VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL CURRICULUM TEACHER'S MANUAL: 4TH - 5TH GRADES





Welcome to the Scottish Sleuths Vacation Bible School curriculum series. Each year, our Scottish Super Sleuths, Angus McTavish and Professor Dabney Thornwell, are called in to solve a Biblical "case" with the help of the VBS children. The detective characters symbolically portray the message that we want the students to learn to become thoughtful investigators of Biblical truth.

This year, the *Case of the Evangelical Encounters* brings us to a study of the life of Christ. Specifically, we will learn what happens when people meet Jesus! Mary and Joseph, Nicodemus and John the Baptist, and the Pharisees and Sadducees all had "evangelical" encounters with Jesus. They were impacted with the GOOD NEWS in the person of Christ, whether they knew it or not. We will also learn from Christ's encounters with the Canaanite woman, the woman at the well, doubting Thomas, and the men on the road to Emmaus.

Curriculum Distinctives

- 1. Focuses on the verbal transmission of Bible stories (The art of storytelling).
- 2. Emphasizes class discussion in an open question and answer format.
- 3. Age-appropriate.
- 4. Maximizes the small amount of time with profound truths without trying to be too theologically elaborate.
- 5. Reduces the amount of "busy work."
- 6. Does not overload with too much content or too many activities.

local church that is intended to be primarily evangelistic in nature. The curriculum presents the gospel message from God's Word in the context of loving relationships between teachers and their students. It is vital for each teacher to remember that VBS is all about:

- a) Showing the love of Christ to each one of your students;
- Faithfully and clearly presenting the gospel of Jesus Christ from God's Word; and,
- c) Praying for God's Spirit to do His sovereign work in the lives of the VBS children.

Please feel free to use your creative energy to mold this curriculum to your own personality and the learning styles of your particular students. Remember that the end goal of all our teaching is to bring students face-to-face with the gospel of Jesus Christ with full dependence on His Spirit to change hearts and minds.

On Classroom Setup

The most important thing to remember about your classroom setup is that it should be conducive to learning. Arrange the room in such a way that the students can effectively hear and see the teacher(s) and have classroom discussion. Also, post the Scripture Memory, Application Points and other visual aids that will focus the minds of the children on God's truths.

Don't worry about decorating according to the theme—but you are welcome to be as creative as possible. The priority is making the room a place that helps the children learn.

SCRIPTURE MEMORY

DAY ONE: I JOHN 4:14-15

And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent His Son to be the Savior of the world. Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God.

DAY TWO: JOHN 3:35-36

The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hand. Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him.

DAY THREE: ACTS 4:11-12

This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.

DAY FOUR: GALATIANS 4:4-5

JESUS IS REVEALED AS SAVIOR

DAY ONE

BIBLE TEXT

Matthew 1:18-25; Luke 2:22-52

MEMORY VERSE

I John 4:14-15

SCRIPTURE TRUTH

Jesus is revealed as the light to His people and Savior of the world at His birth and first years on this earth.

LESSON AIM

For the students to know that only when Jesus reveals Himself to us and our sins to us can we be saved. Christ alone shows us the Father!



The opening program includes a skit to introduce the day's theme, a time of singing, and announcements. After the opening program, go with your students back to your classroom.



Introduce yourself, your co-teacher(s), and your classroom helpers. Greet the boys and girls warmly, working diligently to memorize their names. Make sure each student has a name tag.



[Note: Each day's icebreaker is intended to: 1) help build relationships between leaders and students, and between students themselves; and, 2) help "warm up" the students so that they will engage in conversation about the Bible Lesson.]

Today's question: *"If you could meet one Bible character (other than Jesus), who would it be, and why?"*

Have all students answer. Start with your own answer. Encourage the students to listen closely to each answer. Help the students to briefly discuss what they would like to ask their Bible character. **Transition:** How awesome would it be if we could meet some of those people in heaven one day! But, more importantly, we all need to meet Jesus. Encountering Jesus is all that really matters!



[Note: The "Bible Lesson" time is intended to: 1) Allow the students to read and hear God's Word and gain understanding of what it says; 2) Raise questions in their minds that will be discussed during the "Bible Application" time.]

Materials: Bibles, one per student. [All in-text references are from the ESV.]

Introduction: This week, our Bible lessons will all come from the Gospels of the New Testament. What are the names of the four Gospels? [Matthew, Mark, Luke, John.] We will focus on what happens when people ENCOUNTER Jesus. Do you think they will be changed? We'll see!

Have all of the students turn in their Bibles to Matthew 1.

Read Matthew 1:18-21.

¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. ²⁰ But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

Discussion: Why did Joseph want to divorce Mary? [Because she got pregnant before they were married.] What stopped Joseph from divorcing Mary? [An angel appeared and told him not to be afraid to marry Mary.] What was Jesus sent to do? [To save His people from their sins.]

Let's continue. Read verses 22-25.

²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: ²³ "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us). ²⁴ When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife, ²⁵ but knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he called his name Jesus.

Discussion: What other name was Jesus to be called? [Immanuel.] What does that name mean? [God with us.]

Have the students turn to Luke 2.

Let's read more. Read Luke 2:22-26.

²² And when the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every male who first opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord") ²⁴ and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the Law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons." ²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. ²⁶ And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ.

Discussion: Why did Mary and Joseph bring Jesus to Jerusalem? [He was the firstborn son, so He had to be redeemed and purified.] What was a man named Simeon promised? [That he wouldn't die until he met Christ!]

Listen to what happens. Read verses 27-35.

²⁷ And he came in the Spirit into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the Law, ²⁸ he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said, ²⁹ "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word; ³⁰ for my eyes have seen your salvation ³¹ that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, ³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel." 33 And his father and his mother marveled at what was said about him. ³⁴ And Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is appointed for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is opposed ³⁵ (and a sword will pierce through your own soul also), so that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed."

Discussion: Wow! Simeon had lots to say when he met Jesus! What was the response of Mary and Joseph? [They marveled.] What was Simeon's main point about Jesus? [Jesus is the Savior!]

Let's read more. Read verses 36-38.

³⁶ And there was a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived with her husband seven years from when she was a virgin, ³⁷ and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She did not depart from the temple, worshiping with fasting and prayer night and day. ³⁸ And coming up at that very hour she began to give thanks to God and to speak of him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem.

Discussion: Why did Anna the prophetess begin to give thanks for the redemption of God's people? [Because she met Jesus.] She waited a long time to meet the Savior!

Go to verse 41. Read verses 41-47.

⁴¹ Now his parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover. ⁴² And when he was twelve years old, they went up according to custom. ⁴³ And when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it, ⁴⁴ but supposing him to be in the group they went a day's journey, but then they began to search for him among their relatives and acquaintances, ⁴⁵ and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, searching for him. ⁴⁶ After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. ⁴⁷ And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers.

Discussion: How old is Jesus on this trip to Jerusalem? [Twelve.] What happened? [He stayed behind; His parent's lost Him.] When the teachers of the law met Jesus, how did they respond? [They were amazed!]

Let's finish for now. Read verses 48-52.

⁴⁸ And when his parents saw him, they were astonished. And his mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us so? Behold, your father and I have been searching for you in great distress." ⁴⁹ And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" ⁵⁰ And they did not understand the saying that he spoke to them. ⁵¹ And he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was submissive to them. And his mother treasured up all these things in her heart. ⁵² And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man.

Conclusion: Why did Jesus stay behind in Jerusalem? [To be in His Father's house.] How did Joseph and Mary respond to what Jesus said? [They didn't understand.] How did Jesus behave as a child and youth? [He was perfectly submissive to his parents.]

Close this time with prayer, thanking God for His Word.



Escort your children to the Music Area. The Music Team will lead the class in a time of singing and learning the various VBS songs. **Use this time for a break.**



Go with your students to the Crafts Area. The VBS Crafts Team will lead your students in a crafts project. You may also use this time to prepare for Bible Application time.



[Note: The Bible Application time is intended to help the students think about how the Bible Lesson applies to their lives. The focus is on providing a practical emphasis using the key concepts of the lesson. <u>For visual reminders</u>, <u>post these points in the room as you present</u> <u>them.</u>]

Application Point 1: Jesus Christ is "God with us"

We read today that God's angel told Joseph to marry Mary and give their firstborn son a name. What was it? [Immanuel.] And we learned that Immanuel means "God with us." Jesus is the Son of God who lives among His people.

Back in Bible times, most people believed in "gods" that lived far, far away. Even today, many people think that God is distant or that He just created the world and has left us to our own. So why is this name of Jesus so important? Allow answers.

It is amazing that God would choose to live among His people! In the Old Testament, God dwelt among His people in the form of a glory cloud. But now, in the New Testament, the second person of the Trinity is born as a baby boy! Our God is not far away—He is with us.

When you become a Christian, how does Jesus become "God with us?" Allow answers. Jesus Christ lives in us and we live in Him!

So, for the Christian, how does "God with us" change the way you live? Allow answers. [Help

the students think about living consciously with Christ in them. We have a real relationship with Christ. His Spirit enables us to live for Him!]

Application Point 2: Jesus is the light for revelation

When Simeon encountered Jesus, he said these words about Him: "...a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel." What does the word REVELATION mean? Allow answers. Revelation is the act of making something that is unknown KNOWN.

So when we talk about Jesus being the "light for revelation," it means that He makes God the Father known to us. So can people KNOW God without KNOWING Jesus? No way! Jesus reveals the GOOD NEWS of God.

So, why can't people just come to know God on their own? Allow answers. [Help the students understand that our sin separates us from God and blinds us from the truth.] We need Jesus as the Light of the World to REVEAL God to our hearts.

Simeon also said that Jesus would come "so that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed." That's a second REVELATION from Jesus. He REVEALS God to us, and our hearts to us as well. Why do we need our hearts REVEALED? Allow answers. When we see the depth of sin in our hearts we will long for a Savior!

One more thing. How did Mary and Joseph usually respond to Jesus? [They marveled, and they didn't understand.] Even Jesus' own parents needed the truth REVEALED to them. All people will only come to the knowledge of the TRUTH when Jesus is their REVELATION!

Application Point 3: Whoever confesses Jesus as Lord will be saved

When the angel appeared to Joseph in a dream, he said these words: "She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." Did you know that the name "Jesus" means that "God saves?" He was given this name to proclaim salvation to His people.

So, does Jesus save everyone from their sins? [No.] Why not? Allow answers. [Help them understand that Jesus saves His people—the people that God chooses, and who put their faith in Him.] It may seem unfair that Jesus only saves His people from their sin—until we remember that NONE of us deserve salvation. Why don't we deserve salvation? Allow answers.

According to God's Word, how does one become saved from sin and death? **Allow answers.** Yes, you have to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. You have to receive Him as LORD of your life. You have to confess yourself to be a sinner and that He is the only one who can save you. We will talk more about this all week long.

Finally, we also read these words about Anna, the prophetess: "And coming up at that very hour she began to give thanks to God and to speak of him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem." The people were waiting for redemption, or SALVATION. So, Anna was telling them all about Jesus! What about you? Do you confess that Jesus is SALVATION to the world? Or do you keep it to yourself?

Close in prayer, thanking God for Jesus our Savior!



Go with your children to the Recreation Area. The Recreation Team will be responsible for your students during this time. **This is your break.**



Snacks will be delivered to your classroom or to a snack area. Have a volunteer lead the class in a prayer of thanks for the food and drink. Make sure the students respect each other while eating and clean up after themselves.



Begin by reminding the students the importance of memorizing God's Word:

- 1. We "hide it in our hearts" so we will turn away from sin and obey God.
- 2. It changes the way we think—focusing on pleasing God instead of pleasing self.
- 3. It helps us to know Jesus more and love Jesus more.

If time, relate to the students how Scripture memory has impacted your life.

Say: So our first "evangelical encounter" revealed that Jesus is the Son of God and the Savior of the world. If Jesus had not been revealed, then we would be lost in our sins. Whoever confesses that Jesus is Lord will be saved! This is the testimony of the Word and the Spirit to our hearts.

Have the students open their Bibles and read this section of Scripture aloud several times.

Today's Scripture Memory is found in I John 4:14-15

And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent His Son to be the Savior of the world. Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God.

<u>Activity</u>: Memory Toss. Bring in a soft "sponge" ball or beanbag. Whoever you toss it to must say the first part of the memory verse. When the student cannot remember a part of the verse or misses a word, he or she must toss it to another student. Keep playing the game until all students have had a chance, or time is up.

Hand out Scripture memory reminder cards and encourage the students to spend time in memorization.



Go with your students back to the area designated for the Closing Program. Remind them to be respectful of others on their way to and during the Closing Program. Afterwards, escort the students to their pick-up location.

END DAY ONE
