# **LESSON SEVENTY-ONE:** Singular and Plural Words

The poem you copied yesterday was about an <u>owl</u>. The picture from the other day was of several <u>owls</u>. What is the difference in these two underlined words? One is *singular*, while the other is *plural*. The word, "singular", means "single", or one. The word, "owl" is therefore a *singular* word, while the word, "owls", meaning more than one owl, is a *plural* word.
