



100X Brazos Slide

Show Terms & Conditions

The 100X Brazos Slide, to be held July 23-28, 2024 in Waco, TX at the Extraco Event Center. All horses must fully comply with show conditions and governing body rules where applicable and present required paperwork when needed (i.e. - competition license, annual membership, passport, etc.)

Stall and Entry Deadline: Must be received by July 1, 2024 - Stall reservation deadline and pre-entry deadline is to avoid all late penalties on entry fees. This deadline is to be RECEIVED AND FULLY PAID by July 1. Postmarks are NOT considered. All horses fully entered in at least one class and with a stall purchased by this date will avoid late fees on additional ancillary and affiliate finals classes entered at the event as long as they are entered by noon the day prior to the class. Entry or Stall Request are not considered as completed by deadline unless both form and payment have been received.

Entries will be complete once all payment has been received along with required documentation or horse/rider/owner credentials (i.e. - competition license, rider membership, owner membership when required).

Ancillary Late Fee Schedule: Must be received by July 1. If received July 2- July 15, a \$50 late fee will be applied. If received July 15 and before NOON the day prior to the class, a \$100 late fee will be applied. No entries will be accepted after NOON the day prior to the class. Late fees will not apply to enter additional ancillary classes if a horse already has a back number.

Entries that might be scratched and then re-added will be put back into their original draw position.

Aged Event Late Fee Schedule: Received July 2-July 15, \$100, Received July 16 - NOON the day before, \$300. Absolutely no entries in aged events will be accepted after NOON the day before.

Aged Event Refunds: There will be no refunds for Aged Event entries for any reason.

Aged Event Prime Time will use NRHA's Prime Time Handicap guidelines.

Stalls: All horses are required to have a stall. You cannot show from your trailer at the Extraco Event Center. Stall requests are due July 1 for \$300 each. Stalls ordered or paid after July 1 are \$325 per stall. Move in begins Saturday, July 22. NO late departures allowed after 4 am Sunday, July 28. Contact the show office to request an exception. Unapproved exceptions will be charged \$100 per stall.

Upon arrival, contact the stall office to have your stalls unlocked. If you are arriving late, contact the stall office early to arrange for stalls to be unlocked. Health Certificates and Coggins papers will be checked prior to unlocking your stalls.

Bedding: No outside shavings are permitted. Shavings may be pre-ordered through 100X Shows stalling form. Pre-orders for shavings must be submitted by 7/1. Upon arrival, participants will have the option to purchase additional shavings directly from the Extraco Events Center.

Dogs will be allowed throughout the Extraco Event Center but must be on a leash at all times. Failure to have dogs leashed or penned will result in a \$50 fine. Failure to clean up after the dog will also incur a fine. NO DOGS, with the exception of accredited therapy dogs will be allowed in the Sponsor Area or in the seating area in front of Sponsor Area.

Judges Fees: For concurrent classes, only one Judges Fee is payable per run. Only the highest Judges Fee in the set of concurrent classes will apply.

Office Charge/Security Fee: A \$25 Office Fee will be assessed to each horse. This fee covers the event's administrative cost for each horse. A \$30 Security Fee will be assessed to each horse covering round-the-clock security for participants and horses.

Video Fee: A Video Fee in the amount of \$15 will be assessed for each run. For concurrent classes, only one Video Fee is due per run. This fee covers both the Video and Playback Fees.

Photographer Fee: A Photographer Fee of \$15 will be assessed to each horse.

Media Pass: Media passes will be available through the media office.. See separate media guidelines for more information.

Health Certificates: A 12-month negative Coggins/EIA test is required along with a 30-day health certificate written by a veterinarian at the point of origin to be presented upon arrival at the Extraco Event Center. Please be sure your health certificates and negative Coggins accompany the horses, as it will be checked when your stalls are unlocked.

Prize Money: Will be paid to the owner of the horse as recorded on the NRHA Competition License at time of competition. Appropriate tax information must be on file with the 100X Brazos Slide Show Office in order to receive payout.

Stakes Awards: In the event that there is a Co-Champion in the Futurity or Derby, NRHA Rule will be applied regarding run off, if after the run off the score will still be the same the prize money will be combined and then split equally between the co-champions. Prizes are divided. Winner of the coin flip will pick the prize of their choice and then the other exhibitor will pick until the prizes have been distributed.

High-Point Award will be given to the highest placing entry in both slates of NRHA classes:

- Horse/Rider combination must enter and show in both NRHA Ancillary slates.
- Horse/Rider combination must receive a score in both NRHA Ancillary slates.
- The placings will be given point values with 10 being the maximum for 1st place to produce a winner.
- Horse/Rider's points from both of the two slates will be added together to determine their total points. Highest point earner over the two slates in that class will be awarded High Point Champion.
- Ties in individual class will have their points added together and divided by the number of exhibitors tied. For example: second, third and fourth tie with their score, 8, 7, and 6 points are

added together. The total of 21 is then divided by three which results in 7 points. All three tied exhibitors would be awarded 7 points each.

- Ties for High Point:
 - 1. The highest combination of the total scores of both classes will be High Point Champion.
 - 2. If those are also equal, the high score from slate 1 will be High Point Champion.
 - 3. If that produces another tie, the exhibitors will be named Co-Champions and the prize will be given to the exhibitor that wins the coin toss.

Open Tabs: Will be held in the show office. An open check or credit card number and connection to each horse on each check will be required to pick up back numbers. If there is no additional business on the account, you may pick up the open check or credit card authorization form at the end of the show. Checks not closed out by Sunday, July 28 by 2 pm will be closed out according to the responsible party's account and will incur a \$25 service fee.

Trainers will be responsible for all client fees not paid before the trainer closes out their tab (otherwise known as trainer sheets). Trainer sheets should be completed by NOON on Saturday, July 27.

Video: No outside video is allowed. Competitors are encouraged to purchase video from the official show videographer and images from the official photographer. By way of entry into the event, competitors, and their respective employees, agents, and family members grant permission without remuneration for the use and public distribution of their image, likeness, voice and video for the possible promotion of the event.

Animal Welfare: The 100X Brazos Slide is a highly publicized event, held in a major metropolitan area. 100X Brazos Slide management reserves the right to investigate and take appropriate action in the event of an incident involving animal welfare concerns. Animal welfare is monitored by show stewards while at the horse show. Arenas will not be overcrowded, and safety of horse and rider will be maintained to the best of management's ability. This monitoring shall extend to the schooling areas and training times in accordance with the applicable governing body.

NRHA Protocol For Riders When Tractor is in the Arena: When the tractor enters any arena, all riders in the arena must follow the direction of the tractor driver and/or the NRHA Show Steward and move to the side of the arena. Once at the side of the arena, riders must cease all motion (including walking, spinning, trotting circles, backing, etc.)

Failure to comply will result in all horses being excused from the arena to complete the drag.

Hotels: A list of host hotels is available on the website. Be sure to mention group rates for the Show. Please secure your room with one of our host hotels to give the show credit with the city of Waco for the record keeping and future support of our sport.

Camping: The Extraco Event Center offers a full-service RV park on the grounds. Camping spaces may be reserved for \$30/night. Please contact the Extraco Event Center RV Park for details at 254-776-1660.

Show Management reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations in the best interest of the event and of the promotion of the sport of reining. All decisions are final. By way of making entry, competitors will assume responsibility for knowledge and attest that they have read and fully understand all event rules, as well as association and National Governing Body (NGB) rules and regulations. Show management reserves the right to decide upon all questions in regard to or arising out of claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Under Texas Law, an equine professional is not liable for injury or harm

that may arise from an individual's participation in equine events or activities. For the purposes of this event, Show Management will be defined as the entire show committee, including, but not limited to 100X Shows, LLC.

Non Sufficient Checks will be payable in cash, money order or cashier's check before services or products will be rendered plus a \$35 NSF check fee.

Arena Conflicts: In the event of a draw conflict (Rider/Horse or Rider/Trainer) between the arenas, the Coliseum will take precedence and will remain unchanged. The draw position will be modified at the alternate arena. To have a draw position moved, talk with the back gate person at the arena that doesn't take precedence. Do not go to the horse show office or to the announcer or to the bit judge. The back gate person is the only one who has the authority to modify a draw position.

Draws may be moved **earlier** in the class and may be moved as early as desired, but will always go last in the set.

Draws may also be moved **later** in the class. However, draws moved later will only be allowed to move a maximum of three sets later than the original draw. Draws moved later will always go last in the set.

TRHA RANCH FUEL ROOKIE L2 AND GREEN REINER L2 SHOOTOUT

- Shootout qualifier for Rookie L2 and Green Reiner L2 classes
- The rider needs to enter the horse in both slates of the show
 - This will be a Club class. Must be a member of TRHA
 - All NRHA rules apply

The first 5 exhibitors with the highest composite score of the 2 slates of Rookie 2 and Green 2 at the 100X Cowtown Classic in Fort Worth, as well as, the 100X Brazos in Waco, TX (plus ties) will get the opportunity to compete at the final Shootout in Tulsa at the the 100X Reining Classic.
