Our 2020-2021 year was a year of challenge, change, and ultimately, purpose.

Never has our purpose been so clear. We are here to bridge the meal gap in the lives of the children we serve, and empower them to get the most out of their education. Above all else, this is what matters to us as an organization. Staying focused on our mission and delivering to the children who need us. This is what has kept us on track throughout this unique year.

This year presented distractions and obstacles at every turn, but the team at Food For Thought remained determined.

While we are all living in the time of a pandemic, the impacts are not equal. Logistically, the pandemic has created an increase in food costs and a decrease in food availability with widespread supply chain issues. Understandably, the pandemic decreased our volunteer force creating a need for creative solutions to improve our capacity to move food and serve children. The pandemic impacted the health of our staff and board just as it impacted your circle of family, friends, and co-workers. We worked longer hours with less support, like many of you.

But for the children we serve, the food insecure, the families living on the margins, the pandemic caused a series of severe housing, income, and transportation issues. Add to that rising costs of groceries, fuel, and rent, and the children we serve continue to feel the grip of the pandemic.

The support you have provided this year as donors and volunteers has empowered us to show up and meet the needs of the community. We have bridged the meal gap and given hope to thousands of children. Never has your support been more needed and never have I seen more grateful children for the food they receive.


Food Insecurity

Our goal is to return to 100% backpack delivery to all our 34 partner schools, while continuing to serve as the leading voice in our community for food insecurity awareness.


We are certain that each day we, along with our volunteers, work to support our mission.
