In 2023, over 5 families relocated to Maai Mahiu to access our services and 14 more referred other parents for their kids.



#### 2023 WATER PROSECT

The water got to Ubuntu Campus on 30th September 2023. CWC has our own borehole and a source of water that we can call our own! Thanks to Rees Jones Foundation we secured a plot of land and began drilling.

Over 150 men and women were engaged in digging the trench from the land to the campus for 21 days across 11 kilometers. Campus recieves 96000 Liters a day, all pumps operate by solar power. This steady stream of water rejuvenized our farming project. Our 2024 goal is adding a purification system.

## THE YBUNTU LIFE FOUNDATION SCHOOL



The 22,000-square-foot building sits on 11 acres in Maai Mahiu, next to our Maker Studio and the Cafe Ubuntu. The enhanced school wing boasts 9 large classrooms, cafeteria, OT center, toilet block and playground. Our clinic upgrade now offers Ubuntu families an on-site pharmacy and nutritionist, increased exam rooms, and dedicated space for community health education.

The Ubuntu Life Foundation School specializes in ages 2-18 with special needs. We currently have 5 teachers and 4 caregivers on staff full time.

2023 began with 58 students enrolled and by December there were 69 in the program. In only one year, nearly a dozen more kids now receive the education and social interaction they deserve.

We also visit kids at home to monitor progress adapting to everyday life; these insights inform adjustments needed in lesson plans to suit individual needs.

Counseling Sessions with students and their families allow us to grow closer and build trust. The children are also able to play and socialize directly outside their classrooms.

ULF also engages with area schools to increase awareness around learning difficulties. We equip teachers and students with overall understanding, and the ability to recognize early signs of disabilities.

As a result, learners get the attention and help that they need to succeed. Trainings also break the stigma behind disability. All students are encouraged to act as ambassadors and give voice to disability challenges.



# OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY AND NEURAL PROGRAMS

In 2023 we had a total of 39 full time participants and 39 on a part time basis.

January began with 255 patients, and by the close of the year we maintained 270 clients.

Community trainings include proper handling, positioning and lifting of patients. As well as education on cerebral palsy, epilepsy, behavioural training, autism, learning disabilities and nutrition.

Community outreach like this has directly increased patient referrals to our hospital.

Moreover, congregants are educated on disabilities and help to demystify common misunderstandings around epilepsy and other special needs.

**Faith** has been on follow up on our neuro clinic for the last 10 years. She was weaned off meds in August after been seizure free for the last 2 years.

She is now 14 yo, doing amazing in our school unit with no convulsions reported post meds wean off.

**Dalton** joined the ULF program in 2014, he was three years old.

Our team worked with his family to begin tapering medication in December 2022.

We are thrilled to share he has successfully weaned off all medications as of May 2023. Dalton is a happy 12 yo, excelling in his academics and will join 7th grade this year.
