- 1. Start with your choice of 600-800 grit stone/paper. We use diamond stone.
- 2. Recognize the 4 sides of the Omega. There is the main side, and the back side.
  - \*We have found success sharpening back and forth, just forwards, just backwards, and even in a circular motion. Use the method that allows you to get the perfect angle and is most comfortable for you. This guide is based on 1 stroke = back and forth\*
- 3. Screw the broadhead into an arrow shaft and mark the main side with a sharpie. Do a few strokes and check the blade. The goal is to find the correct angle. Keep marking the main side and doing a few strokes until the sharpie is evenly removed along the entire blade.
- 4. Do the same process for the backside. Make sure that you are hitting the very edge here.
- 5. Now that you have a feel for the correct angle, it is time to sharpen. Start by dong 5-10 strokes on the backside, then doing 5-10 strokes on the main side. Repeat this until the broadhead can easily shave hair and cut paper.
- 6. Next, do 1-2 strokes on each side (starting with the back, then the main side). Repeat this 3 times and finish with stropping.
  - \*We have found that 600 or 800 grit is enough to get this broadhead hair shaving, hunt ready sharp. If further sharpening is desired, we suggest moving to 1000-1200 grit and then 2000 after that. Repeat steps 5 and 6 for each grit you do\*
