Willie loves to play and discover new things. He thinks it's wonderful that the world is so colorful!






Willie recently noticed something really fantastic: He can have a lot of colors! The colors express how he's doing and what he's feeling.

He likes finger painting a lot and it's always so much fun for him!


He'll give the picture he's painting to his friend tomorrow.


He's really looking forward to that, too!

He takes the wooden arches and stacks them differently this time. He makes sure all the pieces have enough support. Great! This time it worked!


Now Willie is really excited about how nice and tall his tower is!
