
"The War that Followed Us Home"

Transition into civilian life can be an overwhelming challenge for our veterans.

Some return home with visible (and invisible) wounds that make it difficult for them to assimilate back into an environment that seems so different than what they remember.

Burn Pits 360



Hundreds of tons of waste produced on Coalition bases in Iraq and Afghanistan were burned in football field-sized hollows of roiling flame and unceasing smoke, propelled by jet and diesel fuels – as American soldiers lived, worked, and slept on site.

It is well established that burning regular household waste releases carcinogens, neuro-disruptors, and heavy metals that can have devastating effects on the lungs, heart, brain, thyroid, and immune system. Both federal and state government agencies have compiled decades of research linking these toxins to diseases and birth defects. It's why using burn pits on American soil is against the law.

During the OEF and OIF wars, government contractors burned up to 227 metric tons of hazardous waste at forward operating bases using jet fuel in large ground pits. Items burned included: batteries, medical waste, amputated body parts, plastics,

ammunition, human waste, animal carcasses, rubber, chemicals, & more. Exposure to these toxins, have caused a traumatic impact on the lives of our service members and their families. Some of the devastating health conditions suffered by Veterans exposed include: neurological disorders, pulmonary diseases. rare forms of cancer, and many unexplained symptoms. There have been thousands of deaths resulting from the invisible wounds of war.

Burn Pits 360

The toxins and smoke emitted from burn pits may affect the skin, eyes, respiratory system, cardiovascular system, and gastrointestinal tract.

Burn pit exposure has caused long-term concerns such as:

- Reduced central nervous system function
- Reduced liver or kidney function
- Stomach, respiratory or skin cancer
- Skin lesions
- Leukemia
- Chronic bronchitis
- Constrictive bronchiolitis
- Autoimmune disorders
- Chron's Disease
- Infertility
- Migraines
- Throat infections
- Eczema
- Multiple Sclerosis



Burn Pits 360





Burn Pits 360 was founded in honor of Army Captain Le Roy Torres, who served in the U.S. Army for 23 years (7 years-Active, 16 Years-Reserve). He deployed to Balad, Iraq from 2007-200B. Captain Torres also served the State of Texas as a State Trooper for 14 years. Torres suffers from complications from illnesses that began after he was exposed to toxic fumes during service in post-9/11 Iraq. Le Roy was subsequently diagnosed with Constrictive Bronchiolitis and Toxic Brain Injury. After experiencing delay, denial of benefits, and ineffective treatment from his physicians, Le Roy alongside his wife, Rosie, founded Burn Pits 360.





Burn Pits 360 seeks to ensure that no other service member or Veteran suffers his fate and to ensure that we would make the invisible visible. One of the greatest disservices to those who served is to become invisible." aver the years, Rosie and Le Roy established an independent Veterans exposure registry where thousands of war heroes and their families reported the same suffering and denial of health care and benefits. Le Roy and Rosie combined bring over 40 years of experience working with Veterans and active duty service members and families. Rosie worked for the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs for 23 years. Together they co-founded Burn Pits 360.

Burn Pits 360 is proud to announce the establishment of our Warrior Hope Network. This program provides access to our various network partners that are providing many types of healthcare modalities equipment at either a discounter rate or under full scholarship grant. Our partners are providing services such as hyperbaric oxygen therapy, stem cell therapy, detoxification, as well as nutritional, emotional and spiritual support.

Our pilot program launched in the spring of 2021 with an initial cadre of 4 veterans undergoing treatment at the NorthStart Hyperbaric Clinic in Tucson, AZ. These treatments were made possible through the support of a wonderful 501(c)3 charity, Healing Arizona Veterans. All four of our veterans came from other areas of the country and due to the length of treatment and the accompanying logistical support demands that go along with that, Burn Pits 360 provided a communal home free of charge so they could have a place to rest and heal while undergoing treatment without worry of how to pay for accommodations while away.


