# Meet BAAA Up & Comer Award Winner, Brooklin Butts





Brooklin Butts is currently a Sophomore at Bandon High School. She has been selected as the recipient of the BAAA Up & Comer award for 2024. This award was created to select one of our talented students and encourage them along their artistic journey. Along with a ribbon, Brooklin will receive a year membership to BAAA, a year membership to the Coos Art Museum and a \$100 gift certificate to the Art Connection.

Even though Brooklin is young I have been impressed with the reputation she has already crafted for herself within our community and I am honored to share that story with you.

I first heard of Brooklin when I was interviewing Muralist, Vicki Affatati for an article I was writing about a new mural on the Bandon Fisheries Warehouse. Vicki said she needed a conceptual drawing of the mural to present to the City of Bandon Planning Commission, and that was provided by one of her art students at the time, Brooklin Butts. I was impressed that someone so young was getting involved at the city level and gaining such great experience in creating community art installations.

Brooklin's desire to give back to the community came through the second time I came across her name. While I was walking along Old Town Bandon I came upon an amazing octopus poster in the window of Bandon's Sweets & Treats. They would be selling these "Maui Strong" posters and t-shirts, created by their 15yr old daughter Brooklin, at a local art market to support the people and animals that were displaced by the Maui fires.



Brooklin would be sharing a booth with the Team Todd group that was raising funds for those battling cancer. I immediately snapped a picture and made a post on my social profile, trying to help spread the word about this amazing girl's efforts to help the victims of fire in Maui. It was after that post that I received a message from her mom, and heard the rest of her story.

"Brooklin was a huge Todd supporter as he was battling cancer." Her mom said, "Brooklin, herself, is a cancer survivor. She had leukemia at 3 years old and did 3.5 years of chemotherapy. Our community was amazing and supported our family through so much. So Brooklin does her best to find ways to give back to those in need. We are so proud of her and what she accomplishes!"

Her experience in the hospital is actually where Brooklin says she found a love of art and realized it could help others. "When I was young and in the hospital, I had lots of free time and art was fun. I had the chance to make lots of different things to share with other kids who weren't feeling well." Knowing she's using her art to help others, she says, "it makes me feel really good. It comes kinda easy, so why wouldn't I use it to help others. Seems like the right thing to do!"

Brooklin's Art teacher, Vicki Affatati, made the following comment "Every once in a while, I meet a young artist who is driven to create and has the combination of natural talent advanced by their focused art practice. It's one thing to dream of being an artist and another thing to work at it. Brooklin Butts demonstrates the qualities of an unstoppable artist."

As we all know every artistic journey is varied and filled with many twists and turns, but at this point, Brooklin plans to pursue her artistic dreams through travel. "I'd like to travel the world and see all the different types of art that's out there. Maybe I could leave a little bit of myself everywhere I go."

Congratulations Brooklin, we wish you every success in the future!

#### **Juror's Remarks**

Brooklin's linocut of Medusa shows all the signs of a student with a creative vision and a professional attitude, which got my attention as well as the other jurors. The piece is graphically compelling, appearing to show a modern interpretation of the myth of Medusa, with a young female figure who feels contemporary, perhaps a high school student!

The drawing is excellent as is her use of an analogous color scheme, with green being dominant, yet somehow made inviting with warm tones of gold added into the printed layers. Her use of positive/negative space is harmonious, while the space above the figure clearly relates to the subject and pulls our attention back to her portrait. She used a range of values, and shows a good understanding of how pattern can enhance a subject.

I found myself drawn back to study the work, and was also impressed by the framing/matting presentation, something which clearly enhanced the print and added to its impact on the viewer. I look forward to how this young student develops as an artist!

#### "Tap into Ancient Rome" with Sandy Kretzschmar

This program is not only artistic, but also educational. Draw, sketch and/or paint from a live historic model. Sandy Kretzschmar, researcher, historian and author will represent "Julia", the daughter of Emperor Augustus Caesar. While painting and sketching, we may learn notable facts of this father-daughter relationship.

### Review of "Growing Through It" with Bittin Duggan

February 18th, 2024

members attending the program given by Bittin Duggan, "Growing Through It" –

an innovative process-art method of colors, words, gestures and forms. Music played during this class.

BAAA Members were asked to bring supplies such as;

- 1. A previously painted canvas (from thrift store, or a "throw away" piece, or a "dud" watercolor painting.
- 2. Acrylic paints, brushes, water containers and oil pastels &/or watercolor paints, brushes, water containers and colored pencils.
- 3. Words to a meaningful song, poem, story or letter.

It was a very interesting process and at the end of the meeting several people shared what they had created.



Bittin Foster Duggan has a Bachelor's of Fine Arts (BFA) degree from the University of Colorado Boulder and has traveled the country facilitating art workshops and exhibiting her landscape and process artwork. Known for meeting the individualized audience needs, she applies her Master's Degree in Whole Systems Design to implement "Growing Through It."


BAAA thanks Coos Art Museum for its continued support, and for providing us with a monthly meeting space.
