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MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD



The holiday season is fast approaching, and we might be busier than usual. Let's hope we can slow down enough to enjoy this time of the year. Your CC Board of Trustees sincerely wishes everyone in our Community a happy, healthy, and safe holiday season.

In the past month, the Board has addressed these and other issues:

- The 2025 Operating Budget The Board is pleased to announce that the 2025 Operating Budget has been finalized and accepted by the Board. The chief takeaway is that the Cranberry Creek HOA Maintenance Fee will remain the same at \$170 a month. Members of the Finance Committee, Corner Property Management, and the Board worked intensely on developing the budget. The 2025 Operating Budget will be formally approved at the next Open Board Meeting. In Other News below, read what might have impacted next year's Budget.
- Second Fall Cleanup The Board is working with Fresh Cut to determine the best time for the additional cleanup. The snow pole markers should soon be put in place (if not already), and Fresh Cut's snow removal equipment will be parked and ready on our premises. Please read the 2024-2025 Snow Removal Procedures in this Chatter.
- Clubhouse Landscaping Hopefully by now, all residents have had a chance to see the new fresh
 landscaping in front of the Clubhouse. After twenty+ years of growth, the large overgrown hedges have
 been removed and new shrubbery has been planted. Several Board members, along with the Garden
 Committee, specifically Lorrie Meier and Bill Van Der Vort, worked together to renew the landscaping.
- Annual Clubhouse Fire Inspection Following the annual fire inspection in November, the Board was
 informed of several items needing maintenance. The Clubhouse fire extinguishers were going to pass their
 "usable life" date, so they were replaced as needed. Also, Building and Grounds replaced two rechargeable
 batteries for the emergency lighting in the Clubhouse.

Other news: The NJ Structural Integrity Bill

Earlier this year, New Jersey passed the **Structural Integrity Bill**. This bill was passed in response to the tragic collapse of the Champlain Towers in Florida back in June of 2021. The Structural Integrity Bill imposes new requirements on community associations concerning structural inspections and reserve studies. **Per our discussion with our engineering consultant, the structural inspections section of the bill does not impact our Clubhouse or Community**. Single-family homes and low-rise, wood-framed construction are not included within the scope of the law's structural inspection requirements.

However, the part of the Structural Integrity Bill that does impact our Community is that part requiring associations to update and fund their reserve studies. If *more than five years have passed* since an association's last reserve study, an updated study must be obtained within one year. Associations with reserve studies performed within the last five years must obtain an updated study within five years from the previous study. Cranberry Creek HOA had Becht Engineering perform a complete Capital Reserve Study last year.

In addition, the bill states that if a Capital Reserve shortfall is identified through an updated study, associations must immediately begin making up for the deficiency through increases in dues and other budgeting methods. This year, the Board requested Becht to execute a minor update to the report (updated interest rate received) which benefitted the community. Our Community is fortunate that our past and present Boards have worked to contribute to the Cranberry Creek Capital Reserve account thereby rendering it adequately funded. No increase in HOA fees is required to fulfill the requirements of this new bill.

The financials as of September 30th, 2024 were \$2,404,268.19

The Board once again wishes every resident and their family a very happy holiday! Stay well and safe.

SNOW REMOVAL PROCEDURES 2024/2025

Contractor: Fresh Cut Landscape Management

Snow removal services will be conducted for any snowstorm for which accumulation is expected to exceed two (2) inches.

Snow and ice control activities shall commence upon notification by Association Representative.

- * For an impending snowstorm, please **remove all cars from streets** to facilitate snow removal. Fresh Cut is **not** responsible for cleaning off cars or the clearing of snow left from homeowners cleaning off their cars.
- Clearing of driveways and walks will not begin until snowfall has stopped.
- * Snow amounts of 8" or less should be cleared within 12 hours of storm's end.
- * Snow is removed from driveways, parking areas, fire hydrants and sidewalks. Common sidewalks will be the last to be done.

Updates will be available on the Hotline 609-296-2300.

Please do not drive around looking for Fresh Cut as it hinders them from doing their job. Please do not physically get in the way of Fresh Cut plows as they work to clear our Community.

All complaints need to be **in writing**. Forms are available outside the Association Office door.

Snow fall will be determined by the NOAA Snow Report.

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
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RED HAT DIVAS

Red Hat Jersey Girls Submitted by Jane Innocenti



Thank you, Diane and Gerry, for selecting this venue.





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
Sudoku Puzzle

Sudoku requires no calculation or arithmetic skills. It is essentially a game of placing numbers in squares, using very simple rules of logic and deduction.

The objective of the game is to fill all the blank squares in a game with the correct numbers. There are three very simple constraints to follow. In a 9 by 9 square Sudoku game:

- Every row of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every column of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every 3 by 3 subsection of the 9 by 9 square must include all digits 1 through 9

Every Sudoku game begins with a number of squares already filled in, and the difficulty of each game is largely a function of how many squares are filled in. The more squares that are known, the easier it is to figure out which numbers go in the open squares. As you fill in squares correctly, options for the remaining squares are narrowed and it becomes easier to fill them in.



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
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Ordinary Grace by William Kent Krueger A Simon and Schuster Review



Summers were pretty quiet for me growing up in the village of Waldorf in rural south-central Minnesota, population 283. Every Sunday my family went to church, and a trip to the town's tiny grocery store meant riding my bike two blocks. I have fond memories of navigating the railroad tracks on the edge of town with my cousin Debbie as we looked for the perfect agate, or going down to Little Cobb Creek where I would collect water bugs and an occasional crayfish. The summer heat was broken by an occasional thunderstorm and the warm evening breezes sometimes brought the sweet scent of freshly cut alfalfa into town from a nearby farm. Life in a small town may sound quaint and idyllic, but of course it was never perfect, and as with all of life, there often can be a dark side to the good.

William Kent Krueger's gripping book, *Ordinary Grace*, places on full display the dark side of the fictional town of New Bremen, Minnesota. New Bremen is located in the Minnesota River Valley, not too far from where I grew up. It is the summer of 1961—a time of excitement with a new young president and the Twins baseball franchise making its debut in Minnesota. Thirteen-year-old Frank Drum is expecting to have a fine summer doing the things he loves to do—visiting the soda counter, reading comic books, walking along the river with his little brother, and mowing lawns to earn some extra money. When calamity hits, Frank's summer turns ugly. Yet he is able to bravely and with budding maturity, confront tragic deaths, scandal, human frailty, and his own limitations
