

Circular Ornament Finish

1. Cut away weavers cloth, leaving $\frac{1}{2}$ " border along the edge. If edges curl, steam-iron flat. From outer edge of each corner almost to base of loops, make snips into cloth edge at $\frac{1}{4}$ " intervals. Do not cut punched thread.



2. Iron overlapping pieces flat, towards design back. Iron long edges. Adhere snipped edges to back of design with thin fabric glue layer, then glue down each long side. Set aside to dry.



3. Cut out oval paper ornament. Place oval on plain side of sticky board, trace & cut out. Place oval board against back of punched oval. Use pencil to mark areas needing extra trimming & cut off. Peel paper off sticky board & place sticky side against back side of coordinating fabric. Repeat Steps 1 & 2 with this coordinating fabric oval and you will now have both sides to your ornament.



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4. Cut a piece of ribbon about ten inches long. Add glue to each end and glue ends to white back side of fabric oval, creating loop. On back of this piece, also glue flat edge of pom-pom trim (or twine) around inside edge of design so trim shows around edge.



5. Spread glue over back of punched piece, flip, press into place on back side of fabric oval. Hang and enjoy!
