- NO DUES = **0**



ARTIST OF THE MONTH



CHARLES OF CHARLESTON



Charles was born in Seattle in 1930. At age 9 he was drawing cartoons. He was given an Ebony magic pencil so thick it could easily follow an outline.

Charles began playing the oboe at eleven and went to Philadelphia to the Curtis Institute of Music for four years. At age 17 he entered the Museum School of Art in Philadelphia.

In 1950 he enlisted and moved up to Corpsman third class in the US Navy (equivalent to a corporal in hospital service.) He toured the European seaports in the Mediterranean for a year and was able to visit 15 major museums.

Returning to Philadelphia in 1954, he attended the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts. Four years later in his "Chuck's Wagon" (see photo) he headed west. He sold sketches in Yellowstone, the Tetons, Bryce Canyon, and Yosemite. Arriving in San Francisco he painted many street scenes and sold portrait sketches of tourists for 25 cents.

At age 42, Charles left the Renaissance Commune where he had learned the meaning of life and how to raise chickens. He wanted to earn a pension so he moved on to Watsonville, California and became an elementary school custodian for 17 years.

Then, with his pension intact, he headed north on I-5 and spotted Highway 42 and for him, and all the hitchhikers, as Charles says, "The meaning of life is traveling route 42 to the fantabulous city of Coos Bay."


(The photo was taken in June, 1965 near St. Mary 's Lake in Arizona. The painting he is holding was recently bought by Black Market Gourmet.)

OUR JANUARY MEETING

27 members and visitors attended our annual business/election meeting. It was called to order at 6:05 by our outgoing president Nadine Archer Allen (and her large gavel.)



Our treasurer, Charles Edmunds, shared the end of year 2019 financial report. (You will find a copy on page 7 of this newsletter.) Next, the slate of candidates was read off - Phil Noguere for

president, Carol Howald, vice president, Nadine Archer Allen, secretary, and Charles Edmunds, treasurer. Ballots were passed around, and the members in attendance unanimously accepted the new slate.

Nadine called for any new business from the floor. Joan Goodman-Fox said that it was time we moved the Artist of the Month display to the lobby from its location in the upstairs corridor. She said that Kevin, in charge of the CAM lobby as well as volunteers, was in favor of it. The motion was seconded and the members voted in favor of it. It only needs approval from CAM director Steven Broocks. If the move is approved we will let you know in the March newsletter.



The evening's presenter was top photographer and BAAA member Jean Carter. She began by telling us how she got into photography,

at first as a hobby. (She was a graduate of U of O, and taught school at Sunset in Coos Bay.) In 1970 her adult son had paid for a workshop in photography for both himself and Jean. Jean was a single mom, and so the two of them were very close. In February, not too long before the workshop, she received a night time visit from a county sheriff. He was very sorry, but there had been an automobile accent. Her son had died in the crash.

Later, when she went to clean out his apartment, she found the photography workshop material. She realized he would have wanted her to go,



and so she did. Photography became a hobby and then a profession. Her drive to get the right photos have taken her all over the west. For that she has frequently hiked, slept in her car, and camped. One of her most difficult photo journeys found her, at sunset, high up in Yosemite where she had to spend the night in very cold weather with only her clothes to keep her warm. She survived and got the pictures she wanted.

She has taught workshops, had her photos in numerous magazines, calendars, etc., and, until recently, was a member of the Artist Loft Gallery

FEBRUARY MEETING PRESENTATION "ARCTIC ADVENTURE"

Our February presenter is BAAA member Shinan Barclay - published writer, artist, and teacher. She will bring stories of her experiences among the Inupiat Eskimos who live in the tiny village of Kotzebue, Alaska, 30 miles above the Arctic Circle. She will be showing her own photos as well as examples of original native art collected while she was teaching there.

(<u>Please NOTE</u> - There will be a "hands on" paper cutting project as a part of the program for members to create their own versions of nature's reflections. Supplies will be furnished by Shinan. However, she has asked participants to bring their own scissors, and glue for the project. She advises, "Prepare to make a mess and have fun.")



A devout Catholic, at the age of 19 Shinan answered a call from a priest in the Arctic who had placed an ad in the local newspaper seek-

ing volunteers for assistance. "I knew it was my calling! It hit me like a bolt of lightning and I knew I had to go there," she said. Since Shinan had to leave her

parent's California home, plus travel thousands of miles, you won't want to miss this tell-it-all story of a young artist's adventure in life-changing experiences; to be of service, learning new skills in a strange culture, and ultimately finding a fulfilling life-direction.

WHAT'S A "FRAA" ??

FRAA, the Florence Regional Arts Alliance, is the Florence sister synthesis of our own BAAA and The Artist Loft. Because Florence isn't that far away and FRAA has a similar mission in a truly artsy town, we thought you might like to know a little about them. In their own words their mission is to "unify and support all of the arts, enrich cultural life, and stimulate the economic vitality in the Florence area through the arts." They maintain a very full website with a busy activities calendar, arts education classes for adults and youth (FRAA members get discounts,) an Art Center, their own special events, and more.

FRAA maintains their own art gallery location in Historic Old Town where members can promote their art. The gallery is also available for one-person shows. The Art Center includes a continuous loop slide show on their monitor at the Art Center where members can show examples of their work to visitors. In addition, FRAA helps members to get their artist information up on the Coastarts.org website.

FRAA sponsors events like the Rhody Days Arts Festival, and their own Holiday Arts Festival. Members get discounts on these events. They also sponsor art shows in which members can take part, and there are opportunities to display art at Florence venues like Oregon Pacific Bank, Peace Health, Florence Events Center, and the Siuslaw Library.

If you are interested in their classes we will now include them in our class listings whenever we receive them.
