- This Quick Placement Assessment is 100% aligned to the 60 books in the Hello Decodable Library with phonics introduced sequentially on the Scope & Sequence (page 7)
- It is meant to be a guick assessment to know immediately and without a lot of fuss and calculating about where to initially place students when grouping students into phonics skills groups (vs. a running record which will give you a student's reading level, this is not that.) This tells you the highest level of phonics knowledge a student knows (and can decode) and places them in the group where they score 80% or higher, meaning they can decode 80% or more of the words in the sentence. If the decoding is very labored and sound by sound, that should factor in because that is not fluent decoding, stop them if they continue decoding in this way and place them in the group where they weren't reading like that.
- It should be administered individually, one on one. And an optional Teacher Scoring Sheet is included if you choose to use it per child. It will take you between 30-45 minutes to administer this to your whole class
- You will read the script in the gray box and discontinue the assessment once a child cannot read a sentence or two and score 80% or higher. For example, if a student reads 100% on Sentence #2 but only 9 in Sentence #3...place them in Group #3. Your groups will be formed once all your students have been placed in a group based on their score. When in doubt, place students in the lower group if you are unsure.

*This assessment may also be used as an Encoding Assessment for any student who can read all 12 sentences at 80% or better, with little effort or struggle to decode because that only means they can read, it doesn't mean they can spell these 107 phonics patterns.

Phonics Skil, Nov What?

- Recognize that grouping students by phonics skill is not the same as grouping students by reading level (grouping students by reading level is called Guided Reading). This is different because the focus of small group instruction will be phonics & phonemic awareness, and it should include reading, in case you were wondering! Read #2.
- 2. Purchase my PDF decodables that are 100% aligned to this assessment. If you don't want to buy the bundle, you can purchase the pink, orange and yellow sets of 20 each separately, in my TpT store, Hello Literacy or go directly to bit.ly/helloSoRresources. Or, you can purchase the books already printed on my website www.hellodecodables.com
- 3. You will print the books you need for the groups you have. Make enough copies for each child to have their own book in their own hand. Make one copy of the TAKE AWAY page to send home, put into a literacy center or the student's individual book bin.

If you have students that place out of the assessment, and their fluency is on grade level, that means either, they are ready to read any text and start them in Level I or J leveled text and resume Guided Reading. Or it means, they can decode but they cannot spell. If you suspect your student cannot spell the words on the assessment, give them the assessment as a Dictation Test.

If you have students who do not pass Sentence I, place them into Pink I Group, as they will begin with learning short a and i vowels and consonants c p d t m s f n for 5 lessons or 15 days.


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
