- 1. Start on 600-800 grit paper or stone of your choice. We like to use diamond stone.
- 2. You will need a jig. The blade angle is 22.5 degrees, any sharpener that can do blades at that angle will work. We suggest the KME sharpener on our website as it will make this process much easier. Unless you have the 2 blade 300 grain 1 ¼", you will need the Delta Jaws accessory.
- 3. Since this broadhead is double beveled, we will need to keep them even. The KME broadhead sharpener has a swivel head so that the broadhead can be flipped over to the other side very easily at the same angle. Mark one side with sharpie. Do a few strokes (1 stroke = back and forth) on one of the sides and then check it and adjust the angle accordingly. We want the sharpie to be evenly removed throughout the entire blade.

*If using the KME broadhead sharpener, the perfect angle only needs to be found on one side.

With the swiveled head, we can use the same exact angle on each side*

- 4. Once the perfect angle is found, it is time to sharpen. Do 10 strokes with medium pressure, then flip the broadhead over and do 10 strokes and check the blade. Clean off any material that has built up and feel the edge and feel the blade. Keep repeating this until it feels sharp and can shave hair easily.
- 5. When it can shave hair easily, do 2-3 FORWARD strokes on each side. The goal is to even out the blades the best you can. Finish with stropping with backward strokes.

If further sharpening is desired, use 1000-1200 grit stone/paper and repeat steps 4 and 5. Finish with stropping backwards
