In this very unusual holiday season, as we grapple with yet another variant of the Coronavirus, and prepare to celebrate thirty years since the founding of the **Bay Area Artists** Association in 1991, I want to share with all of vou the results of a very wonderful art contest created by Terraformation, Inc. CEO Yishan Wong, featuring *young* artists working in an optimistic science-fiction genre called "solarpunk". My 33-year-old granddaughter posted this on


her Facebook Page, thrilled that a long-time friend of hers, a composer and performer named **Stephan Nance**, who records under the name Sparkbird, had won second prize for their song, which was also selected to accompany an animation of the ten top winners of the contest! Stephan has travelled round the world performing, but this is the first time they have won a major award for their work. I sent the article to **Katherine Chang Liu**, who was supposed to have flown to Coos Bay on Friday, December 3rd, to join us for the closing of the show she brought to the Coos Art Museum, "TOWARDS A 21ST CENTURY ABSTRACTION", but sadly had to cancel because of the new version of the virus. She sent me this message:

"I was blown away by the first prize winner, plus the animation with a singing performance! And I find myself agreeing with the statement written by YiShan...: 'We have been conditioned through relentless negative media and predictions of apocalypse to believe that mankind has no hope. While it is true that we face unprecedented challenges and have made many collective mistakes, I believe that humanity has the spirit and ability to overcome them. We can create a better future. We need a new and optimistic vision of our world.'"

Tuesday Plein Air Painters will be the featured artists in the Southern Coos Hospital & Health Center's "Sunup to Sunset, Chasing the Light" show January through March.

Tuesday Plain Air Painters have been in the Bay Area for the last 35 years. Nancy Berry was the organizer back in 1996. Charles Edmunds and Joan Goodman Fox have been with the group since the 1990s with Joan taking over from Nancy and now Archi Davenport is the coordinator after Joan retired. There are 18 artists on our email list that came out to paint with us this year but seven to eight came to paint on a regular basis during the summer months.

The group has artists from Bandon to Florence paint outdoors, with one painter who comes in July and August from Belize, Central America. Artwork is still being accepted for the non-juried show, to which anyone is welcome to submit up to three works. Bring works to the Bandon hospital on *Wednesday*, *January 5*, *between 2:00 and 4:00 p.m.*

NOTES FROM BANDON AND CHARLESTON (continued)

People are talking about the transformation taking place in Charleston of what used to be the Old Charleston School, 33,000 square feet of buildings and several acres of land, into a *trade school* for adults who want to continue their life-long learning, beginning with studying woodworking and metalworking.

Using equipment which the mastermind of the project, **Richard Stillwagon**, has been collecting (some purchased, some on loan) from woodworkers and metalworkers all around Coos County, the project, called OCATEC, will offer training equally to men and women of all ages.

Stillwagon, an irrepressible force, who is known to locals as the creator of Stillwagon Distillery (housed in Bandon, and currently headquartered on Seven Devils Road in Charleston), and to Martial Arts enthusiasts who have been studying upstairs in the old school in Charleston, is a visionary to be reckoned with.


