

Symbols and signs help us to see and understand what is true and good.


Mysteries have pathways into understanding. Let us take these pathways of symbols and signs. By Easter, you will be glad you did.


Do one page everyday starting on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. Ask for help if you need it.






Purple: Advent, Lent

Ashes are a holy sign that blesses us on our Journey of Lent.




In the beginning pages of the Holy Bible, the creation story says that God created the first man from dust of the ground. (Genesis 2:17)


