BAAA is off to a good start with an active, if not complete, board of directors. Our new website is up and running, thanks to the hard work of Nicole Graham. Please be sure to check it out. For those of you who missed it, Donna Stevens gave a very interesting program at our February meeting, demonstrating how she develops charcoal sketches as preparation for her pastel work. This is especially helpful when looking at a landscape, or a resource image of landscape, that has a lot in it. Through a series of sketches, each relying of the previous one, we experimented with paring down the complex image to the most essential and interesting aspect of what one sees. Good News! BAAA was awarded a grant of \$1,000 by the Coos County Cultural Coalition. A big round of applause is due to Liz Spona for writing the grant application. The funds are specifically for paying stipends to presenters of our programs, and we were pleased that Donna Stevens, who gave a demonstration the February 19th meeting, was the first recipient.

CCCC hosted an awards ceremony for grant recipients on February 7th at the Wildflour Café in North Bend. Unfortunately, Liz was not able to attend, but Victoria Tierney accepted the award on behalf of BAAA. Victoria reaffirmed how important art and art education is to the community, especially for young artists. She mentioned the current Visions show, at Coos Art Museum, encouraging people to see what our local high school students have accomplished.



At the last meeting, most of those attending had a chance to walk through the Visions show that fills the two upstairs galleries. The BAAA Board decided that the general membership should be the jurors to award our first "Up-and-Comer" award for the student show. Ballots were passed out and each person was to pick their top three choices, excluding first prizes that had already been awarded.

The Board will tally the votes at their next meeting, and we will present a ribbon and prize to the student with the most votes at the March 19th general meeting. Beside a ribbon, the student will be given a \$50 gift certificate to Art Connection and a year membership to BAAA.

If you were not at the last meeting, there is still time to visit the Visions show and cast your vote. Vote for three pieces with #1 as first choice. Be sure to clearly write the artist's name and the title of the artwork. You can email it to wendy8burger@gmail.com.

Finally, we need a President to have a complete Board of Directors as required in our bylaws. Sorry to nag on this issue, but someone must step forward to fill the post. My attraction to enjoying art came at an early age. I can recall when I was 5 or 6 years old of the fascination of being able to pick up a pencil or crayon and make marks on paper. It was the fun of seeing the scribbling become a recognizable object or be an expression of feelings.

At home there were always drawing materials within our reach. Many times in the evening, our father who was a professional sign painter would sit us at the large kitchen table and show us drawing techniques. The sharing and doing art activities with my sisters and brothers solidified our understanding and importance of making art.

Throughout my early years I actively involved myself with art. I eagerly looked forward to elementary school art activities and middle school art classes.

Outside of school I recall checking out Walt Disney and other books of drawings and would copy to find how they made their drawings.

After high school, I completed three years of military. Then, I started with a strong one year art foundation at Ringling School of Art in Sarasota, Florida. It was hard work, but enjoyable, for I was strengthening my skills. There were art classes all day and all week; classes in design, lettering, drawing, figure drawing, and painting.

After one year at Ringling, I decided to get a degree in teaching art from Northern Illinois University. I completed a Bachelor's degree in Education w/Art emphasis and a Master of Arts degree with Printmaking emphasis.

I started teaching at Marshfield High School in Coos Bay in 1968. I made sure students were introduced to as many art mediums, tools and thoughts as possible, going beyond drawing and painting only.

I retired from teaching in 1998 and ventured into full time art making. I continued my desire to experiment with different mediums and themes. Abstract, semi-abstract, and realism wove in and out of my projects.

I work to achieve the feeling of exploration and experimentation with the mediums I have at hand; interpreting the natural and artificial.

"Thinking with Charcoal" with Donna Stevens



Donna Stevens, who traveled from Portland, led a very interesting program, "Thinking with Charcoal", at our February meeting. She demonstrated a technique that she uses to begin a painting, using a series of charcoal sketches, some from life, some from photo reference, that help to focus on what is important to her in a scene. It is a way to simplify shapes and values and to concentrate on what one finds most compelling to emphasize when beginning a landscape painting.

I know from experience how overwhelming it can be to confront Ma Nature in all her glory, hoping to render a suitable image and then get bogged down in too many details, not enough focus areas and a blah composition.

I enjoyed Donna's presentation very much and came away with some good ideas and some surprisingly abstract sketches. Plus, using charcoal, something I haven't done for a while, reminded me of what an immediate, malleable medium it is, and how much fun to smear around.

I plan to do a color rendition from my sketch. Anyone who follows up with this technique and has a more finished piece, please bring that and your working sketch to the March 19th meeting. We can have a brief "Show and Tell".

Emily Ashworth died on Feb. 13 at 90 years old from complications of Alzheimer's. Up until ten years or so ago she had been an active member of the art community. She was instrumental in developing the "Art Walk" In the North Bend and Coos Bay area.

She went on to create a formidable body of work, much of which she donated to local businesses around Coos County.
