Welcome to the Scottish Sleuths Vacation Bible School curriculum series. Each year, our Scottish Super Sleuths, Angus McTavish and Professor Dabney Thornwell, are called in to solve a Biblical "case" with the help of the VBS children. The detective characters symbolically portray the message that we want the students to learn to become thoughtful investigators of Biblical truth.

The Case of the Titanic Transformation takes us through the opening chapters of the Book of Acts. The focus is on investigating the beginnings of the early church and its application to our lives today. Christians are baptized in the Spirit and the Church is built by the Spirit. We also learn how the Church is given the boldness of the Spirit, does battle in the strength of the Spirit and adds believers by the work of the Spirit!

Narrator

Introduces and concludes the skit. Also moves props when necessary.

Scottish accent required. Dressed as a tour guide.

Super Sleuth Angus McTavish

Scottish accent required. Dressed in a long trenchcoat. Often holding an old-fashioned pipe.

THE SET

This year's skit takes place in front of the ruins of St. Andrews Castle in Fife, Scotland. The set consists solely of the castle ruins in the background. The actors will stay on the outside of the castle. You may use any picture of the castle ruin as your model, with the North Sea in the background.

Narrator

Hello there, junior sleuths! Are you ready to help our Highland Heroes with another amazing Bible case? McTavish and Thornwell have been summoned to the ruins of St. Andrews Castle by a junior tour guide, Effie Flanagan. What do you think is going on at this historic Scottish site? Let's pay attention and find out!

McTavish and Thornwell arrive at the ruins of St. Andrews Castle.

Thornwell

It's so nice to get out of my laBORatory and get a breath of fresh seaside air! I always did love field trips to ancient Scottish ruins in my primary school days.

McTavish

Well, my Reminiscing Right-hand man, I'm afraid this may not be the entertaining sight-seeing trip you are accustomed to!

Thornwell

Nervously. What do you mean? Don't tell me that there are Baskerville hounds roaming around these ruins!

McTavish

Nothing of the sort, my Anxious Ally. *Pointing.* Oh look, there's the young lass who called us in on the case!

Enter Effie Flanagan, junior tour guide.

Effie

Reaching out to shake hands. You must be the famous Scottish Bible Sleuths. I saw your picture in the paper after you solved the Case of the Cardiac Crusader. What a pleasure to meet you!

McTavish

Great to make your acquaintance as well; and, glad to be of service, my lady. You sounded pretty upset on the telephone. What can we do for you?

Effie

Looking nervously about, and whispering. Well, I know this is going to sound a bit loony...but... I think that these castle ruins are...HAUNTED!

Thornwell

Jumping back. Haunted? You mean, as in GHOSTS?
