Change from Vagueness to specification:

Because writers need to be more specific and must avoid vagueness and generalization in the text.

For instance, the common cliche "at wit's end" is vague because it does not specify what is wit's end? Or what is its start? maybe it was used in a humorous way?

All these ambiguities come to this one line because of the vagueness. A good writer must avoid vagueness in order to clearly convey the message to the audience.

Avoid character Cliches:

As there are different ways through which a writer may fall for the cliches and end up being a vulnerable writer. One is character cliché.

Let me tell you what happens in this cliché. The writer intends to borrow the characters of the story from conventional stories.

For instance, in the previous, the story mainly has a hero, heroine, and villain. The same concept of characters could be seen in today's writings as well.

This cliché does impact the audience because they feel weary reading the same things with the same characters again and again.
