- 1. Start on 600-800 Grit stone/paper of your choice. We use diamond stone.
- 2. Lay the 3 blade broadhead flat on the stone. If you have a 3 blade with a pyramid tip, make sure to always keep the broadhead flat, otherwise you will risk messing up the tip.
- 3. The method of how you do the strokes is up to you. We have seen success doing it back and forth, just forward, just backward, and even in a circular motion. We recommend doing back and forth = 1 stroke.
- 4. Do 10 strokes on each side and carefully run your finger along the blade. Repeat this until it starts to feel sharp.
 - *3 blades can be deceptive on how sharp they are, cutting paper with them can be tricky. We suggest carefully running your finger along the blade and/or shaving hair to judge sharpness.*
- 5. When the blade feels sharp and can start to shave hair, do 5 strokes on each side. Repeat until you cannot get it any sharper (it should shave hair with no problem). Finish with 1 stroke on each side and stropping backwards. We have found that 600 or 800 grit is all you need get the broadhead hair shaving, hunt ready sharp.
 - *If further sharpening is desired, move to 1000-1200 grit and repeat step 5 (5 strokes on each side). *
