

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**Cutting Notes:** Mark and store your pieces according to the sections they have been assigned to, as this will make it much easier when you start piecing. Be sure to read the entire pattern before you begin.

A		9173Q-8 Sugar	1-1/2	(4) 3" x WOF strips. Subcut (47) 3" squares. (12) 2-1/4" x WOF strips for binding.
B		9168Q-1 Coffee	3/8	(3) 3" x WOF strips. Subcut (35) 3" squares.
C		9169Q-4 Caramel	1/3	(2) mug shapes and (2) mug shapes in reverse from template
D		9169Q-5 Latte	1/3	(2) mug shapes and (2) mug shapes in reverse from template
E		9170Q-6 Espresso	1/2	(4) 3" x WOF strips. Subcut (52) 3" squares.
F		9171Q-6 Espresso	1/2	(4) 3" x WOF strips. Subcut (56) 3" squares.
G		9173Q-8 Sugar	1-1/8	(3) 11" x WOF strips. Subcut (8) 11" squares.
H		52263-5	1/4	(8) coffee shapes from template
		Backing	2-3/8	59" x 21" piece of batting (4) 24" x 19" pieces of batting



# Espresso-ly for You

## MAKING THE BLOCKS

1. Trace (4) of the mug and (4) of the mug in reverse and (8) of the coffee shape onto the paper side of fusible web. Fuse to the indicated fabrics and cut out on the drawn lines.
2. Fingerpress each **G** 11" square in half in both directions to find the center. Fuse (1) coffee cup and (1) coffee shape onto each square. Use a zig zag or other decorative stitch to secure the appliques in place. Trim each block to measure 10-1/2" square.

## MAKING THE TABLE RUNNER

3. Randomly lay out (1) each **A**, **B**, **E** and **F** 3" squares into (1) column. Sew the squares together to make (1) pieced column. Make a total of (5) pieced columns.
4. Randomly lay out a total of (21) **A**, **B**, **E** and **F** 3" squares into a horizontal row. Sew the squares together to make a row. Make a total of (2) horizontal rows.
5. Sew the (5) pieced columns together alternating with (4) coffee mug blocks. Sew the horizontal rows to the top and bottom to complete the table runner top.

## FINISHING

6. With the backing laying taut, place batting and then runner top to form the quilt sandwich. Baste the sandwich and quilt as desired.
7. Bind using the Fabric **A** strips to finish the runner.





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## MAKING THE PLACEMATS

8. Randomly lay out (1) each **A**, **B**, **E** and **F** 3" squares into (1) column. Sew the squares together to make (1) pieced column.
9. Randomly lay out a total of (12) **A**, **B**, **E** and **F** 3" squares into (4) rows of (3) squares each. Sew the squares into rows and join the rows to make a pieced section.
10. Randomly lay out a total of (8) **A**, **B**, **E** and **F** 3" squares into a horizontal row. Sew the squares together to make a row. Make (2).
11. Sew the pieced column and the pieced section to opposite sides of (1) coffee mug block. Sew a horizontal row to the top and bottom to complete (1) placemat.
12. Repeat steps 8-11 to make a total of (4) placemats.

## FINISHING

13. With the backing laying taut, place batting and then placemat top to form the quilt sandwich. Baste the sandwich and quilt as desired.
14. Bind using the Fabric **A** strips to finish the placemat. Repeat for remaining (3) placemats.




**Placemat Assembly Diagram**
