Safety Information

This section covers recommended safety instructions, along with other general recommendations and specific trailer safety precautions that should be read thoroughly before operating the trailer.



Safety Alert Symbol

This message alert symbol identifies important safety messages on the equipment and in the owner's manual. When you see this symbol, be alert to the possibility of personal injury and carefully read the message that follows.

In this owner's manual and on decals used on the equipment the words **DANGER**, **WARNING**, **CAUTION**, **IMPORTANT**, **and NOTE** are used to indicate the following: **DANGER**: This word warns of immediate hazards which, if not avoided, will result in severe personal injury or death.

WARNING: This word refers to a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, could result in severe personal injury or death.

CAUTION: This word refers to a potential hazard or unsafe practice which may result in minor or moderate personal injury.

IMPORTANT: Highlights information that must be heeded.

NOTE: A reminder of other related information that needs to be considered.

Be certain all equipment operators are aware of the dangers indicated by safety decals applied to the equipment, and be certain they follow all safety decal instructions. Contact your authorized Distributor, Dealer Parts Department or SPACE Trailer for safety decal replacement.

Do not modify this trailer in any way. Unauthorized modification may impair the function and / or safety of the components and systems and could affect the life of the equipment, possibly invalidating the warranty coverage.

SPACE Trailer cannot anticipate every possible circumstance that may involve a potential hazard. The warnings in this owner's manual are not all inclusive.

Owner's Responsibility

The owner and operator MUST operate and maintain this trailer in a safe manner and in accordance with all applicable local, state, and federal codes, regulations and / or laws and in compliance with on-product labeling and this owner's manual instructions.

Make sure that all personnel have read this owner's manual, and thoroughly understand safe and correct installation, operation, and maintenance procedures. Give operating instructions to the operators before allowing them to operate the trailer, and at least annually there after per OSHA (Occupational Safety and Health Administration) regulation 1928.57.

Fulfill all warranty obligations so as not to void the warranties. The warranty policy located on page 49 outlines the warranty policy of SPACE Trailer.

- Do not allow anyone to operate the trailer until he or she has read the owner's manual and is completely familiar with all safety precautions.
- Do not allow inexperienced persons unfamiliar with the trailer, or unfamiliar with safe operating and maintenance procedures for the equipment to operate or maintain the trailer.
- Do not allow persons under the influence of alcohol, medications, or other drugs that can impair judgement to operate or maintain the trailer.
- If any safety devices are not functioning properly, do not use the trailer. Remove it from service until it has been properly repaired.
- Do not replace components or parts with other than factory-recommended service parts. To do so may decrease the effectiveness and / or the safety of the trailer.
- Do not modify the trailer in any way. Un-authorized modification can result in serious injury or death and may impair the function and life of the trailer.
- Have a first-aid kit available for use should the need arise and train personnel on proper use of the kit.
- Review safety related items annually with all personnel who will be operating, using or maintaining.



Operating Safety

AVOID INJURY OR DEATH

Warnings on the trailer and in the manuals are for your safety. Failure to obey warnings can cause serious injury or death.

These are general safety considerations. Additional precautions may be necessary to operate your equipment in a safe manner. Be certain you are operating your equipment in accordance with all safety codes, OSHA rules and regulations, insurance requirements; and local, state and federal laws.

Failure to comply with the following messages could result in death or serious injury.

- Use care when climbing on / over frame to prevent slipping or falling.
- Install and secure all guards before operating.
- Secure propane tanks and fuel tanks to trailer before transporting.
- Completely stop trailer operation before servicing, repairing, adjusting, loading.
- Replace or repair anything that could cause a potential hazard.
- Before servicing, make sure the trailer has cooled down. Trailer components and fittings can get hot enough to cause serious injury.

Transporting Safety

Failure to comply with the following messages could result in death or serious injury.

- Due to the large surface area the trailer may sway at high speeds with a strong side wind.
- Comply with state and local laws governing safety on public roads.
- Check that all lights, reflectors and other lighting requirements are installed and in good working condition.
- Be sure the trailer is hitched positively to the towing vehicle. Always attach safety chains between the hitch and the towing vehicle.
- Do not allow riders in / on the trailer when transporting.
- Do not exceed a safe travel speed. Slow down for rough terrain and when cornering.
- Make sure tires are properly inflated. A tire can explode during inflation and cause serious injury or death. Never exceed the inflation pressure recommended by the tire manufacturer. Replace a tire if the tire has a defect.
- Canopy closed and locked during transporting.



Decal Replacement

- Keep all safety signs and reflectors clean and legible at all times.
- Replace safety signs and reflectors that are missing or have become illegible.
- Replaced parts that displayed a safety sign, must also display the current sign.
- Contact SPACE Trailer for safety decal replacement.

Canopy Removal

⚠ CAUTION: To prevent injury or trailer damage, two people are required to remove the canopy.

⚠ CAUTION: To prevent injury or trailer damage, the canopy support rod must be placed into the trailer support rod hole.

NOTE:Email info@spacetrailers.com to receive a video showing the removal of a canopy.

- 1. Remove the spare tire to allow access to the front of the trailer.
- 2. Remove the SPACE bars to lighten the canopy. See "Adjusting And Removing SPACE Bars" on page 19.
- 3. Open the canopy. See "Opening, Closing and Locking The Canopy" on page 24.

⚠ CAUTION: To prevent injury or trailer damage, use second person to hold open the canopy. (Figure 1).





Canopy Removal (Cont'd)


4. Use a flat screw driver (Item 1) to release the locking clamp (Item 2) (Figure 2)

NOTE:It is required to slightly rotate the screw driver to release the locking clamp. Do NOT remove locking clamp

- 5. Remove the canopy strut (Item1) from the upper strut ball(Item 2). (Figure 2) (both sides)
- ⚠ CAUTION: It is required remove canopy struts before removing the hinge bolts.



6. Using a 1/2 inch socket or wrench, remove the bolts and washers from the hinge points (Item 1). (Figure 3)






⚠ IMPORTANT: To prevent injury or trailer damage, use second person to hold up the canopy. (Figure 4)



7. Remove the canopy support rod (Item 1) from the trailer support rod bracket (Item 2). (Figure 5)



Canopy Removal (Cont'd)

- Close the canopy (Item 1) and remove from the trailer. (Figure 6)
- ⚠ IMPORTANT: To prevent injury or trailer damage, use two people to remove the canopy (Item 1) from the trailer. (Figure 6)




- 9. Place the canopy on saw horses or blocks. (Figure 7)
- NOTE:Placing the canopy on saw horses or blocks will prevent damage to the latches and hinge.






Canopy Installation

- Locate the hole (Item 1) (Figure 8) in the center mounting position of the hooked hinge.
- Using a non permanent marker or pencil, mark the outside of the canopy (Item 2) in line with the center mounting position (Item 1) of the hooked hinge. (Figure 8)



3. Rotate the hinge (Item 1) in the closed position. (Figure 9)



Canopy Installation (Cont'd)

4. Using a person at the front and rear of the canopy, lift and center the canopy above the trailer. (Figure 10)

NOTE: The person at the rear must maintain the canopy a height slightly above the trailer box top.

 Align the mark on the canopy with the rivet (Item 1) at the center of the trailer box. (Figure 11)

NOTE: The mark on the canopy was placed on (Figure 8)

6. Lower the canopy and hinge onto the trailer box.

NOTE:To align the bolt holes in the hinge with the bolt holes in the box, it may be necessary to press down on the front of the canopy.







Canopy Installation (Cont'd)

7. Install the support rod (Item 1) into the bracket (Item 2). (Figure 12)



8. Install and tighten the three hinge mounting bolts (Item 1). (Figure 13)

Canopy Installation (Cont'd)

- 9. Install the struts (Item 1) onto the canopy. (Figure 14)
- 10. Confirm the locking clamp (Item 2) is flush with the strut end. **(Figure 14)**
- ⚠ CAUTION: To prevent injury or trailer damage, the locking clamp must be flush with the strut.



Adjusting And Removing SPACE Bars

- Using a 1/2 inch socket or wrench, remove two nuts (Item 1) from the SPACE bar. (both sides) (Figure 15)
- 2. Remove the SPACE bar(s).
- 3. Slide the aluminum blocks to the desired locations.
- 4. Install and tighten the two nuts (Item 1). **(Figure 15)**



Connect Trailer To A Vehicle

⚠ WARNING: To prevent death or serious injury. Before attempting to connect the trailer, make sure the vehicle hitch ball is the same size as the trailer and the the vehicle has a trailer connector that will accept the trailer wiring.

NOTE:A 2 inch ball and four flat wiring is required to use this trailer.

- Crank the trailer jack handle (Item 1) to lower trailer onto the hitch (Item 2). Continue cranking handle until the jack tire is off the ground. (Figure 16)
- 2. Pull on the jack lock handle (Item 3) and rotate the jack (Item 4) to the up and stowed position. (Figure 16)



- Lower the safety latch (Item 1) securing the coupler to the ball. (Figure 17)
- 4. Attempt to lift the trailer tongue off the ball.
- 5. If the trailer tongue is lifted off the ball accomplish steps 2, 3 and 4 in this section.







Connect Trailer To A Vehicle (Cont'd)

- ⚠ IMPORTANT: To prevent trailer and/or vehicle wire harness damage, allow some slack in the wire harness between the tow vehicle and trailer.



- 8. Connect both safety cables to the vehicle safety chain loops. (Item 1). (Figure 21)
- NOTE:Cross the cables under
 the tongue before
 connecting to the vehicle.
 This prevents the trailer
 tongue dragging on the
 ground if the trailer were
 to become accidently
 disconnected from the
 vehicle.
- Accomplish a daily inspection on the trailer. See "Daily Inspection" on page 37.




Opening, Closing and Locking The Canopy

- ⚠ CAUTION: To prevent injury or trailer damage, do not open the canopy with anything loaded on the space bars (if installed).
- ⚠ CAUTION: To prevent injury or trailer damage, when towing the trailer ALWAYS have both latches down and have the latches secured with carabiners or locks.
- 1. Remove the carabiner (Item 1) or lock (Item 2) from the latch handle. (Figure 22) (both sides)





2. Lift the handle (Item 1) until the latch (Item 2) is free from the latch hook. (Figure 23) (both sides)



- ⚠ IMPORTANT: To prevent damage to the canopy latch, push down on the corner of the canopy, this will prevent damage to the latching mechanism.

14. If latch adjustment is required, rotate the latch (Item 3) until some pressure is required to overcome the canopy seal. (Figure 34)

15. Install the carabiner (Item 1) or lock (Item 2). (both sides) (Figure 35)

NOTE:Canopy must be closed with handle locked while moving.



Loading The Trailer Compartment

⚠ CAUTION: To prevent injury or trailer damage, do not overload the trailer. See "Trailer Specifications" on page 45.

- 1. Connect it to the vehicle to be used for transportation. See "Connect Trailer To A Vehicle" on page 20.
- 2. Open the canopy. See "Opening, Closing and Locking The Canopy" on page 24.
- 3. When loading the trailer, keep the load centered from left to right and forward of the trailer axle (Item 1). (Figure 36)
- NOTE:For safe and best towing performance, the load should be toward the front allowing proper tongue weight 60/40. The tongue weight should be 10% of the total trailer weight. Example: 1000 lb. (453,59 kg) total load (including trailer) should have 100 lb. (45,359 kg) tongue weight.



NOTE:SPACE Bars accept most roof top accessories. (Refer to the manufacturer's roof top accessories specifications.)

NOTE:Check to make sure SPACE Bars hardware is secure and not damaged.

NOTE:Load on SPACE Bars should not exceed 225 lb. (102 kg).




Yearly Inspection

- 1. Complete the daily inspection. See "Daily Inspection" on page 37.
- 2. Using a flat blade screw driver, remove the dust cover (Item 1). (both sides) (Figure 50)
- 3. Using a grease gun, grease the hub until resistance is felt in the grease gun every 3000 miles or every 3 months. (both sides)
- ⚠ IMPORTANT: To prevent damage to the wheel hub, DO NOT over grease the wheel bearings.
- ⚠ IMPORTANT: Don't use heavy, fibrous greases; don't mix grease types. Only use a hand grease gun.







In Case Of Major Defect

ONE YEAR LIMITED WARRANTY

Subject to the requirements, exclusions and limitations stated below, your SPACE Trailer is warranted to the original retail purchaser against defects in materials and workmanship by **Red Wing Gear LLC** arising from normal use for one (1) year from the date of purchase.

EXCLUSION OF COMPONENTS WARRANTED BY OTHER MANUFACTURERS

Tires, axles, springs and suspension components, couplers and jacks purchased and installed by *Red Wing Gear LLC* are warranted by their manufacturers and are excluded from this Limited Warranty.

NORMAL USE, NO REPAIRS OR ALTERATIONS

This Limited Warranty covers only defects in original components which arise from normal use and does not apply if the trailer has been subjected to negligence, accident, abuse, misuse, neglect or overload or has been repaired or altered without the prior written consent of *Red Wing Gear LLC*. Normal wear items, including but not limited to doors, struts, lights, bearings and tires, will not be replaced due to wear.

TRANSPORTATION COSTS EXCLUDED

Transportation of any trailer to and/or from your dealer or any approved repair facility shall be the responsibility of the trailer owner. *Red Wing Gear LLC* shall not be liable for any such costs.

PRIOR WRITTEN CONSENT REQUIRED AND RETURN OF DEFECTIVE PARTS REQUIRED

No reimbursement will be made to any dealer or owner for repairs made without the prior written consent of Red Wing Gear LLC. Any defective part(s) must be sent by prepaid freight to Red Wing Gear LLC in order to qualify for replacement or reimbursement under this Limited Warranty.


