"Jack o'lantern" comes from the Irish legend of Stringy Jack. Legend has it that Stringy Jack invited the devil to have a drink with him, but Jack didn't want to pay for the drink, so he convinced the devil to turn himself into a coin. Instead of buying the drink, he pocketed the coin and kept it close to a silver cross in his house, preventing the devil from taking shape again.

Jack promised to let the devil go as long as he would leave Jack alone for a year – and if Jack died, the devil wouldn't claim his soul.

After a year, Jack tricked the devil again

to leave him alone and not claim his soul. When Jack died, God didn't want such a conniving person in heaven and the devil, true to his word, would not allow him into hell.

Jack was sent off into the night with only a burning coal to light his path. They placed the coal inside a carved-out turnip and Jack has been roaming the earth ever since.

This Month's Safety Tip

Halloween Safety


Children love Halloween because of the costumes and treats. But the holiday also brings serious safety risks. Kids are twice as likely to be hit by a car on Halloween as they are other nights of the year. Follow these safety tips to keep your kids safe!

Costume: 1) Choose bright colors and flame-retardant materials for costumes so that children can be seen by car headlights. 2) Attach reflective tape to his/her costume or treat bag. 3) Make sure the costume is the right size for your child to help eliminate tripping.

Masks: A mask can obstruct your child's vision, especially if it slips out of place. Skip the mask and use nontoxic makeup instead.

Treats: Don't let your child snack while he/she is trick-or-treating. Feed your child an early meal before heading out and inspect the treats before your child eats them. Discard anything that's not sealed, has torn packaging or looks questionable. If you have young children, weed out the gum, peanuts, hard candies, and other choking hazards.
