## from the show:

"Wosene is the first contemporary Ethiopian-born artist to use the script forms of his native Amharic as a core element in his paintings and sculptures. The very nature of Wosene's work— his visual vocabulary, his "mapping" of cultures across time and place, his sensual use of forms—testifies to the visual power and versatility of language."

#### from the show:

"Bailin draws until he exhausts the possibilities in each rendering. His is a 'back-and-forth' process involving drawing in and erasing out, having an idea of image exposing itself one minute only to fall back into obscurity the next. His large drawings are part of a series titled *Erasing Series*, which reveal what he experienced with his father, who struggled with memory loss as he aged."

### from the show:

"Brad Ellis experiments with imagery from tightly rendered, systematic patterns to loosely constructed, expressionistic compositions. He embraces the ancient medium of encaustic, which is hot wax painting. The pure physicality of the paint combined with various collage elements render distinct textures and surface treatments that energize his abstract imagery with movement and excitement."



# **BAAA ARTIST OF THE MONTH: GRAHAM WICKHAM**

I was born into a world of artists, art lovers and movie and stage actors in Los Angeles; the influence of the creative and performing arts was strong. And living in LA I was fully immersed in the rest of the wealth of great art in the area—the LA County Art Museum, the Norton Simon Museum and much more. For me it was a rare and rewarding environment to grow up in.

What art training I received as a young man was from my brother who had been accepted at the Art Center School. He taught me the basics of drawing (charcoal, pencil, etc.). My creative endeavors, however, took me into writing (English major) and performing music. Only in the last twelve years have I gotten back into visual art and feel good about my brother's teaching, as I was able to almost pick up where I had left off with my drawing lessons 40 years ago—almost as if it were yesterday. Basically self-taught, for the past twelve years I combined lessons and exercises from a number of sources with an intense study of and absorption in both impressionist and modernist American art. I enjoy working in acrylic, oil pastel and, of course, drawing media.

# BAAA President Carol Howald wins another blue ribbon in Bandon!

"Crazy for Color", the community show sponsored by Art By the Sea Gallery in Bandon, opened on Saturday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, and **Sharon Leahy**, who was juror of the show, selected **Carol Howald**'s painting for the first-place award. Although Leahy was not able to attend, because of concerns about COVID, she left an extraordinary set of notes thoughtfully evaluating every single piece in the show, which you all may read if you take the time to stop by the gallery during the month of November.

Those of you who remember the old verse "*I never saw a Purple Cow;*/*I never hope to see one;* / *But I can tell you anyhow* / *I'd rather see than be one*" will be amused by Howald's beautifully executed painting of a (fairly purple) bovine!





## 18A - CAROL HOWALD

This is a masterful use of controlled color, truly a remarkable work of art. Look at the glowing luminescence under the chin, and the color on the throat of the cow and especially that amazing milky pastel green around the cheek and the eye, the artist has mixed color to beautifully render the luminescence of reflected sunlight, masterfully done and not easy to achieve. This artist has done a technically exquisite job of mixing colors to reflect the sunlight shining directly on the cow, but also reflecting off the ground and up onto the cow, beautiful light coloring on the face and chest, and on the hump of the back, and in the ear where it is translucent in the sun. This is truly an excellent piece. I highly commend this artist for exemplary artistry, mindful colorplay, and masterful technical skills.



18C - CAROL HOWALD

this is a technically masterful use of a restrained and sophisticated color palette beautifully rendered with full exploration of values. this artist has exemplary control of the palette, this is colorplay on a truly masterful level. This piece shows great experience and control by this artist, those touches of blue high up in leaf canopy for shading, very clever, very controlled, the blue on the major trunk there that we see in the center, throughout the painting there is technically accurate, sophisticated, vibrant use of color. I highly commend this artist for masterful use of color, that's a beautiful piece of art.



19A - GERRY BENEKE

I'm particularly delighted with the river water and the reflections in the water in this piece. There is a well toned twilight color palette. The water is calm, and in the shadowed areas the artist has captured the natural, translucent murky color that is so common along the banks of quiet streams. The reflected sunlight throws a golden glow in the water, which is so very pleasing.
