



## Show Terms & Conditions

The 100X Cowtown Classic, to be held May 15-20, 2024, in Fort Worth, Texas, at the Will Rogers Memorial Center. All horses must fully comply with show conditions and governing body rules where applicable and present required paperwork when needed (i.e. - competition license, annual membership, passport, etc.)

Riders are responsible for all entry information regardless of the person who may have completed the entry.

**Stall Deadline:** Must be received by April 30, 2024 - Stall reservation deadline to avoid all late penalties or entry fees. This deadline is to be RECEIVED by April 30, 2024. Stall fee is \$325 per stall. Stall reservations are made at [reiningentries.equestrian.digital/login](https://reiningentries.equestrian.digital/login).

**Stalls:** All horses are required to have a stall. You cannot show from your trailer at the Will Rogers Memorial Center. Stall requests are due April 30 for \$325 each. Move in begins Monday, May 13.

Upon arrival, contact the show office to have your stalls unlocked. If you are arriving late, contact the show office early to arrange for stalls to be unlocked. Health certificates and Coggins papers will be checked upon arriving at the facility.

**Bedding:** No outside shavings are permitted. Shavings must be pre-ordered and paid for by filling out a reservation form found at [reiningentries.equestrian.digital/login](https://reiningentries.equestrian.digital/login). Arrivals estimated to arrive after 6 pm must pre-order shavings. Prices for bedding can be found on the Online Bedding Form. Orders placed after 6 pm will be filled on the next day.

**Entries** received by April 30, 2024, will be considered complete and a back number will be issued once all Memberships, Coggins/health papers have been verified and a form of payment is in place. Link for the entry form is [reiningentries.equestrian.digital/login](https://reiningentries.equestrian.digital/login). All horses fully entered in at least one class and with a stall purchased by April 30, 2024, will avoid late fees on additional ancillary classes entered at the event as long as they are entered by noon the day prior to the class.

### **Aged Event Late Fee Schedule: DRAWING FOR 100X STAKES WILL BE MAY 8 BY 5PM.**

\*Entries received by April 21, 2024: No Late Fee

\*Entries received April 22, 2024 – April 30, 2024: \$150.00 Late Fee

\*Entries received May 1, 2024 – May 8, 2024 (before draw at 5 pm): \$300 Late Fee.

\*Entries received May 9, 2024 until NOON the day before the class runs: \$300 Late Fee assessed and will be a negative number in the draw.

**Absolutely no entries in aged events will be accepted after NOON the day before the class runs** with the exception of horses entered in the Open 100X Stakes which will need to be entered no later than 30 minutes following the conclusion of the Open go-round.

**Aged Event Refunds:** There will be no refunds for Aged Event entries for any reason.

**Aged Event Prime Time** will use NRHA's Prime Time Handicap guidelines.

**Ancillary Late Fee Schedule:** Ancillary entries must be received by April 30, 2024, to be considered on time. A \$50 late fee will be applied if received after April 30, 2024, until May 15, 2024. Entries will be accepted after May 15, 2024, up until NOON the day prior to the class being entered and a \$100 late fee will be applied. Late fees will not apply to enter additional ancillary classes if a horse already has a back number.

**Ancillary Refunds:** There will be no refunds for Ancillary entries for any reason.

**Official Videographer and Photographer:** Video will be gathered by the official show videographer and images gathered from the official photographer. By way of entry into the event, competitors, and their respective employees, agents, and family members grant permission without remuneration for the use and public distribution of their image, likeness, voice and video for the possible promotion of the event.

**Media Pass:** Media passes will be available through the media office. See separate media guidelines for more information at [100xshows.com](#).

**Animal Welfare:** The 100X Cowtown Classic is a highly publicized event, held in a major metropolitan area. 100X Cowtown Classic management reserves the right to investigate and take appropriate action in the event of an incident involving animal welfare concerns. Animal welfare is monitored by show stewards while at the horse show. Arenas will not be overcrowded, and safety of horse and rider will be maintained to the best of management's ability. This monitoring shall extend to the schooling areas and training times in accordance with the applicable governing body.

**Dogs:** Dogs will be allowed throughout the Will Rogers Memorial Center but must be on a leash at all times. Failure to have dogs leashed or penned will result in a \$50 fine. Failure to clean up after the dog will also incur a fine. NO DOGS, with the exception of accredited therapy dogs, will be allowed in the Sponsor Area or in the seating area in front of Sponsor Area.

**Hotels:** A list of host hotels is available on the website. Be sure to mention group rates for the show. Please secure your room with one of our host hotels to give the show credit with the City of Fort Worth for the record keeping and future support of our sport.

**Camping:** Will Rogers Memorial Center offers a full-service RV park on the grounds. Camping spaces may be reserved for \$70/night. Please contact the Will Rogers Memorial Center RV Park for details at 817-392-8151.

**Arena Conflicts:** In the event of a draw conflict (Rider/Horse or Rider/Trainer) between the arenas, the Coliseum will take precedence and will remain unchanged. The draw position will be modified at the alternate arena. To have a draw position moved, talk with the back gate person at the arena that doesn't take precedence. Do not go to the horse show office or to the announcer or to the bit judge. The back

gate person is the only one who has the authority to modify a draw position. Draws may be moved **earlier** in the class and may be moved as early as desired but will always go last in the set. Draws may also be moved **later** in the class. However, draws moved later will only be allowed to move a maximum of three sets later than the original draw. Draws moved later will always go last in the set.

**NRHA Protocol for Riders When Tractor is in the Arena:** When the tractor enters any arena, all riders in the arena must follow the direction of the tractor driver and/or the NRHA Show Steward and move to the side of the arena. Once at the side of the arena, riders must cease all motion (including walking, spinning, trotting circles, backing, etc.) Failure to comply will result in all horses being excused from the arena to complete the drag.

**Show Management** reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations in the best interest of the event and of the promotion of the sport of reining. All decisions are final. By way of making entry, competitors will assume responsibility for knowledge and attest that they have read and fully understand all event rules, as well as association and National Governing Body (NGB) rules and regulations. Show management reserves the right to decide upon all questions in regard to or arising out of claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Under Texas Law, an equine professional is not liable for injury or harm that may arise from an individual's participation in equine events or activities. For the purposes of this event, Show Management will be defined as the entire show committee, including, but not limited to 100X Shows, Inc., Go Show Horses. and the Texas Reining Horse Association.

**Right To Cancel** The show management reserves the right to cancel the event without notice at any time prior to the contest and without liability to the show management. In the event of such cancellation, entry fees or other show fees paid in advance shall be refunded. The show management reserves to itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under control of the show management, but the show management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, officials, employees, Directors and Sponsors blameless for any loss or accident to horse(s), employees or equipment.

### **100X STAKES OPEN AND NON PRO**

**\*THE DRAW FOR 100X STAKES WILL BE MAY 8 BY 5PM.\***

To be eligible to enter the 100X Stakes, horses must be 4 years old and sired by a stallion that is enrolled in the 100X Stakes program. For more information about the 100X Stakes program or to check stallion enrollment, visit [100X Stakes](#).

#### **100X Stakes Late Fee Schedule:**

\*Entries received by April 21, 2024: No Late Fee

\*Entries received April 22, 2024 – April 30, 2024: \$150.00 Late Fee

\*Entries received May 1, 2024 – May 8, 2024 (before draw at 5 pm): \$300 Late Fee.

\*Entries received May 9, 2024 until NOON the day before the class runs: \$300 Late Fee assessed and will be a negative number in the draw.

One entry fee in the Open or Non Pro divisions will enter horse and rider into all eligible levels except the Novice Horse division. Out of each entry, \$500 will be returned to the sire of the entered horse. There will be no other retainage and the remaining fees will go into the payout.

The stallion owner is entitled to one (1) free entry per stallion in the 100X Stakes. The stallion owner may not transfer the free entry to another person and the entry must be owned by the stallion owner and sired by the enrolled stallion.

The 100X Stakes will feature a Novice Horse class in both the Open and Non Pro divisions. For the 100X Stakes, a Novice Horse will be considered a horse that has won **less than \$5,000 by May 1, 2024**. The Novice Horse Open Stakes will run concurrently with the 100X Open Stakes preliminary round and is open to horses already fully entered in the Open Stakes. The Novice Horse Non Pro Stakes will run concurrently with the 100X Non Pro Stakes and is open to horses already fully entered in the Non Pro Stakes.

**The top 25 entries in each level of the Open first go will advance to the finals. Novice Horses will only advance if they qualify in Levels 4 - Level 1.**

**Novice Horse Open Stakes will be paid at the end of the go-round.**

**Open Stakes go-round money will be paid out to the top 15 places in the first go.**

Five judges will be used in the 100X Stakes, plus an NRHA Monitor. All judges' decisions will be final. An equipment judge stationed at the pre-check will be used for the 100X Stakes.

Prize Money will be paid to the owner of the horse as recorded on the NRHA Competition License at time of competition. Appropriate tax information must be on file with the 100X Cowtown Classic office in order to receive payout. The 100X Cowtown Classic is not responsible for failure of owners to transfer horses into their name before the event or failure of owners to provide current competition licenses.

There are no refunds on entry fees for any reason.

Substitutions of riders will be allowed until noon the day prior to competition. Substitutions of horses will NOT be allowed.

**Entering the Non Pro 100X Stakes after Competing in the 1st Go of the Open 100X Stakes:** Horses may enter the Non Pro 100X Stakes after competing in the go-round of the Open 100X Stakes by paying the full entry fee and a \$300 late fee; no later than 30 minutes following the conclusion of the Open go-round prior to the start of the Non Pro 100X Stakes. The entry will be placed in a group to run prior to the regularly drawn horses in the reverse order that they were received (negative draw).

By way of entry, riders accept that they have read and understand all event rules as well as NRHA rules and regulations. Riders are responsible for all entry information regardless of the person who may have completed the entry.
