

THREAD YOUR BENCH

STEP 1


Let's start by assembling two parts of your bench.


Place them next to each other on flat ground and pull the cord through the hole in the back of part 1.



STEP 2

Thread it downwards through the front hole of the same part.





Now pull the cord up through the back hole of part 2.




And thread it through the front hole of the same part. <u>Don't pull the</u> <u>cords too tight</u> to keep the intended 2cm gap between the parts.




Now we repeat the last 4 steps to create a double line pattern.

Pull the cord through the hole in the back of part 1. The hole is big enough to accommodate two cords. Thread it downwards through the front hole of the same part.




STEP 7


Pull the cord up through the back hole of part 2.





STEP 8

And thread it through the front hole of the same part.









If you turn the stool around, this is what it should look like on the underside.



Check if the cord sits tight. Wherever it's loose, tighten it but make sure, to leave the gap between the parts as we want them to move independently later;).


To make the knot jump to page 14.

STEP 11

Let's continue with the foot part. The two parts are still upside down. Thread the cord downwards through the back hole of part 1. STEP 12

Pull the cord up between the two parts.


We use a different pattern here, which ties the parts closer together for less movement.



STEP 13


Thread it downwards through the front hole of part 2.


For better understanding, we're showing the previous threads in grey and the current one in black



STEP 14

Pull it upwards through the back hole of the same part.





STEP 15

Thread the cord downwards between the parts and pull it upwards through the front hole of part 1.




Again, we're going downwards between the two parts, then threading the cord upwards through the back hole of part 2.

The hole is big enough to accommodate two cords.

STEP 17


From here, you go to the front hole of the same part and thread the cord downwards. Now go up between the parts and downwards through the back hole of part 1.



STEP 19


At last, you thread the end of the cord upwards, through the front hole of the same part. Pull the cords tight – the two parts should meet gaplessly this time.

To make the knot jump to page 14.





STEP 20

When you turn the two parts around, it should look like this.









Now add the remaining pieces of your bench by repeating the same thread pattern.


Jump to <u>page 4</u> for the top pattern, to <u>page 7</u> for the bottom pattern.

STEP 22

Once you've added all your elements your bench is ready for the final details.



Let's thread some cords through these last empty holes, shall we?




These last cords are just decorative, so have fun with them. Below is our suggestion on how to thread them, but you might wanna get creative ;).



We make a double loup through the each set of holes.




That's it. Repeat steps 21–24 for the three other ends of your bench.



STEP 25

The loose cord ends should be on the underside, as we want to hide the knots.


Now, tie the remaining knots following the steps on the next pages.




MAKE A KNOT

SQUARE KNOT

MOST OF YOU WILL KNOW THIS KNOT AS IT IS COMMONLY USED. HOWEVER, THE SECOND LOOP MIGHT BE DIFFERENT TO WHAT YOU ARE USED TO, SO TAKE A CLOSE LOOK.







For better understanding we're showing the two cord ends in different shades.

The knots on the foot part should fit into the pockets so the stool can sit flat on the ground.

FELT PADS ON AND GO!

Apply the included felt pads – three on each part – to protect the wooden surface from scratching.
