The first order of business was the treasurer's report. David Johnson distributed printed information on bank account balances, included with these minutes. Also listed are the various expenses that BAAA must meet each year and projected costs based on last year estimates. The expenses that have been paid for this year and will likely be the same for 2024, include rent, PO Box, taxes and insurance. Other payouts, such as for program presenters, Visions show award, refreshments, PVM show were not listed.

- 5. The Board suggests a committee to explore how BAAA can utilize festivals and empty store windows to show members' artwork.


The business portion of the meeting ended at approximately 4:25pm followed by a refreshment break.
