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Tonbridge School and Town

Internationally renowned
Tonbridge School sits

The school's history dates back to its foundation in 1553, and its buildings have great character and architectural significance, including as they do a magnificent chapel, as well as many more modern buildings, such as the superb swimming pool and sports centre, media centre and theatre.

Dedicated block of classrooms, with smartboards and wireless internet access, and the programme involves use of many of the school's facilities and resources.

There are three comfortable boarding houses adjacent to the school campus for our sole use. Boys and girls may mix in recreation areas but may not enter each other's sections of the boarding houses. There is a range of room types, including singles, twins, triples and quadruple, and room type can be confirmed at the time of booking. Bedrooms have shared bathroom facilities, which afford an appropriate degree of privacy. Staff members are accommodated within the boarding houses and are available at all times to provide assistance and a high level of supervision.

The town of Tonbridge attracts many international visitors and offers a wide range of shops and amenities, with a train station providing easy access to London, which is less than 45 minutes away. At the centre of the town, and just next to Tonbridge School, sits a well preserved 13th-century motte-and-bailey castle, set in beautiful gardens.

There is a strong link between the novelist Jane Austen and the school and town - her father, George, was a pupil of the school and later a teacher there. The literary connection is further established through the novelist E M Forster, who studied at the school and in whose honour the impressive school theatre is named.













English plus Sport and Activity

General English classes are designed to build confidence through communicating in English and teaching in small groups of up to 15 students.

Ages: 8-17 Language Level: A0-C2 Students are streamed by age and ability and are tested at the beginning of the course and placed in a class of the appropriate level. During the course, teachers monitor students' progress and an academic report and a certificate are awarded at the end of the course. Our syllabus is designed to suit the needs of our students, providing them with practical language skills. The aim of the course is to improve English comprehension skills, along with grammar and pronunciation, as well as building confidence in communicating through English.

General English classes are comprised of three hours per day of teaching time, five days per week. All English teachers are suitably qualified and our courses are accredited by the British Council for the teaching of English in the UK.

Language Activities In addition to General English classes, all students on the English plus Activity courses experience a wide range of activities designed to give them the opportunity to develop new skills, whilst using their spoken English in a specific context. Students move on to a new activity each day, including: journalism, creative writing/

storytelling, mindfulness workshops, vlogging, cookery, drama, and arts and crafts. Classes last for 90 minutes and focus on the development of speaking and listening skills.

Sports A fantastic mixture of sports are offered to students each day. They can practice their skills or use the opportunity to learn new ones with our sports and activity leaders, who ensure that the highest levels of safety are maintained at all times. week.

The English plus Performing Arts course is taught by subject specialist teachers and is open to all ability levels including beginners.


Future Young Leaders and Intensive English

Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, Buckingham Palace, The Tower of London, London museums.


Students will also visit other top UK destinations which may include:

General Information

Course staff

Our World English Schools offers an excellent ratio of staff to students, according to the ethos and high standard of student care that our courses follow. We employ carefully selected and suitably qualified teachers in the classroom and responsible members of activities staff to organise and run an extensive social and excursion programme.

Our centre is led by a Centre Manager who is directly responsible for the welfare of all students and staff. He/she leads a team of teaching, activities and welfare staff who teach the students in the classroom, accompany them on excursions, instruct and supervise the students' social programme and ensure high levels of safety and welfare. Most staff are also resident in the boarding houses with students. We employ a team of enthusiastic and capable staff who ensure the students' safety, wellbeing and enjoyment at all times in order for the students to gain the maximum possible benefit from the course.

Arrivals and departures

Students should arrive at and depart from London Gatwick or London Heathrow airport or London St Pancras Station.

Transfer from flights/trains can be accommodated for a supplement fee and handled by our experienced staff. (Further information is located on our website including fees and dates).

Students will be met at the airport or train station by a member of Our World staff at the appropriate exit point, carrying a board with the Our World English Schools logo and the student's name. If several students arrive at a similar time of day, some may be asked to wait until we have met another arrival before leaving the airport or station. Upon departure, Our World staff will accompany students to the airport or station and will stay

until they have gone through security into the departure area.

Students must have a valid return travel ticket, complete with a time and date. It is essential that we are kept informed of any changes to the students' travel arrangements. Parents must not assume that we have received details of changes until they are acknowledged by us in writing.

Meals

Students will have most of their meals in the school dining hall. A large selection of hot and cold options are on offer for breakfast, lunch and dinner, with vegetarian options also available. Drinks and snacks are provided during break times.

Any special dietary requirements can be catered for upon request. Packed lunches will be provided on excursions. Pocket money and valuables All course expenses are included in the course fees, however, students may want to bring a small amount of pocket money for souvenirs and other expenses e.g. UK sim cards. We believe £100 - £150 per week should be adequate. Upon the student's arrival, their passport, pocket money and other documents will be collected and a banking service will be available.

In the interests of safeguarding, student bedrooms do not have locks on the doors. Valuables may be left with the Centre Manager in the Course Office. Our World English Schools disclaims responsibility for loss or damage to students' personal possessions, money and other valuables, except when officially banked with us.

Student accommodation

Girls and boys are accommodated separately and may only mix

in the recreational areas. The student residences include single/twin/triple and quadruple bedrooms with shared facilities. Bed linen will be provided and changed once a week.

Clothes and laundry

Clothes are laundered once a week by the school. Students may be expected to sort out their own clothes when they are returned clean, so it is a good idea to have name tapes on items which are not readily identifiable, such as white T-shirts. Students must bring their own towels and toiletries.

Student safety and welfare

All staff are safeguarding trained and several are also trained in First Aid. Students will be taken to the local health centre or hospital when necessary. Please include any relevant medical details on the application and medical forms.

The students are under the supervision of the course staff when they are off-campus, except where they have written permission from their parents and course staff to have free time (within a designated area) during shopping times.

Insurance

Students are advised to arrange insurance cover for personal possessions and medical treatment.

Security Deposit

A £100.00 security deposit will be required from each student upon arrival / check-in. Deposit will be returned at the end of the course providing there has been no damage caused to any of the site facilities or accommodation.

COURSE REGULATIONS

- Students will be subject to the course rules. In particular, they will be required to attend all meals, lessons and arranged activities and excursions.
- 2. Students will be responsible for keeping their own rooms tidy.
- 3. All damages to property, equipment and rooms will be charged to the students and must be settled within
- 4. Consumption of alcohol by students is not permitted (note it is against the law in Britain for persons under the age of 18 to purchase alcohol). Alcohol must not be brought into the school premises by students of any age.
- 5. Drug-taking or suspicion of drug-taking of any kind will result in immediate dismissal.

- 6. Smoking is not permitted in school premises at any time.
- 7. Girls and boys may not enter each other's bedrooms or other designated areas under any circumstances.
- Students will be required to be in their rooms and to maintain silence at a certain time prescribed by the Centre Manager.
- Bullying will not be tolerated and may, at the discretion of the Centre Manager, result in expulsion from the course.
- 10. Students will be expected to show courtesy to all course staff and domestic staff and to behave in a civilised manner on and off the campus.

NB: Students breaking any of the rules of the course they are attending may be dismissed within 24 hours at their own expense and without refund.

FAQ

If I am interested in booking a course what should I do?

What do I do after I have paid my deposit?

- The balance of fees is due by 1st June 2024
- On receipt of full payment we will send airport transfer confirmation and the student handbook which contains useful information about your course
- All students arriving on our courses are met at the point of arrival in the UK and accompanied to the centre
- Students are strongly encouraged to take out insurance for medical and personal possessions cover; please contact us if you require assistance

When should I arrive on my course?

- Students must arrive and depart on the dates advertised on the Fees and Dates section on our website
- Return Airport transfer can be provided for a supplement fee (More information is listed on our fees and dates seciton of our website).

Terms & Condition

Enrolment

Places on each course are strictly limited and you are advised to complete and return your application form as early as possible. The enrolment is valid once receipt of the deposit has been confirmed by us in writing. Payment in full must be received by 1st June 2024. If payment is not received by this date, Our World English Schools reserves the right to cancel the student's place on the course. If the application is accepted after 1st June, full payment must be made at this time. Once the full fee has been received students are sent further course details.

Airport Transfers

Students requesting an airport transfer will only be accepted for such if they are in possession of a valid return ticket with a specified time and date of departure. It is essential that Our World English Schools is kept informed of any changes to the student's travel arrangements. Changes must be communicated to us in writing. We will always confirm receipt of these changes in writing. Excess baggage and Unaccompanied Minor charges will not be met by Our World English Schools. Please check with the relevant airline at the time of booking regarding arrangements for payment of airport departure tax, or any other charges which may be incurred.

Student Safety and Welfare

Students will be under the supervision of the course staff when they are off campus, except where small groups of children aged 13 and over are given permission by staff to go shopping. Permission can be given on the Parental Consent Form. Parents must write a letter to the Head Office before the course commences, if they do not wish for such permission to be given. Several of our staff at each centre are trained in First Aid. Students will be taken to the local health centre or hospital when appropriate. Please include any relevant medical details on the application form.

Cancellation

An enrolment may be cancelled and a full refund given if, before the start of the course, the student, a parent or brother or sister suffers sudden serious illness, accident or death. Appropriate medical certificates will be required confirming the reason for cancellation. Cancellation for any other reason, except failure to obtain a visa, will not qualify for a refund of any sort. Where a visa application fails, Our World English Schools will refund the course fees, less the deposit, upon receipt of the original documentation issued by the Entry Clearance Officer.

Student Visas

Student Visas may be required. We will be happy to provide a letter of acceptance and visa support letter to assist the student in obtaining a visa.

Visitors to the Courses

Any relative or friend who wishes to take a student out during the course must have permission of the Centre Manager or his/her deputy. The parent/guardian of the student must send a written confirmation to the Centre Manager at least 24 hours in advance before permission can be given, and such permission is at the discretion of the Centre Manager. A form of photo ID such as a passport will be required when a parent/guardian collects the student from the centre.

Promotional Materials

Our World English Schools may wish to use photographs or video images of students on the course for future promotional purposes. If parents do not wish to permit this for their children they should state this on the Parental Consent and Medical Form.

Liability

It shall be the condition of the contract between Our World English Schools and the parent/guardian that Our World English Schools shall not in any way be liable to the parent/guardian in the event that any service contracted to be supplied by Our World English Schools becomes impossible to supply due to reasons outside our control.

Personal Possessions

Students are strongly advised to hand in their passports, tickets, pocket money and valuable personal possessions to our staff and although every possible care will be taken with these items, no responsibility will be taken for the loss or theft of any item left for safe keeping.

Student Information

If incorrect information or misinformation is provided in the application to Our World English Schools, we reserve the right to ask the student(s) to leave the course. In this case, there can be no refund of the course fees.

Insurance

Students are strongly advised to arrange insurance cover for personal possessions and medical treatment. Once signed, the Booking Form represents a contract between the parent/guardian and Our World English Schools Ltd and is governed by UK law.

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












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
