together. The pairing code is typically located on a sticker on the back of a headset or in the instruction

book for a device.

2. Select Speed dial and press the left soft key.

Scroll up and down and select Number list. You can set the phone numbers to the desired number keys. Press left soft key for Options and select Edit and type the number manually or press the Left soft key to select contacts from Phonebook.

Indication LED

The indication lights lets you identify if you have an unread message, a missed call and an incoming call. You can disable the indication lights in Settings/Indication LED.

Flight mode

When activated, this mode suspends the device's radio-frequency signal transmission technologies, effectively disabling the device from sending or receiving calls, text messages and data services. You can activate/deactivate Flight mode in Settings/Flight mode.

To view the SOS status go to SOS Menu/Status. Press Up or Down navigation key to choose either ON and OFF. Press the Left soft key

- Repeat process to add 4 other emergency contacts.

When the SOS function is activated the phone can send out an emergency SMS.

To Edit the SOS Message:

- Press Up or Down navigation key to choose "SOS SMS" appears. Press the Left soft key.

To activate SOS Ring Alert

When the SOS function is activated the phone can sound a loud Siren alarm to alert people nearby to a problem. To activate or deactivate the Siren, press up or down navigation key and select SOS Ring Alert and press left soft key to activate or deactivate SOS

To activate SOS LED Alert

When the SOS function is activated the phone's torch will flash a light to draw attention of the people. To activate or deactivate the LED Alert, press up or down navigation key and select SOS LED Alert and press left soft key to activate or deactivate SOS LED Alert.

11. Sound Profiles

You can use profiles to set and customise the ring tones, message alert tones, and other tones for different events.

- 1. Press the Left soft key to access the menu.
- Select Sound Profiles and press the left soft key. Use the Up or Down navigation key to select from the following profiles: Normal, Silent, Meeting.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR of the device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station, the lower the power output of the device. SAR values may vary depending on national reporting and testing requirements and the network band. Use of device accessories and enhancements may result in different SAR values. The SAR limit for mobile devices used by the public is 2.0 w/kg (watts per kilogram) averaged over 10 grams of body tissue. The guidelines incorporate a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements. The highest SAR Value - 1.004 w/kg.
