2. Mentoring:

The mentorship framework connects Torres Strait Islander students with seasoned researchers and supports from AIATSIS, fostering growth and understanding.

3. Capacity Building:

Targeted capacity-building strategies empower Torres Strait Islanders with analytical tools to decode archival insights, building a bridge between heritage and contemporary understanding.

4. Disseminating Findings:

The Fellowship's impact extends back home to the Fellow's community and beyond to the world. Ilan Style and AIATSIS will collaborate to ensure that the Fellows' discoveries reach a wide audience, contributing to the collective knowledge tapestry of Torres Strait Islander culture, history, and heritage.
