Winter in India bid farewell to the otherwise scorching summer heat and supplant the country with a pleasant realm of fun & frolic. More cool translates into more fun for you and your loved ones.

The World's most beloved cultural hot spot- India has a diverse religious diversity that too adds to the richness of its culture. A Variety of school of thoughts & traditions combine to give birth to a list of vibrant & colourful festivals.

Some of the Winter Festivals :-

➤ Christmas: Christmas in India is celebrated throughout the length & breadth of the country. Christmas in India symbolizes integrity in diversity and in one of the more popular winter festival in the country.

Mount Abu Winter Festival: Rajasthan's only hill station; Mount Abu, is the host to the famous Mount Abu winter festival. Three days Carnival showcases traditional dances, folk music, concerts, fire works display, fairs much more from different state of India – shows a true colour spirit of Rajasthanis'.

- ➤ Rann Mahotsav: One of the largest salt deserts, Rann of Kutch in Gujarat, witnesses a three month long fair which features an array of attractions. The fair is host to visitors from around the world. The Carnival is the host to lipsmacking local cuisine, enchanting handicraft items, spell-binding cultural performances, riveting adventure sports & much more. What else could you ask for!!
- ➤ Makar Sankranti: Also known as 'Uttarayan Sankranti'. This festival marks the synchronization of the Lunar & Solar calendars and is believed to be most important harvest days in India. This festival merges celebration with charitable nature of the people. While this day witness a grand fair and festivities being held at the Ganga Sagar with millions of devotees taking the holy dip in the Ganga. This is an auspicious day for giving Alms (DAAN). Edibles made of Sesame seed (in Hindi TIL) are donated liberally. Giving of uncooked lentils and rice called "Kichadi" in local parlance is also held very meritorious.
- ➤ **Kite Festival, Gujarat**: A part of the Uttarayan or Makar Sankranti, Gujarat's International Kite Festival is one of the biggest festivals of the state. Held on the 14th to 15thJanuary every year, this festival is celebrated by the people who indulge in a state-wide kite flying competition. **The Skies of Gujarat are peppered with variegated kites of different shapes and sizes, as every member of each family is caught up in a friendly yet highly exciting game of kite flying.**
- ➤ Lohri, Punjab: Another derivative of the Makar Sankranti or harvest festival, Lohri is a festival of Punjab that is celebrated with a bonfire and marks the shortest day and important harvest day of the year. Celebrated widely all across Northern India the festival involves delicious Punjabi food like Sarson da Saag and folk dance performed by all the members of the community limitless Punjabiness! The weather is pleasant and the cold begins to recede. Chak De Phatte!
- ➤ **Pongal**, **Tamil Nadu**: While Makar Sankranti and Lohri are celebrated across northern and eastern India, Pongal is a harvest festival celebrated in Southern India, specifically Tamil Nadu, in honour of the Sun and Rain Gods as a mark of gratitude for the abundance of paddy crops harvested by the farmers during the winter months. Pongal is a four day festival usually celebrated in mid-January with offerings being made to different Gods through a variety of events and dishes being made.
- ➤ Magh Bihu Festival: Magh Bihu commonly known as Bhogali Bihu is also a harvest festival and one among the three Bihu celebrations conducted in the East Indian state of Assam. The festival is similar to Punjab's Lohri as this is too a festival marked with bonfires, folk dances and delicious local food like Til Pitha, Laru and Sunga Pitha additionally, the celebrations also involves games and events like the tekeli bhonga and buffalo fighting.

- ➤ Carnival festivals, Goa: Also known as the Festival of Goa this festival is celebrated generally in the month of February and is one of the most renowned celebrations of the state. The three day festival showcases the fun and colourful nature endemic to Goa as a great carnival is carried out with good music, great food, lots of entertainment ended with a pinch of hangover from all the merrymaking.
- ➤ Winter Carnival, Manali: Another wonderful carnival celebration of India but this time carried out in the picturesque land of Manali, Himachal Pradesh, this festival can be enjoyed by visitors of any age or background. The carnival is celebrated with numerous events like folk dances, winter sports and the charming sights of quaint Manali.
- ➤ Camel Festival, Bikaner, Rajasthan: The Camel Festival is a lively and colourful event organized in Bikaner by the Rajasthan Tourism, every year in the month of January. Folk dances, Music, Art and Culture plus spectacle of unusual camel performances: camel races, camel dances, and the bumpy, neck shaking camel rides are the major attraction of the Camel Festival Bikaner.
- ➤ Jaisalmer Desert Festival: The Jaisalmer Desert Festival is a wonderful opportunity to experience the golden city of Jaisalmer and surroundings in the desert of Thar. Camel Parad, fancily dressed, camel polo, camel races and life and culture of the desert, followed by music and dance performances are the activities are the top attractions and Places to visit in Jaisalmer.
- ➤ Vasant Panchami: Vasant is said to be the prince of all seasons when the whole nature swoons in ecstasy. Vasant Panchami or Sri Panchami is celebrated on the fifth day of Magha (Jan-Feb). This day is specially dedicated to Saraswati—the Goddess of learning, wisdom & fine arts.

On this day, robes, yellow in color are traditionally worn in northern India, taking clue from the fields wearing a mustard flower 'brilliant color — signifies maturity & ripeness and in Eastern India, White color dress are traditionally worn — dedicated to Goddess Saraswati. The 'Prasadam' for the Goddess Saraswati varies from community to community. Some have "BER" — a kind of plume that is found in abundance in North/East India and "Sangari" — a kind of bean that grows in the root of the radish plant are offered as Prasadams. Along with these two, some "Burfi" sweet which are yellow in color and marigolds are placed on a "Thali" in front of deity. Pen, notebooks and pencils are placed near the Goddess feet to be blessed before they are used by the students. Many familes mark this day with babies near the Goddess fet, encouraging their children to write their first word with their fingers.

People in Punjab fly kites on this day to mark the auspicious beginning to all good work. They call it the **BASANT FESTIVAL of Kites.**

Winter in India promise a lot of fun and enthusiasm. All these festivals have their own USP and the climate during winters allows you to embrace the vast & wondrous cultural diversity of India.

Combine Winter with festivities and you have a memory that will never fade away!



So Reservation Policy also should change....

In the present context, Reservation should be purely made on the basis of economical condition of the applicant viewing his/her Merit/talent. If applicant has Merit but can't afford fees then only he/she should get Reservation benefit without viewing caste, religion and region- ONLY MERIT BASIS. Then & then only, our education system will improve from Grass root level (Primary Level). Students will take utmost care while studying and gain knowledge which not only will help India to get SUPER BRAIN but also grow its economy enormously.
