2. **Diet:**

- Feed a high-fiber diet with hay as the main component.
- Include a balanced pellet mix specifically formulated for degus.
- Provide fresh vegetables daily, such as sweet potatoes (peeled, uncooked), carrots, leafy greens (spinach, dandelion leaves, parsley), and green beans every day.
